RECORD BREAKERS

Joel Brockley and Riley Kingsell broke Bankstown District Cricket Club's highest First Grade 1st wicket partnership record in R16 against Eastern Suburbs at Waverley Oval.

Their mammoth partnership of 286 beat the previous record of 246 set by Grahame Thomas (151) (First Grade cap 36) and Alan Kelly (85) (First Grade cap 43) in 1962/63 against Paddington, this was the longest standing record at the club.

Kingsell and Brockley's partnership ended when Brockley was dismissed for 98, Kingsell 164* at the time. Their 286 run partnership also came off only 260 balls (43.2 overs).

I have the pleasure of presenting the Club's 74th Annual Report.

Congratulations to all Premiership-winning clubs; special mention to Greg Monaghan and the Parramatta Club on their Men's Club Championship, 1st, 3rd and 5th Grade Men's Premierships and Women's 3rd Grade Premiership – a remarkable performance that was many years in the making. In his President's Report, Reza has spoken in about special individual and team efforts, and I fully endorse his congratulations and won't repeat that commentary here.

The Management Committee is delighted to report that CB City has issued a contract to Rees Sports Lighting for the installation of Class 2 Stadium Lights at Memorial Oval. Detailed planning and geotechnical works have commenced – Rees will be on site in July, and the lights should be operational by end September 2025. We are currently researching modular building technique options for a kiosk/player dining area to replace the old 'Band Room' space. While the canteen under the Hall of Fame building has been a workable option for the past two seasons, there's no doubt we will gain lots of operational efficiencies and enhanced player/volunteer/general spectator interaction by having all matchday operations located in the same area.

VALE Frank Cicutto

The Club lost one of its finest sons in January 2025 with the passing of former Club Secretary and 1st Grade player Frank Cicutto. Bankstown District Cricket Club has helped produce numerous well known international level cricketing greats, but it is also a fact that we have helped develop many inspirational captains of industry... none more so than Frank Cicutto. Frank joined the National Australia Bank in 1967 as a 17-year-old clerk and worked to the top of the business. He progressively served in various senior roles, including specialist business units, and ultimately was appointed CEO of NAB in 1999, serving in that role until 2004. Frank was an aggressive opening batsman, the Bulldogs 121st First Grade Capped player. Frank was Club Secretary from 1972 to 1975 until he was transferred to Melbourne with NAB. He was always active with club sub-committees and especially enjoyed organising social activities. Frank was fielding at silly mid-on at Memorial Oval in the days before helmets when a short delivery was pulled straight at him. Frank was rushed to hospital with a fractured skull. He spent months in St Vincent's Hospital recovering and, a year later, was still not able to speak correctly. His courage to fight back from such a serious injury and ascend to the pinnacle of the Australian banking industry is testimony to his determination and Bulldog fighting spirit. Frank was involved in two century stands in 1977-78 as a hard-hitting opener. He was in great touch, contributing 57 in a 100-run partnership with his great mate Steve Small against Manly, a terrific feat to outscore the dashing lefthander Small. Frank also impressed with 79 versus Northern District when he was involved in another 100-run partnership, this time with Bob Vidler at the SCG. Frank batted for 155 minutes and smashed a towering six into the Ladies Stand. The Club offers sincere condolences to Frank's wife, Christine, son Andrew, Daughter-in-law Sheetal, Grandchildren Arlen, and Araia and the extended Cicutto family.

VALE Alan Kelly

The Club was saddened to lose one of its pioneers with the passing of Alan Kelly, 1st Grade Cap #43. Alan passed away in Bankstown Hospital after a short illness on Monday, 25 November 2024, aged 86.

Alan was a member of our first Poidevin Gray Shield-winning team in 1953/54. He was aged just 15. He played in the club's first Belvidere Cup 1st Grade winning premiership team in 1958/59, at 20 years of age. Alan was a winning team member in the 1961-62 Albert Cup second-grade side. He also held the 1st grade opening partnership record of 246 runs with Grahame Thomas, recorded in the 1962-63 season, which was not broken until 2024-25. Alan was very popular with his teammates and highly regarded by administrators and coaches because of his no-fuss approach to training and how he played the game. Alan's son Brett played AW Green Shield for the Club in 1987-88 and lower grades in the following years. In later years, Alan often called into Memorial Oval to watch grade matches, Sheffield Shield or other representative matches and always remarked about how proud he was that the club had continued to develop its reputation as a strong force in Sydney Grade Cricket.

VALE Ken Dixon

It is with deep sadness that we advise the passing of Ken Dixon OAM, Bulldog 1st Grade Cap #104. Ken passed away at Gosford Hospital on Sunday 25th May 2025 following a two-year period of ill health.

Ken is another Bulldog who not only achieved success on the field, but also off it. During his working career he was a senior NSW public servant, retiring as General Manager of Finance and Administration for the Department of Education and Training. Living much of his life on the Central Coast Ken was named Central Coast Bowls Volunteer of the Year in 2017, and received the Community Ambassador Award Central Coast Kids in Need, the CPA Australia Director's Excellence Award, the Office of the Department of Public Prosecutions Director's Service Excellence Award and the Order of Australia Medal in 2024 for his service to youth and the Central Coast community in general.

Ken debuted for the Dogs in AW Green Shield in 1967-68. A wicketkeeper and top order batsmen he found himself behind the stumps at a time when Bankstown fielded two of Australia's fastest bowlers in Len Pascoe and Jeff Thomson. Ken's talent and sheer determination resulted in his promotion to first grade, but a posting to London representing the NSW Government saw him prioritise work and family and cut short a promising career. He remained a much-loved team mate, regularly socialising with John Bull's past player group at Bankstown Sports Club as recently as late 2024.

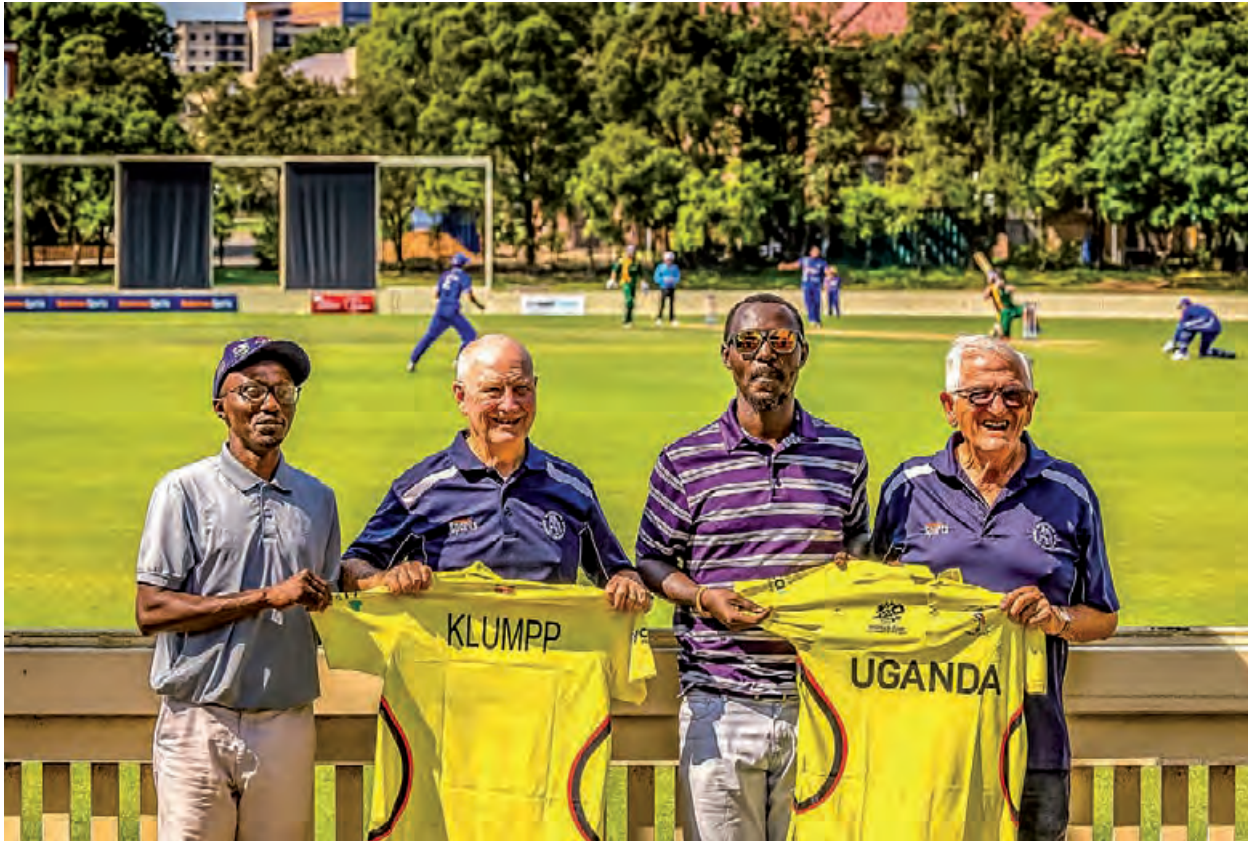
Dan Solway and Troy and Kylee Freedman.

We continue to have a close working relationship with Head Curator Nick Mamolis. Nick approaches his role with total professionalism. He takes the utmost pride in his work, and it shows in the quality of wickets and outfield he delivers consistently throughout the season.

Nick and Memorial Oval ran 2nd in the NSW Premier Cricket '1st Grade Ground of the Year' for 2024/25. While this is an excellent achievement that should be celebrated, we believe that an anomaly in the competition rules that allowed a ranking from a match where only three overs were played, 'did not pass the pub test' (99% of matches were abandoned on this day due to wet weather). If this ranking was excluded, Memorial Oval would have clearly topped the competition. We will be making recommendations

to NSW Premier Cricket to ensure the ranking system does not throw up such anomalies in future.

The Grahame Thomas Oval practice wickets were again of very high quality, and this only happened because of Nick's hard work. We did have the first incident of vandalism in two decades at GT Oval when a clown on an e-scooter decided to ruin a good set of covers and tear up a wet turf square – Nick miraculously managed to get matches on the same weekend!

Former Memorial Oval general hand Dragan Stricevic took over as Curator at Kelso North and did an amazing job. Supported by long time Kelso precinct supervisor Ralph Robinson Dragan continued Kelso Park North's steady improvement as a grade cricket facility. The improved pace of the outfield ensures the ground is better suited to younger players who don't have the brute strength of older players. Kelso Park North supported 3rd and 4th Grade Men's, NSW Youth

Championships and Sixers Summer T20, so it was used almost every Saturday and Sunday during the season without any loss of quality. We also used Kelso for a couple of Women's CC centre wickets on a Tuesday and hope to increase this activity in coming seasons. Thanks, Dragan, we really appreciate your support.

The Club would like to express its heartfelt gratitude to CB City's Senior Curator Nick Mamolis and team members Darryl Thatcher, Neville Rae, Dragan Stricevic & apprentices Ryan Hand and Mitchell Rowles. 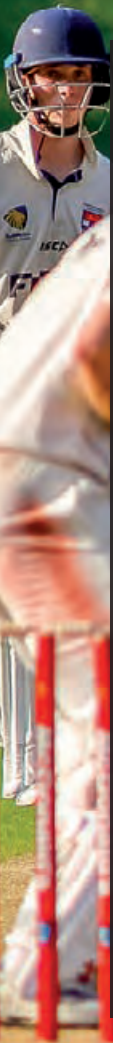

Our lads bowled our hearts out in scorching heat on a dead wicket. Gurinder and Rehab got two wickets early on Day 2 before Sydney Uni dug in and batted the rest of the day. Although we didn't get the result we were after, I can't fault our efforts playing 2 outstanding days of good aggressive cricket. It was a privilege to once again take the field as the 4th Grade Captain for this great club in the 2024/25 season. 4th Grade is always a difficult environment to navigate - we regularly feel the ebbs and flows of player movements from higher grades, look to blood younger talent and often find players who are capable of playing good cricket in 3s in our ranks.

Entering the season with a talented group of players, I regret that my own unavailability due to work and family commitments, in conjunction with several washouts, hindered the development of culture and cohesion within the team over the course of the season. Whilst being fortunate to have experienced clubmen in Jehan Bilimoria and Anthony Melnyk to fill the void in my absence, I believe that we would have achieved greater results if I was able to be on deck more often to drive this.

The team results absolutely did not reflect the ability of the playing group, and looking back on the season it was clear that we too often relied on 1-2 standout performers without constructing an overall team performance. Having

said this, there were signs of development across the board which was pleasing and bodes well for the club in seasons to come.

On the batting front, our 3 pillars throughout the year were Johann Perera, Jack Ashburner and Sam Freedman.

Joey continues to prove himself to be a great clubman, and (most of the time!) shows a maturity which is greatly appreciated in a young side. Batting with confidence throughout the year, he showed plenty of signs that the class of seasons past is still in him, and I'm sure he will continue to produce great results for the club regardless of what grade he plays in.

Jack's season was a fitting reward for one of the hardest workers I have watched in my time at Bankstown. Displaying a sense of confidence in his game off the back of many hours of hitting, Jack was able to increase his scoring rate whilst keeping the same tight technique and value of his wicket which makes him a captains dream at the top of the order. His results in both 3s and 4s made me extremely proud and should

do the same for him.

Sam Freedman continued to show why he is one of the clubs best young all-rounders, impressing in a season hindered by both injury and his HSC commitments. His 98 against Sutherland in particular showed his toughness and application with the side under significant pressure. I am sure that next season Sam will go from strength to strength, and he should draw a lot of confidence from his efforts this year.

Outside of these 3, we saw Jordan King work his way back to form from one of the more peculiar off-season injuries that I've ever heard of! Kingy will always have a place in any team I pick - he is one of the hardest working players you could hope to find, and always has a habit of standing up when the chips are down. We saw him find some of his best form at the back end of the year after what was a difficult return from injury when he was still underdone. Assuming he steers clear of hostile dinner plates this off season, Jordan will be hard to keep out of 3rd grade next year.

Ben Smith was unlucky to not see more time in 4s,

however I don't think that this will be an issue moving forward. He played several innings which showed he will be a force in years to come, a back to the wall half-century in Round 1 chief among these. He competes in a way which fits perfectly with the clubs identity and I look forward to seeing the results of Ben's off-season improvement.

With the ball, our attack was led by the spin of Reagan Sidhu, who enjoyed his best season with the club to date. Reagan showed that when he is backing himself there are few batsmen in 4's equipped to deal with his ripping leg breaks. His personality brings a lot of laughs to the team and he continues to improve with the bat as well. 32 wickets on the season is a fantastic return and I hope that he challenges for higher honours next season.

Reagan often shared spin duties with either (or both) of Josh Bean and

Sam Cordingley. Beany enjoyed a breakout year with seventeen 4th Grade scalps to his name along with time in 3rd Grade. When he is on-song, it is a beautiful sight to watch, his shape making him a threat to both edges. I hope he continues to apply himself as he has the past few years, because his constant improvement places him well on the way to success in higher grades. A great competitor who bats and fields well, Beany is very hard to keep out of the game.

When Sam Cordingley has his rhythm, there are few young leg-spinners with more accuracy. Not relying on massive turn, Sam showed through the year his ability to get on top of a batsmen and build pressure, with his 6/45 off 27 overs against Sutherland being the prime example. By working to maintain his pace and accuracy under pressure and mastering his variations, Sam will continue to reap rewards and be a damaging bowler

across all formats. Sam also flashed his technique and ability with the bat in hand, and I am sure that in a few years time he will be nudging all-rounder status.

Our 3 spinners all yo-yoed between grades which was unfortunate as all showed their ability to bowl beyond a 4th grade level during the season. To their credit, the trio never complained and always showed up to matches with a team first attitude. Some great young fellas who are a pleasure to captain.

Our pace stocks were often a revolving door throughout the year. Charlie Fitzjohn overcame an early-season injury to return to 4's as a true strike weapon, on his way to 15 wickets in just 7 games. One of the nicest fast bowlers you would ever meet, Charlie's return to form was a great sign and hopefully his body allows him to build on his momentum into next season.

Anthony Melnyk took on a

mature presence in the side, delivering essential spells of sustained accurate seam bowling which often led to him or his bowling partner reaping the rewards. When not excelling in higher grades, youngsters Kostas Saisanas and Matthew Fitzgerald both delivered several impactful spells in their limited time in 4th Grade.

Behind the pegs, Cooper McMahon showed great character to deal with a frustrating start to the season before showing us what he was capable of at the back end of the season. He should be proud of his tenacity and take these lessons on board in the future. Another fine young man who is a pleasure to captain.

I hope that the side comes away from the year with a hunger to improve next off-season and return to the finals hunt. The talent is clearly there, but we must work to keep the belief and mental edge over a 16-game season in order to go to that next step.

Thank you to our parents and supporters who assisted with the various chores off the field throughout the season - your efforts did not go unnoticed!

I would like to pay particular thanks to Chris Ridley and the rest of the coaching staff. Rids did an outstanding job in his head coaching debut this season - I would encourage all the players in all grades to continue to buy

into the culture and example he is establishing moving forward. I would also like to acknowledge the great work of our committee, who continue to be a benchmark in Sydney Grade Cricket with their passion for this great club. In particular, I must shout out my good mate Jehan Bilimoria who continues to be a selfless leader on and off the park, managing a very difficult role as chairman of selectors and saving me a lot of headaches every week.

I wish all club members and supporters a safe and healthy winter and look forward to season 2025/26. Go the Dogs!

Straight away I would like to extend my thanks and congratulations to Chris Ridley for all his work as club coach. Thanks as always to his assistants through the season – Tim Laws, Jake Cormack, Michael Stretton and Daniel Burns. The advice, effort and application of this coaching team will see benefit in the development of a really young group in the coming seasons. I always appreciated what they were doing with our young guys – whether in the nets, in fielding drills or fitness. Their approach and experience when discussing the mental side of the game with the playing group was obvious – I know our players will have taken this in and continue to apply this now and into the future. The club, and our young players especially, are extremely fortunate to draw on this corporate cricket knowledge and experience.

It was great to be involved again as skipper of such a young, keen and talented group. All players who came into 5th grade worked extremely hard at training and looked to transfer this into games. But many, especially those playing their first season of grade cricket, could see that grade cricket can be tough, and generally there were no easy ‘gimme’ sessions at any point during the season. We were all keen to get more wins on the board, but I can assure the playing group the coaches and I could see the effort at training, and the experience of many tough games this

year will be of benefit next season and beyond. I can also say that quite a few opposing skippers after playing us were surprised we did not have more Ws in our win column.

Where the players can definitely improve as a group came down to 2 basics of cricket – build pressure and that we needed to keep applying it. Whether batting, bowling or fielding- we had many, many strong passages of play. But we needed to maintain this for more than 1 batting partnership or a 10 or 15 over period, and by the same period in the field. We also needed to hold more catches. Most of our coaches would remind us of this at training – grade cricket is played over 2-3 sessions a day and you can’t switch off at any point and still expect to dominate and push for the W. I could see all individuals in most games weren’t just desperate for more wins, they did work hard to keep that pressure and focus as individuals on their game, we just needed to do it for longer.

Having said all that, there were still many great individual and a couple of really good team performances.

Jackson Moore showed great application and developed his all-round batting game this season after a couple of low scores in the first couple of rounds. He became a very reliable upper order bat and showed responsibility in a number of innings. He will be frustrated

that he didn’t go on to bigger scores, but the fact he scored consistently all season is a good sign. I expect him to go onto those big scores next season and beyond. He also showed he deserved his promotion to 4s when he almost scored a 50 in his first dig there. Evan Hoskin (vs Hawkesbury, NDs and Gordon), Lachy Plowes (vs Randwick Petersham) and Ben Smith (very close to a match winning effort vs Wests) had good scores in a number of games. They showed their batting skillset and ability to either build an innings or dominate the bowling but would also admit they would like to consistently score more runs.

Aarav Daddikar, Dylan Davies, Jack Grives, Luke Bean (2nd season of grade) and Jordan McLean all contributed at important times and will value their 1st experience of grade cricket this season and look to build on this next season. Their work ethic alone was impressive so we could see they should continue to develop their obvious talent and skill and will benefit the club in coming seasons. But I encourage them to keep this up as it takes more than 1 or 2 seasons of grade cricket to really develop this effectively.

When comparing this season to the last 2 – we had no batsman who averaged 25 or more. This meant our side consistently failed to pressure the opposition with defendable totals. This was very different to seasons 23/24 and 22/23 when we

had a number of players averaging 25 or slightly better and regularly made competitive totals.

Back to Jack Grives. He worked hard all season at training on his keeping. The benefit of this was shown as he developed his game behind the stumps and took important catches and a couple of stumpings (and yes some other stumpings should have been given but weren't – that's grade cricket though). It is also worth noting that Jack makes important

contributions to team chat in the field and discussion in breaks. These are essential assets to have as keeper and one of the leaders in the field. We strongly encourage he continues to contribute in this way. His competitive spirit and drive to win was great to see.

Among our bowlers Sam Cordingley was equal highest wicket taker with Chris Steffanish on 13 wickets. Lachy Plowes was next with 12. Charlie Fitzjohn, after returning from injury, only

needed two or 3 games to take 9 wickets.

They were all dangerous with their control and ability to penetrate a batsman's defence. Charlie warmed up in his first game as he built slowly from his injury. But then showed us in his next he really should play higher. His 6/47 vs Sydney lead us to our only 1st innings win. We were fortunate to have such quality leg spinners in Sam and Reagan Sidhu and it was also very pleasing to also see Lach develop his

leg spin to never be far from being thrown the ball. Sam and Reags had dominant days respectively. Sam vs Hawks took 8 for 50 across 2 innings to almost single handedly get close to bowling us to an outright. Reags vs Fairfield took 5/46 on a wicket which ripped the ball apart after about 8 overs and bowled beautifully to take advantage of this. Lachy took wickets consistently without a big bag but we think that will come with the consistency he developed this season. Praneel, our very reliable office, bowled well at all times. He flighted and turned the ball nicely without being rewarded as much as the other spinners, but he definitely built pressure which was a great benefit to bowlers at the other end and the team. Reags 5 for vs Fairfield was one example where Praneel played a significant role at the other end in tandem.

On their day this bowling is fantastic and compelling to watch. It can be either attacking or build pressure for bowlers at the other end. Chris Steffa I have left 'til last because he just does what

he does. He bowls accurately and either hits the pads, the off stump or gets the edge. He would have taken more wickets if his catches were all taken (some behind the wicket were dropped by an old guy at slip once or twice but there were others in the ring too).

I also would like to thank Jehan – in his dual role – chair of selections, and also helped by leading the side in the last couple of games. Jehan's experience and skill was obvious and the players definitely benefited from his presence. Matt Kelly, showed his outstanding qualities as a long term Bulldogs player and leader when he played with us in a couple of games. His batting, bowling and advice is still worth having any game he is available. Farhan Mohammed was also great to have in 5s. The team and I always enjoyed playing with these players who are all great examples of club-men. Strong grade cricket clubs always have a good number of these type of club-first players.

I want to wish this group of players the best in developing their game and

on their cricket journey in the coming seasons. It will be good to see how far they can go, and definitely think they listen when we told them they are the ones most in control of how far they go with their game.

I also want to thank the many volunteers at the club and on the committee -Geoff Price, Brian Freedman and Marty Klump and all the great team looking after the canteen. Of course Reza Bilimoria also needs to be acknowledged for providing the leadership and vision that is essential to developing a great grade cricket club. This club would not survive without them.

It has been a pleasure to be involved as a player, captain and supporter (of other sides) over the last 4 seasons in my third stint in grade cricket over the last 3 decades. It has been extremely enjoyable to see the development of players across the grades and the talent, vision, team and club focus and spirit within the Bulldogs. Go the Dogs in season 2025/26!

A tough win from a very difficult position. Our Semi Final against Parramatta was another good game of cricket. After losing the toss we bowled and fielded exceptionally well to keep Parramatta to 6/213 in very warm conditions. Riley Kingsell then took the game away hitting 107 of 71 before being dismissed. The boys then controlled the rest of the run chase to pass the score in the 41st over, 4 down. It was an outstanding achievement to play in a Final at Bankstown Oval. We were host to a strong Manly side who were outstanding on the day. Our boys toiled hard in warm conditions but Manly were able to get to a strong total of 8/284. Unfortunately, our run chase never really got going, losing wickets consistently to eventually be bowled out for 111 in the 26th over. It wasn't to be our day. It was an unfortunate end to an incredible season as we were outplayed on the day.

There were so many outstanding performances throughout the season. Riley Kingsell finished the competitions leading run scorer hitting 392 runs at 78.4. Matthew Fitzgerald was the competitions leading wicket taker with 22 wickets

at 12.95. On top of these outstanding performances, there were a number of other outstanding contributions throughout the season. The way our bowlers controlled games throughout was impressive. His drive to succeed and his relentless pursuit of perfection is something I admire. I'm looking forward to continuing to work with him and the group next season. I'd also like to thank Joel Brockley who gave up his time to assist at training and matches proving a very valuable resource for

not only myself, but the players as well. Joel didn't have to take on the role of an assistant coach but was more than happy to, in order to add as much value as he could to the group. We all appreciate the time and support you gave. I'd also like to thank Todd Mitchell for scoring this season. It was unfortunate to lose Zane very early in the season to injury, but that didn't stop them both from being a regular part of the team for the entire season and we very much appreciate it. Thank you to all the parents and volunteers for your help on game days allowing the players to concentrate on their performance. In closing I'd like to thank everyone involved with this year's PG's group and I'm thoroughly looking forward to next season.

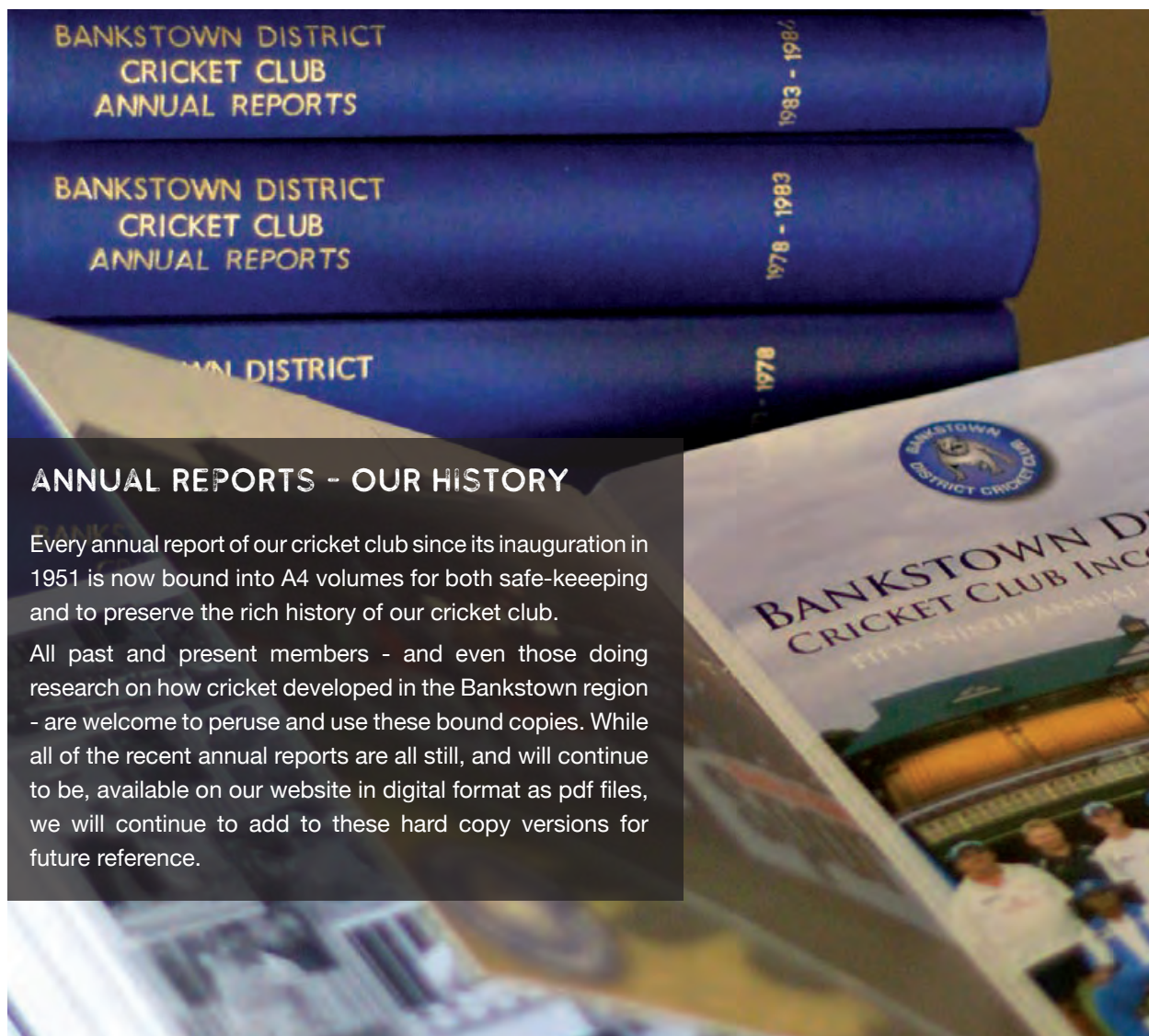

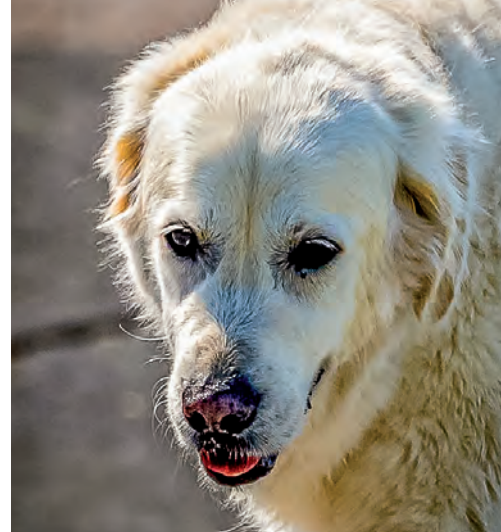




















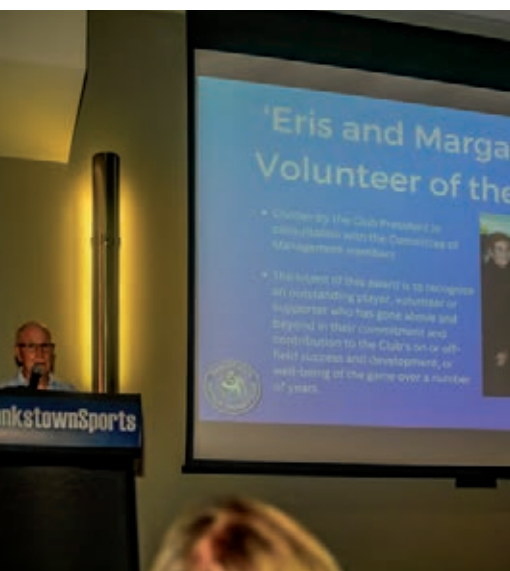












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
