A record-breaking year for Phil Wells...

The 1st grade run-machine returned to by the 'Waddy' has had an amazing year which is difficult to imagine ever being bettered. In all formats Phil amassed a mind-boggling 1527 runs including five centuries at an average of 101.8 and in T20 is deducted, he finished the season with 1233 runs at 102.75.

1st grade club records are bettered very infrequently but this season Phil records for

Aggregate - bettering 1188 by K. J. S. Zaru in 1983/84

Average - bettering by 77.60 by 21 as the club's first Test blover Grahame Tait back in 1960/61

2nd Wicket Partnership - with Daniel Solway spanned 306 against St George & filtered the previous record of 226 set by Mick Waugh and Ridd Bower

Performances like this do not come from talent alone and especially while plenty of this commodity it is his commitment to training and improvement that ever him achieve such fabulous results. After commencing work at 5am he is one of the first at training, sometimes grabbing a quick nap after waiting to arrive and then he often last to leave sometimes taking another knock in the centre when it is too dark outside.

In a very good fielding side Phil stands out as one of the best. Great catches that he has seen him take some terrific catches and with a view accurate and his contribution to the team in this aspect is also first class.

Through the many awards and accolades he has received this season - K. J. S. Zaru Memorial Player of the Year, Phil was named the winner of the Michael Bayliss Award as the 'Player of the Year' Limited Overs Final where he contributed 102. Wells played well repeatedly and drove especially to entertain the crowd with a sparkling boundary as well as a fabulous catch and a very important run out.

Against Ennis he also scored over a hundred with a massive five run out - the prolific run-getter plundered 18 boundaries with some scything straight drives and powerful square cuts. Wells hit the Dolphins in a superb match-winning knock. Even when on a losing side, Wells' batting still powered by class, with a superb 7 against Randwick-Petersham when chasing a huge 413 to win.

When not scoring centuries - and in his last end of the season he was doing so more often than not - he was frequently not out in his innings - testament to his patience and determination. None was more representative of *one than when Wells* was 50 away smashed by more than 100 was the long-standing 2nd wicket record of 34 years ago - set by Mick Waugh and Ridd Bower. In the year's quarter final, when pressure is usually felt most, Wells scored 190 run out to liberally but St George's led the game by helping themselves reach 329 in his 3 and a half hour stay at the crease - scoring his third century in one and his 10th for the season.

In other the Twenty 20, One Day or Two Day format, Phil Wells excelled with the willow this year. In many of our team mates and former New Zealand Test cricketer Daryl Tuffey tweeted on 04th March that Phil Wells was on par with AB De Villiers and Brendon McCullum as the easiest batsmen to bowl to at the moment. No claim or more deserving praise.

Well done Wells, certainly a season to remember.

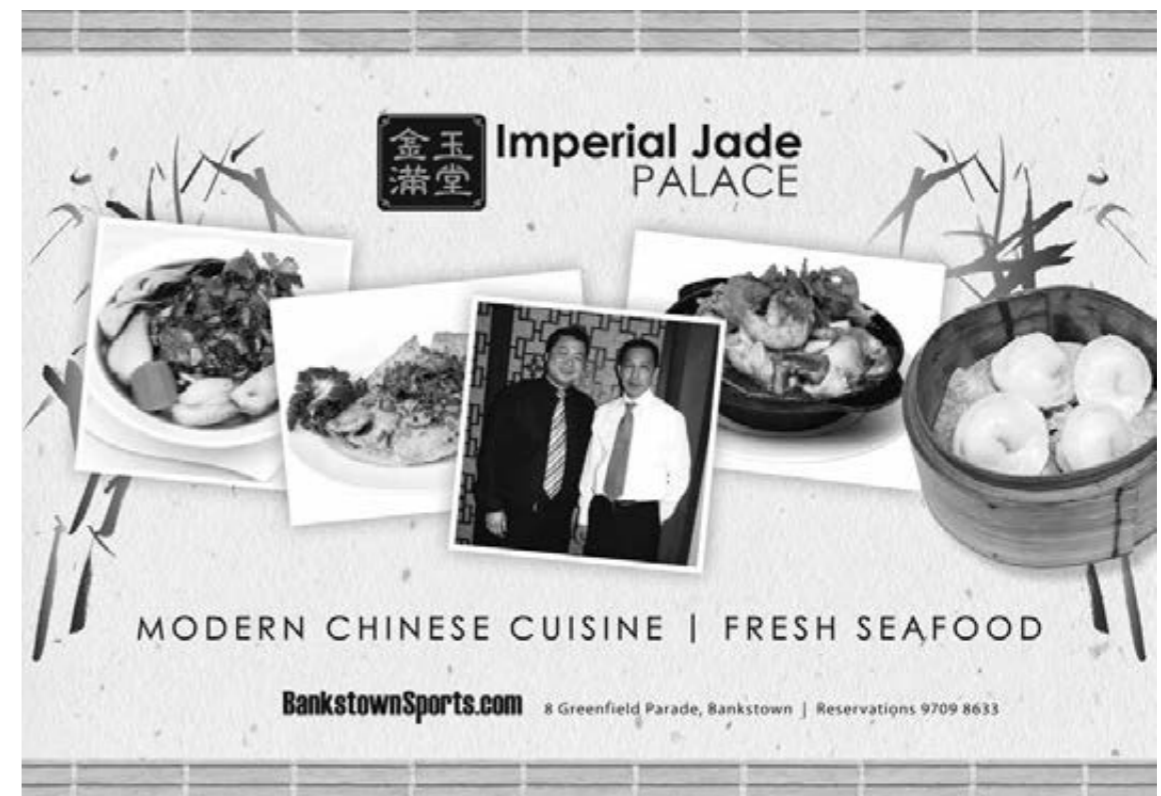

sixty-fourth annual report



I have pleasure in presenting the Club's Sixty-Fourth Annual Report and Financial Statement.

The Club's 2014/15 season playing results were very impressive with First Grade winning the SCA Limited Overs competition and our U/16 representative side winning the AW Green Shield and the State Club Challenge. The AWG results are a mirror of the team's performance in 2013/14 season – a wonderful achievement. Our Second Grade side played in the semi-final and we ran sixth in the Club Championship, improving from 11th position the previous season. Pleasingly, the Bankstown District Cricket Association (BDCA) Under 16 Watson Shield side, coached by Rob Shaw, won that premiership in fine style. Add to those results the amazing feat of the Bankstown Sports Women's Cricket Club in winning the Sydney Women's Cricket Association First, Second and Third Grade premierships and it's fair to say we have much to be pleased about regarding our on-field performances.

The fact that we have continued to improve our on-field results is, in my view, very much due to the efforts of our Head Coach, Gary Crowfoot. Gary's enthusiasm, commitment and fierce determination to succeed clearly rubs off on his support coaches and our playing group. Gary manages a talented coaching team including Dean Burke, Ray Hall, Aaron Bird and James Allsopp and this group works closely with our Team Captains and Chairman of Selectors Phil Kelly to ensure we have the right strategies and processes to achieve Club, Team and Individual goals. Ken (Emu) Hall's presence at the Club ensures everyone remains grounded (not big on inflated egos our Emu) and his wise counsel and easy-going manner is appreciated by everyone from the first grade skipper to the volunteers in the canteen. A champion bloke.

To be a successful SCA Club you need good Captains and we had a terrific group in 2014/15. Jarrad Burke won the SCA 1st Grade Captain of the Year, showing excellent communication skills with match officials and outstanding tactical acumen. Andrew Jamieson led from the front in 2nd Grade – his personal performances with bat and ball a great example for his young players. Being named SCA 2nd Grade Captain of the Year was a just reward for Jamo's efforts. Mat Kelly was very upset that his work commitments with NSW Police eroded his practice time but he more than made up for this with excellent match day leadership and personal performances. Grade Cricket needs people like Mat involved and Clubs must come up with support mechanisms

that allow them to continue their involvement as the demands of work and family impinge on the amount of time they can commit to sport. It was in this vein that Andrew O'Brien answered our call to take on a lower grade Captaincy role and I can report that, whilst we always thought he's do a great job, 'Obe' exceeded everyone's expectations with a mature, well rounded contribution in 4th Grade. Luke Maloney had the toughest job at the Club – captaining a very young 5th Grade side with a player line-up that changed every match (or sometimes, due to representative needs in higher grades, within the same match)! Luke left no stone unturned in his attempts to develop each young player's technical skills and game sense. His overall commitment to the club's efforts was, as always, of the highest order.

The Cricket Operations Sub-Committee led by Mark Grant continued the challenging work of managing all player and match related functions at the Club. Mark worked effectively with Chairman of Selectors Phil Kelly and this pair can rightly point to the trophy cabinet as proof of their effectiveness.

Rob Smith, Gary Penman and Justin Newman led the Bankstown Sports Women's Cricket Club to a record-breaking season capturing three premierships. All players deserve the highest plaudits but I'd like to call out Sara Aley for the sheer quality of her leadership and Laura Wright for showing great tenacity and strength of character to prove the representative selectors wrong by producing outstanding personal performances when it counted.

Local District and Grade Clubs are the hub of cricket in Australia and dedicated volunteers are our life-blood. Cricket in 2015 is big business and despite advances in information technology and communications, the work required to run a Cricket Club Cricket has increased significantly over the years. Competition from other codes, the introduction of new playing formats and the increasing professionalism at senior levels, have all led to more work being pushed down the line. By its very nature, cricket requires a huge time commitment from all involved, which is at direct odds with our modern, time-stretched society. I believe Cricket Australia needs to invest substantial extra resources into the development of cricket volunteerism to ensure we can protect the health of the game 'from the bottom up' into the future.

At Bankstown we are blessed with a dedicated band of volunteers who commit their valuable time to ensure our players can get on with playing cricket without thinking about off-field requirements. Every volunteer's contribution is important and will be recognised in the separate parts of this Report, but on behalf of all players and supporters can I just say a big 'Thank You' to everyone who sold a pie or soft drink in the canteen, lifted a cover, made the drinks, ran the drinks, scored the match, put up or took down the sightscreens or training nets etc etc etc. Without you, the game doesn't start.

Scott continued his unselfish commitment to the Club, despite immense time pressures after taking a new role as a Senior Executive at Hyundai Australia. 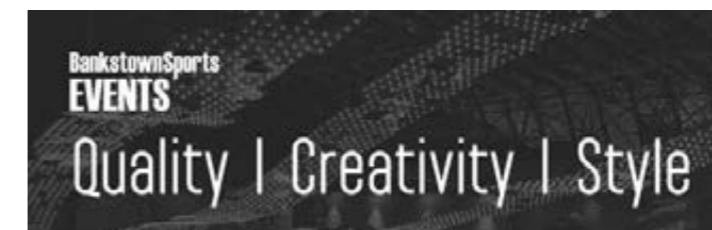

philip wells – a season to remember

The 1st grade run-machine referred to by all as 'Wellsy' has had an amazing season, one which is difficult to imagine ever being bettered.

In all formats Phil amassed a mind-boggling 1527 runs including five centuries at an average of 101.8 and when T20 is deducted, he finished the season with 1233 runs at 102.75.

First grade club records are bettered very infrequently, but this season Philip set new records for

bettering 1168 by Kevin Roberts in 1993/94

bettering the 87.60 held by the club's first Test player Grahame Thomas way back in 1960/61

with Daniel Solway smashed 336 against StGeorge and bettered the previous record of 228 set by Mark Waugh and Rod Bower in 1983/84

Performances like this do not come from talent alone and obviously while Wellsy has plenty of this commodity it is his commitment to training and improvement that has seen him achieve such fabulous results. After commencing work at 5am he is always one of the first at training, sometimes grabbing a quick nap while waiting for others to arrive and then is often last to leave sometimes having another knock in the indoor centre when it is too dark outside.

In a very good fielding side Phil stands out as one of the best. Great hands in the circle has seen him take some terrific snares and with a very accurate arm his contribution to the team in this aspect is also first class.

Amongst the many awards and accolades he has received this season - including Bankstown Player of the Year, Phil was named the winner of the Michael Bevan Medal as the Player of the Limited Overs Final where he contributed 109 - Wells pierced the field repeatedly and drove superbly to entertain the crowd with 9 sparkling boundaries - as well as a fabulous catch and a very important run out.

Against Easts he also scored over a hundred with a majestic 106 not out - the prolific run-getter plundered 13 boundaries with some sizzling straight drives and powerful square cuts. Wells sunk the Dolphins in a superb match-winning knock. Even when on a losing side, Wells' batting still showed its class, with a superb 77 against Randwick-Petersham when the team was chasing a huge 414 to win.

When not scoring centuries - and in the tail end of the season he was doing so more often than not - he was frequently not out in his innings - testament to his patience, skill and determination. None was more representative of this than when Wells and Solway smashed by more than 100 runs the long-standing 2nd wicket record of over 30 years ago... set by Mark Waugh and Rod Bower. In this year's quarter final, when pressure is usually felt most, Wells scored 190 not out to literally bat St George out of the game by helping Bankstown reach 339 in his 7-and-a-half hour stay at the crease - scoring his third century in a row and his 5th for the season.

In either the Twenty 20, One-Day or Two-Day format, Phil Wells excelled with the willow this year. So much so that team mate and former New Zealand Test bowler Daryl Tuffey tweeted on 24th March that Phil Wells was on par with AB De Villiers and Brendon McCullum as the scariest batter to bowl to at the moment. No better or more deserving praise.

Well done Wellsy, certainly a season to remember.

Because of two amazing donations of clothing and equipment we have been able this year to ship a 40 foot container *in addition* to the regular 20 foot version.

A second time donor, Triforce Sports donated 46 pallets or 4 large truck loads of quality new gear valued conservatively at between \$A300,000 and \$A400,000 while Classic Sportswear – CNSW’s official clothing supplier – donated various clothing items surplus to their requirements valued at over \$100,000.

The influence this shipment will have on the development of cricket in Uganda will be immense and we are truly grateful to these two companies for their generosity.

As well as these two donations we have continued to receive goods from clubs, associations, schools and

individuals, some for the third and fourth time. They should all be delighted to know what a difference they are making to the development of cricket in Uganda as well as the lives of their people - for example, running shoes donated through the Southern Highlands Challenge have been provided as prizes (see picture). From a base of less than 15,000 when we started, the number of registered cricket players in Uganda has grown to almost 60,000 – just because they have equipment with which to play.

We remain indebted to the Bankstown Sports Club who generously continue to fund the cost of freighting the containers to Uganda. The cost of each 20 foot container has now risen to almost \$10,000 and clearly this scheme could not happen without the Bankstown Sports Club’s support.

Recreation Sports and Aquatic Club (RSAC) cricket program

In November 2014, Matt Clifton and myself (David Clifton) were invited to join club veteran Max McLeay as coaches to ensure that the cricket program for Recreation Sports and Aquatic Club's cricketers with a disability could continue after years of struggling to get committed coaching staff and a regular venue in which to train.

With the John Mackay Indoor Centre being an ideal training centre, Max, Matt and David developed a new program to help a bunch of keen and dedicated cricketers: Mark, Simon, Cameron, Matthew, Brian and Tim. This wonderful group of dedicated trainers formed the core of the cricket group, and during 2015 have since been joined at training at times by Kamal, Nguyen (Wommie) who has become a regular now, Hannah (also now a regular), Andrew, Mouen and Asiq. All these cricket lovers have a range of physical and mental disabilities, which also vary in severity from mild to profound - which sometimes makes training and drills a challenge as some master some skills easily and others find them very challenging.

Nevertheless, we train every Sunday morning from 9am until 11am, and the enthusiasm of the group is fantastic - they can't wait to train! Some of the guys run to training once they are in the gate they are so keen. As a coach, they are the best people we have coached as they do exactly what you ask (mostly!) and always try their best - and they are reaping

the rewards with some amazing improvements. For example, one player can only use his left arm properly and so bats left-handed - but rather than always hook or pull as is so natural with one strong arm, he has been taught to cover drive along the ground so good he's smashed it out the door of the indoor centre and to the gate. Or, we have a bowler who used to run up to the crease, stop still, then windmill bowl. He's almost running straight through now. And then we had a young man who was initially (and understandably) quite scared of the bowling machine and was getting upset before going to face the machine. Some coaching and throwdowns and he proudly went in and now has no fear padding up and going into the nets to bat. For another of the cricketers, this is the first social program in which they have ever been involved outside his home. This is what coaching is all about.

Some of the methods we use include: filming batting and bowling and showing them how to improve their basic technique/s by one-on-one reviews of

the videos; fielding drills including ball games such as hand soccer; skill station rotation drills; bowling skills; batting skills; batting to the bowling machine; playing an indoor cricket match; and, many other co-ordination and skill-based drills.

Every six weeks or so, we also organise a game of cricket of around 20 overs on Bankstown Oval starting around twilight, where the players see their names up in lights on the big screen. We've played three times - in December 2014, February 2015 and a game against able-bodied cricketers in June 2015. We need to kindly thank Matt Clifton's mates from Sydney Uni who have helped provide some great opposition and team mates for these games: Josh, Ron, Jakob, Tim and Diego - you guys provided some special moments and you were greatly appreciated. Indeed, after bungling a run out in one game, one of the RSAC guys (Simon) said "you need to come to our training sessions, mate" to one of the Sydney Uni boys (Jakob). Nice sledge. Alex Smith also volunteered as scorer and ground announcer and we appreciate his time and effort in making the games so professional-looking and sounding - thanks again, Alex. The atmosphere at these games is simply

outstanding. With parents also joining in the second game, and games being followed by a BBQ provided by Jenny and all the crew at RSAC and families, the games have turned into a real fun event for everyone!

In March 2015, Max advised us he would have to step down from his involvement with RSAC training as he was finding the physicality of the training too demanding (Max is a club stalwart in his 80s). We invited Max to continue attending and sharing his wealth of knowledge whenever he can - and he has been most times since then and provided plenty of spin bowling and batting technique advice.

In future, it is our goal to get as many players who want to, to play in Special Olympics or AusRapid or CA All Abilities National Cricket competitions - and we hope to help them achieve their goals. Similarly, for those don't want to play at elite level, we want to offer them training and games at a social level for their enjoyment. Further, we also hope to find competition-style games for the group with other disabled or able-bodied cricketers. It is both an honour and a privilege to coach these wonderful people and Matt and I are grateful for the opportunity it has provided us.

Congratulations to our AW Green Shield winning team, our 1st Grade side for winning the Limited Overs competition and making the 1st Grade 2-Day final. To our 2nd grade side for making the semi final only to miss a grand final appearance by a narrow margin was also a great effort.

Firstly, I'd like to congratulate Glenn Venables and his Penrith side on winning the Reid Cup. I'd also like to congratulate First Grade on winning the limited overs competition and making it to the grand final for the second consecutive year, the AW Green Shield team for the second consecutive year winning both the AW Green Shield and the State Club Challenge and finally Second Grade on finishing third in their campaign and having a red hot go in the finals series just falling short.

Reflecting over the past season, I am very proud of what the fourth grade team achieved. For the whole season, we fought hard, dug deep and competed with the Bulldog spirit in our hearts. We were outplayed in only two of the games - each time our opponents possessed older heads and greater experience. We finished tenth overall with two draws, six losses and seven wins including an outright win over Randwick Petersham. Not a bad effort when you consider 90 percent of the team are under the age of 18 and weren't even born when I started playing for the Bulldogs!

In the first game of the season, I've got to admit that I only knew one other player in the team and you could hear a pin drop in the change room. Unfortunately, over the past few seasons, my ability to train regularly was pretty much non-existent, only being a regular face on game day in the chosen grade. I'm sure individually, some players in the team were filled with anxiety and plenty of uncertainty towards me. Many did not know me, had not seen me play before, let alone know whether I was a bowler, an all rounder or a batsmen? All I had to go on was the players was statistics, respected opinions and what I had seen in the trials. By the end of the season, we all knew each other pretty well and it became a case of me having to stop all the banter to get two words heard in the change room. Quite the opposite to the first game of the season!

Throughout the season we fielded 27 players in fourth grade. Many were playing in their first or second season of grade cricket. Stepping up to play grade for most of these players posed numerous new challenges. By the end of the season it all started to come together with players understanding their individual roles and responsibilities as well as the team objectives and this reflected in our improved results.

As the season progressed, our bowling group consistently executed to our plans and was backed up very well in the field with the team taking most half chances that came our way. We ended up taking a total of 165 wickets, 12 more than any other team in the competition. We dominated almost every batting line-up with the ball giving us a great platform to be competitive in every game. The bowling group was very patient, believed in our team plans and more times than not, the batsmen handed succumbed to the pressure we created. Demonstrating consistent lines and length, chasing down every ball to the boundary and attacking every ball in the ring whilst minimizing the rotation of strike was the downfall of most opposing batsmen. The outright win over Randwick Petersham was the perfect example of our bowling attack's dominance.

Unfortunately, on a regular basis, our batting group fell short of the mark. We consistently lost wickets in groups - we only achieved two batting partnerships over 100 for the season and no batsmen made it to triple figures. Throughout the season, we only batted out our overs on three occasions. Ultimately, poor shot selections and lack of concentration being the downfall and we didn't put a high enough value on our wicket. To be competitive in the lower grade competitions, we need to improve on our batting performances. The foundation for most teams that generally finish at the top of the ladder is based on their batting group. We possess the batting talent to achieve this however this season we fell short of the mark too often.

The upside to this is that we possess the facilities and resources both on and off the field to improve in this area. Batsmen, runs are scored out on the field, not watching from outside the boundary. You don't have to look pretty in scoring runs or have a strike rate of a run a ball, just spend as much time out in



the middle as you possibly can - it gets easier and the runs will come. You just need to look at the top run scorers in our club to appreciate this. Let's set the challenge for next year to the batting group to take more ownership with our batting, minimize poor shot selections, increase time in the middle and put the highest price on our wicket!

To the coaching group, Crowie, Hally and Coach Burke, thank you for all the hours of preparation, the time and effort you guys put in to provide a training platform for all players at our club to succeed. The execution every week is superb and our feedback is always taken on board.

To all the parents, supporters and volunteers, on behalf of the fourth grade team and myself, I thank you for all the support you provide on game day as well as throughout the week at training. The club will not be the same without this support.

To the chairman of selectors Phil Kelly and fellow captains, thank you for your feedback and at times words of wisdom in the selection process throughout the season. Your support throughout my first year of captaincy has been second to none.

To all the 26 players that followed me out onto the field throughout the season and contributed to the team, I also thank you. I appreciate the respect that you all have shown to me throughout the entire season. I hope that I was able to offer each of you something that will help you grow your game in return. I also hope that you enjoyed playing in fourth grade at the same time.

Finally, I would like to thank the club and the committee in appointing me the role as fourth grade captain. It's an honour playing at such a great club that is filled with a rich tradition and success. It has personally been a new and refreshing challenge that I have thoroughly enjoyed.

He shows tremendous amounts of control with the ball and definitely thinks about what he is going to bowl on every occasion. Keep learning your trade as you grow into your body and I look forward to seeing your successes in the years ahead.

Matthew Hudson

Huddo showed his class with both bat and ball throughout the season. He is a gifted allrounder that simply needs to believe in his ability. He showed his class with the bat consistently getting solid starts but

wasn't able to convert these starts into some big scores. With the ball, he bowled consistent lines and length constantly troubling batsmen. 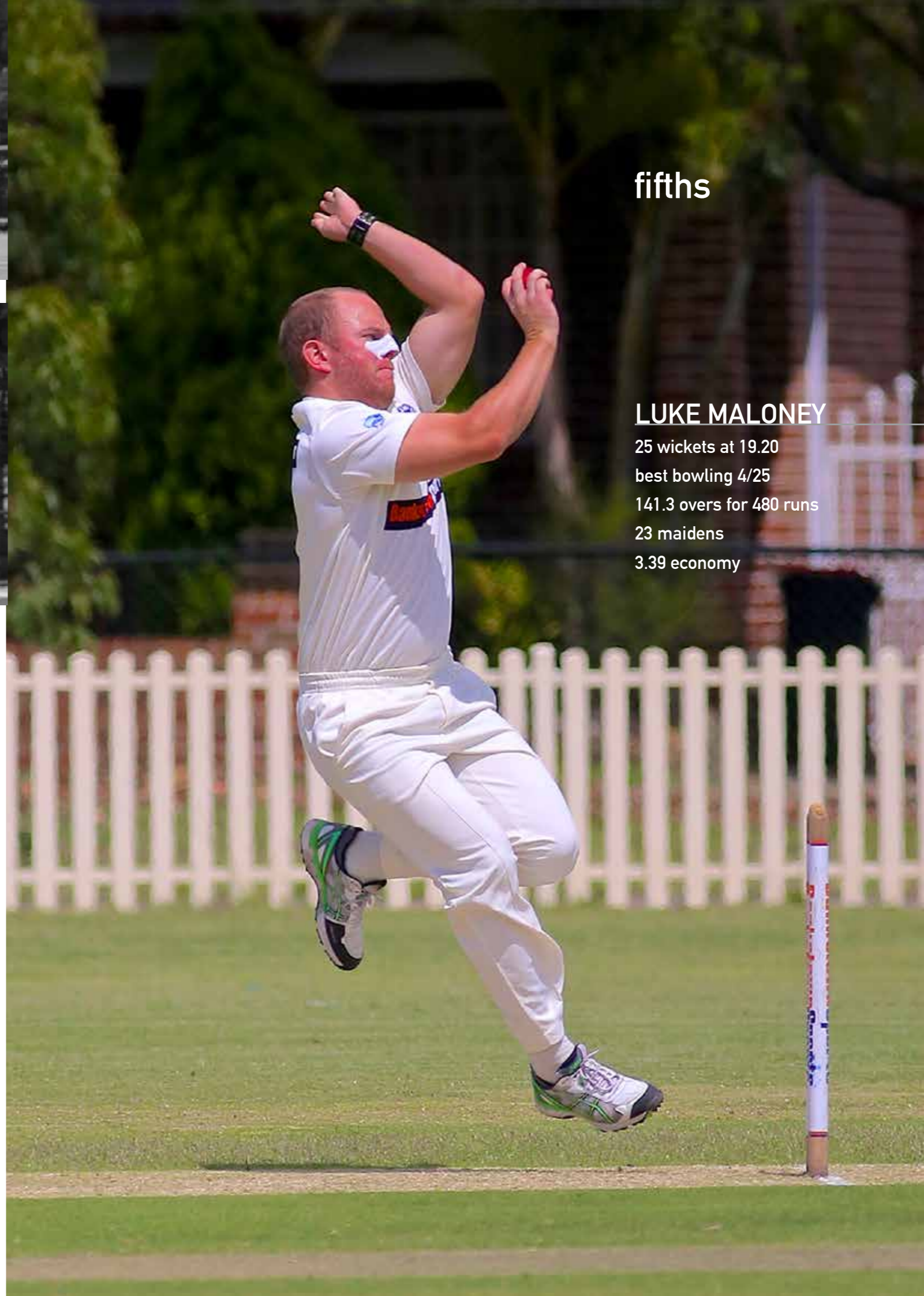

I'd like to congratulate Dougal Bryant and his Northern District side in ending a lengthy drought and taking out this year's 5th Grade Premiership. Also I'd like to formally congratulate Ray Hall and this year's Green Shield squad in achieving back-to-back premierships, and to Jarrad Burke and the rest of the 1st Grade team for taking out the Limited Overs competition and making this year's final for the second year in a row - unfortunately falling short again. You boys have certainly set a benchmark for all to follow at this club and it was a pleasure to often view/hear from the other side of the canal a dominant performance with either bat or ball.

Season 2014/2015 was another year of development in 5th Grade. With several experienced players leaving the club in higher grades, it meant a number of players who experienced grade cricket last year -and probably banking on another year in fives -were shuffled up the grades and once again 5th grade was a team made up of fairly wet behind the ears players in regards to grade cricket. While from a personal point of view it is quite encouraging to see the youth of this club progress and ultimately succeed in higher grades, more must be done to retain the players that the club has essentially weaned from Green Shield.

Being new to the captaincy role this year was also an immensely challenging but rewarding prospect. As we lined up for Round 1 (against eventual premiers NDs) it was hard not to draw parallels to my job as a teacher- amongst Spotty and myself was a bunch of nervous and wary players looking forward to getting stuck in and hopefully learning something, much like a bunch of Year 7 students on the first day of high school. As I write this, I believe that a number of lessons were learnt throughout the season, which hopefully the boys will remember for the time they stay with the club and beyond.

Lesson 1: There are 80 overs in a day's play

No, this is not to say the boys didn't know start or finishing time, but rather this refers the level of application required to work together as a unit and sustain concentration for a full day of cricket. We (I say 'we' but I really mean the batsmen...as a bowler they were hellish) were blessed with some pretty flat decks early on in the season, and it was very pleasing that we were able to take full advantage of these situations, batting out our overs and posting decent challenges for our opposition. To score over

300 runs against the eventual premiers on that last Saturday in September only to see it get chased down by a classy and more experienced batting line-up was disappointing as more often than not 300 wins a game of grade cricket. However, we were to follow it up a week later posting another 300 plus score against Sutherland, this time ending up on the winning side. This showed the club that amongst our group we had a bunch of boys willing to fight, and on a number of occasions later on in the season we were also able to bat our allotted overs, giving our bowlers every chance to win the game.

By the same token, there were times when we were on the wrong side of the coin toss and had to spend the full 80 overs in the field. I believe that this part of the lesson is still in the midst of being mastered as while the effort could never be doubted, there were lapses in concentration at key stages in a number of games that may have seen us sit slightly higher on the table. However, when you consider most of the side were playing juniors each Saturday morning, some had spent the best part of 120 overs on a cricket field (plus 2 warmups) by the time the last hour had rolled around! Whilst the club should never hold back the goal of many of our young players to play junior cricket with players of their own age, it is quite obvious in my opinion that this factor can become detrimental to the team given our heavy reliance on youth (we had up to 7 or 8 of the 11 playing junior cricket the morning before a game). It is worth adding that the reports of these junior games were of fairly one-sided contests, which in my opinion devalues these games' worth as nurseries for our present and future grade players.

Lesson 2: Learn to win, and make it a habit

After being a part of a fairly barren year in the lower grades last year, it was important to start afresh this



season by winning early on in the season. Whilst I've been told that winning isn't the main priority in this grade, I believe it is an important lesson that we must enforce on our young players, as a successful club is a happy club. Given the recent successes of Green Shield teams it was apparent that these boys knew how to win, we just had to convert it over to grade cricket. We managed to achieve this in Round 2 against Sutherland thanks to a brilliant hundred by Connor Wilkinson (more on that to come). Whilst it wasn't until Round 7 that we managed our next win against Wests, in the gap between these rounds we only managed to lose the one game; the weather winning the day against Sydney University where we were well on track for chasing down 300 and then saving us against Penrith. Victory in Round 7 sparked a 4-game winning streak – a feat not achieved since Leten and Baker graced the 5th grade scorecards - with victories over Wests, Hawkesbury, Sydney and Fairfield-Liverpool. A particular highlight of this run was our 1 run win over Sydney, with Mathew 'Panther' Lozinski bowling a tight last over, assisted by some tight fielding and a run out from Brendan Clark off the last ball. I have no doubt had this game been played last year or even earlier in the season we wouldn't have had the faith to back ourselves to do the job, something that winning games brings to the table.

Our streak over January was also with no doubt our strongest team. Unfortunately, injuries and unavailability in higher grades caused a reshuffle when we were faced with our toughest run of the draw – playing against eventual finalists in 4 of our last 6 games. While the chop and change is a part of lower grade cricket, had everything held together we may have been able to add more than just the 6 wins we tallied up over the course of the season, and our



final standing of 14th slightly higher.

Lesson 3: Application leads to success

This could easily be placed under the banner of Lesson 1, but it is important to note the individuals who week after week gave their all for the team and reaped the rewards. I may have already mentioned it, but the sensational hundred by Connor versus Sutherland as well as the 99 not out scored by Hayden Probert versus Wests were two classy performances of players destined for higher levels of cricket (Connor actually didn't play another game of 5th grade this season; no that doesn't mean you get the batting award mate!). In addition to this, we had a number of 50 and 100 run partnerships from a number of players, with two of these (the 8th wicket stand of Connor and myself and the 5th wicket stand of Hayden Probert and Matthew Simpson) setting new club 5th grade records. This level of application to weather the storm, take stock of the bowling and build a partnership – usually with a total batting masterclass to shadow happening next door in First Grade - stands these boys in good stead as they head through the grades.

Whilst there was only one five wicket haul this season (Rob Lenard v Randwick-Petersham- a silver lining on a fairly disappointing game of cricket), the application from our bowlers – more often than not on pancake flat decks also stands them in good stead to march toward higher grade honours. While not the biggest unit to ever grace a cricket field, Dayne Heward is a promising young fast bowler who never shied at taking the new ball throughout the season and I'm fairly convinced if it wasn't for bowling restrictions would go a 15 over spell let alone the measly 6 he gets doted out. Ben Hunt is another bowler who by his own admission may not have achieved the goals



he set out for himself at the start of the year, but learnt a great deal as he continued to master the difficult craft of leg spin bowling, often bowling long spells in tough match situations.

Whilst there are many more lessons that individuals may have learnt over the year, I'd like to think these were the major ones the boys will have got out of this year, and will go on to remember in years to come. Thanks goes to Gary Crowfoot, Dean Burke and Ray Hall for ensuring these lessons have been instilled in not only my team but the club as a whole. These gentlemen go a long way ensuring their passion for the club is passed onto the next generation, and I'd like to pay particular thanks to Crowie for his advice regarding my captaincy throughout the season. Thanks also goes to Steve Hunt for his tireless work behind the computer (easily the most high tech scorer in 5s), to Ron Heward and Michael Simpson for their general help and making sure everything ran as smoothly as possible on Saturdays, as well as all the mums and dads who drive countless hours around Sydney and sacrifice perfect Saturdays where the beach is a tempting option so their sons can play the game they love. To Phil Kelly, thanks very much in your efforts each week in ensuring we have the very best sides in each grade. To President Scott Grant and your Management Committee – my thanks for your efforts in leading organisation and governance of the Club. And finally, thanks to Spotty- you continue to preach the gospel of cricket with such passion and tenacity that under another set of eyes may take these boys years to learn. Your lessons on cricket and life to the boys this year – myself included- will go a long way in ensuring these boys not only have the potential to become decent cricketers, but if they put it into practice they may end up being decent humans as well.

Firstly the club won Under 15 South-East Zone for the Junior Breakers League with our newly formed team winning their grand final in their first season – an amazing effort! 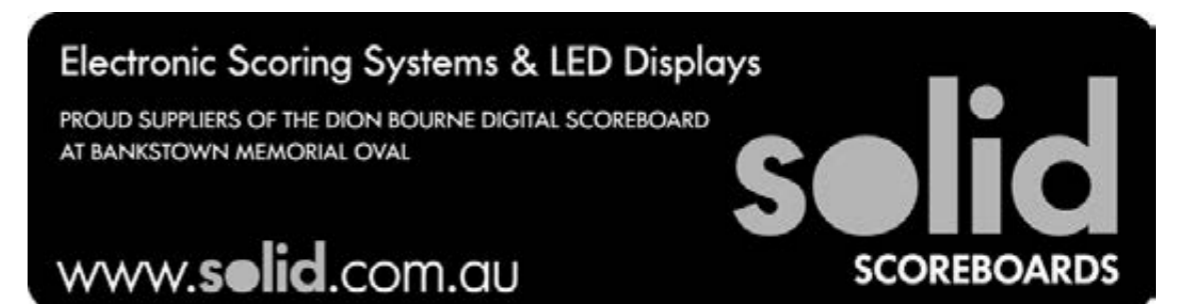
