I have pleasure in presenting the Fifty Sixth Annual Report and Financial Statement.

The 2006-07 season will be remembered for the magnificent performances of our first grade squad in winning the Belvidere Cup and Limited Overs competitions and the solid progress made towards completing key projects from our strategic plan. Prior to the season if we had been offered a finals berth in these competitions I suspect we would have said "thanks we'll take that"! To win both is a wonderful achievement by any standards and much of the credit rests with our team leader Scott Thompson and Head Coach Shane Duff.

Scott Thompson has enjoyed a successful career at State and grade levels but I know last season ranks as his most enjoyable and satisfying. His achievement in blending a group of old hands with our best emerging young players is testimony to his skilful leadership.

Shane Duff, in his second year at the helm of our coaching team, made subtle changes to his approach of 2005-06 and his ability to read players' needs and quietly but confidently support them on and off the field marks him as stand-out talent in the elite coaching ranks.

I'll leave it to others to wax lyrical about individual performances but it would be remiss of me not to mention Corey Richards and Brett Van Deinsen. Corey's attitude to training and match days was outstanding. He is a proud Clubman and his professionalism sets the benchmark for all other players to emulate. Brett, in his first year at the Club, settled in perfectly. His abundant natural ability was complemented by his easy going manner and a fierce determination to succeed as part of a team effort.

Our on-field performances were the result of a lot of hard work by our Cricket Operations Committee headed by David Freedman and supported by Mark Grant, John Bull, David Drew and Chris Gane. This group looks after our retention and recruitment plans as well as having an oversight of coaching strategies and any issues affecting player performance.

We congratulate our representative players:

Aaron Bird: New South Wales Blues. **Simon Keen:** NSW and Australia Under 19's. **Daniel Burns:** NSW and Australia Under 19's.

Chris Ridley: NSW Under 19's. Chris Small: NSW Under 19's.

We have made solid progress with the major project to undertake the next phase of capital works at Bankstown Memorial Oval. A key component of this plan is the construction of an Indoor Cricket and Sports Facility adjacent to Memorial Oval and Grahame Thomas Ovals. Through the efforts of our great supporter and friend Frank Burke I'm pleased to report that the formal Development Application was lodged with Bankstown Council on 30th June 2007.

We have already secured over \$850k in funding from Cricket NSW, Bankstown Sports Club, Revesby Workers' Club, Canterbury Leagues and a private benefactor and we are hopeful our application to the NSW Government for a Regional Sports Grant will receive favourable consideration.

Sponsors are our life blood and to our major sponsor, Bankstown Sports Club,

we thank you for your continued support. I think one would be hard pressed to find a sporting or community group that doesn't receive generous financial assistance from BDSC. That the club continues to do this in the face of unprecedented business pressure by way of increased taxes etc is testimony to the integrity and sense of purpose of the Board of Directors and Senior Management.

During the season we hosted several second tier first class matches including the NSW Blues Inter-squad trials, a round of the Cricket Australia Cup and a City versus Country Colts match. We also supported CHS cricket by providing Grahame Thomas Oval, Jensen Oval and Memorial Oval to host the NSW Schoolboys Championships and the NSWPSSA Girls State Championships. This Club is blessed to have a wonderful band of volunteers. I thank every person who scores, lifts covers, sells pies and drinks in the canteen and generally makes life easier for players and visitors. While there are too many to name individually

here, I must mention the following special contributors:

Eris and Margaret Dignam, as always, made a magnificent contribution to the Club's welfare. From handling the financial aspects of our operations, coordinating training, purchasing clothing and running the canteen Margaret and Eris are indispensable.

Sherrol Gane was named 'Scorer of the Year' by the NSW Umpires and Scorers Association and we are thrilled that her contribution to the Club on many levels was recognised through the inaugural presentation of this prestigious award.

Mick Stephenson handled our publicity via the Torch and Express newspapers and our website. Mick's ability to capture the feel for a match in words is legendary as is his cries of "Go the Bulldogs" from his favourite vantage point in front of the Dion Bourne Scoreboard.

David Clifton again assisted with

production of the Annual Report as well as the special memorabilia poster produced to celebrate the dual first grade premierships. David is actively involved with the NSW Cricket Umpires Assn. and the emerging 'All Stars Winter Cricket Assn." and makes a fantastic contribution to the wider cricket community.

Brian Freedman took over the Assistant Secretary duties and combined with his roles as a member of the SCA Committee of Management, work on various Cricket Australia sub committees, Delegate roles to the NSWCA, SCA and the Bankstown Cricket Council. Not to mention his tireless work driving our project to send recycled cricket equipment to Uganda! Perhaps we shouldn't be surprised to learn that this means he is probably more involved in cricket administration than ever. For seven years Therese Darwen 'fought the good fight' and acted as an inspiration to everyone she met. Along with husband Chris, Therese was always on hand to support and quietly encourage Patrick as he climbed the cricket ladder.

When there was work to be done, Therese was always among the first to volunteer even during periods when she was undergoing treatment and her health was poor. Therese never complained that she'd been hard done by.

She was always more interested in others and their problems rather than dwelling on her own situation. She had a particular knack for connecting with young people who loved her sense of humour and genuineness.

Therese was a great friend and support to Rosie Freedman during her illness and it is a cruel twist that has seen us lose two of our very best within a year of each other.

Perhaps the most fitting tribute to Therese and Rosie was the fact that more than 500 people attended their funerals with the majority heading back to the Steve and Mark Waugh Pavilion to celebrate their lives in a place they had shared much time and joy.

SECOND GRADE THE ALBERT CUP

Mark Grant

In writing about our season I would first like to acknowledge Mosman District Cricket Club as the 2nd Grade Premiers. Sincere congratulations to Martin Hayward, an old team mate of mine, and his team. Whilst we did defeat them in the rounds, it was clear to anyone who new anything about cricket that we had some good fortune in both weeks of the clash.

Our off-season planning was excellent via the David Freedman-led Cricket Committee, who planned everything from playing strength to coaching personnel. Well done to all involved.

The 2006-2007 Season was a very positive one for our club, with 1st grade winning both trophies. Congratulations to Thommo and his squad for "the double", not easy to achieve. Our season fell well short of expectations, given that we led the competition by five points after Round 6. By season's end though injuries, players promoted and on representative duty, and a lack of consistency saw us miss the finals series by three points.

We had some close and memorable matches. We won some and lost others. Our win against Mosman, which was clearly a quality side, was partly built on our last wicket partnership of 110 runs which helped to total 273. This enabled Steven Burt to show us his wares with the bat, scoring a quality 65 at Number 11. Then in bowling the following week all seamers benefited from cool bowling conditions and knocked Mosman over for 125.

Perhaps the best and closest game was against reigning Premiers, Northern Districts. In a one day match in very good conditions, we were set 274 to win. Needing 21 off the last over we managed 20, thanks to some magic from Anthony Sams, in what was then only his fourth match. A tie the result.

On the other side of the coin, we suffered at the hands of Manly. Umpiring



went against us the first week and we struggled to post 257. In reply, two dropped catches enabled their last wicket to put on 51 runs to win the game.

Five centurions graced our scorebook this season, one more than last season. Darren Ettridge got two (118 V Wests and a big 184 V Gordon), and Chris Gane one 104 V last season's Premiers-Northern Districts), part of the reason they gained 1st grade positions. Chris Small (107 V Uni NSW) and Chris Ridley (151 V Wests) also scored a century, both getting closer to regular 1st grade cricket.

Later in this report are the team's statistics, showing three batsmen scored more than 400 runs (Chris Small, Chris Ridley and Darren Ettridge) and four players averaging over 30, still on the disappointing side.

Bowlers regularly bowled well together, with a potent bowling mix when all players were available. Many bowlers achieved quite good statistics, with only Clint Price (missed six matches) bagging more than 25 wickets. However, in no particular order, Steven Burt, Darren Ettridge, Chris Small, David Ward (missed four matches), Michael Polson (missed four matches), Scott Truashiem (played more than half the season in 1st grade) all bowled very well throughout the season, conceding 300 only once.

A bowler for the future may be Brendan Scott, who in just his couple of matches showed the rare ability to bowl economical spells whilst moving the ball both ways.

Keeping for us was capably undertaken by Anthony Sams, when not in either the 1st grade team or representing NSW. His 35 plus dismissals were always efficiently taken and provided certainty to all bowlers. Combined with his batting, Anthony had a very good first full season.

I would like to thank Warwick Starr, his staff, and the volunteer brigade for both Bankstown grounds, which were always presented to a very high standard indeed. It's a pleasure to train and play on such facilities.

No captain can have an enjoyable, competitive season without strong support. Special thanks to Daniel Moy and Darren Ettridge for providing ideas and input throughout matches. To Brian Freedman, Marty Klumpp, Eris Dignam and my colleagues on the Management Committee, thanks for again extending the opportunity to me to captain. My thanks also to the Selection Panel, chaired by David Freedman, who ensured all players were observed and given a fair hearing when determining team balance.

Special thanks too must go to all the ladies in the Canteen for preparing lunches and afternoon teas. It's just another reason why playing at Bankstown Oval continues to be a wonderful experience. Last but not least, I want to thank our various scorers (in particular, Wendy Ridley) and Lindsay Roworth for the assistance they provided the team. To Lindsay go my thanks for the thousand tasks asked of you at short notice. People may not be aware that Lindsay did not have any family playing in the team, but I appreciated his reliability, dedication and all-round good humour each and every week.

Finally, I would like to thank all of the 19 players who played 2nd Grade during this season. We enjoyed each others' company, but let ourselves down with our placing just outside the top six. During the season I asked for more commitment from all players. I am pleased to say I believe I received that commitment.

With most players indicating they will return for the coming season, with better luck on the injury front, and a little more consistency with the bat, 2nd grade may will hold the Albert Cup after the 2007-2008 competition. Mark Grant Captain

We certainly missed him when injured. A major feature of his bowling is his ability to bowl to the field set for him, especially when opening the bowling. Clint played just over half a season with us, due to injuries. As a new ball spearhead, Clint took his 26 wickets at under 16, fantastic. The legendary rugby league coach Jack Gibson once said, "Winning a match means you are only a champion for a week!" So with only three wins, we had to make the most of our victories.

In evaluating the season, it is easy to become too absorbed in statistics and figures, when it is individual and team accomplishments and improvements that should be the main focus. Cricket does lend itself more than most sports to statistics, however, if we become too consumed, we can lose sight of the primary benefits that result from playing our great game. The dedication, discipline and teamwork required in cricket, not only assists players on the field but they are vital qualities for life in general.

Twenty five players represented Fourth Grade this season, with many given the opportunity to test their skills when higher grade players were unavailable for play, due to representative selection or injury. The experience gained by these players will benefit the club in the seasons ahead.

Momentum in sport is difficult to achieve and even harder to stop, and this season, despite promising episodes of play, the team wasn't able to build consistent pressure to dominate our opposition. Only on a few occasions did we achieve ascendancy where the team was able to experience that great feeling of being on top. Success comes from individual players preparing thoroughly, developing a positive attitude and playing as part of a team. There is only one way to improve and that is through plenty of sweat and hard work at training! I'm confident the players in Fourth Grade this season have the potential to succeed but they must be prepared to analyse their game and work at areas of weakness.

Batting was our strength, with four scores of over three hundred registered. We were dismissed nine times from sixteen innings, with all batsmen encouraged to spend longer at the crease. This was achieved by some players who placed a higher price on their wicket and displayed wiser shot selection. Cameron Dunn was one batsman who led the team in occupation of the crease.

Our most successful batsmen were Brad Christensen – 450 runs at 37 (1 century and 3 fifties), James Hopkins – 332 runs at 47 (1 century and 2 fifties), Cameron Dunn – 325 runs at 46 (1 century and 1 fifty) and Ryan Donovan 308 runs at 22.

There were a number of fine innings played by Mitch Baker, Josh Naidu, Dave Allsopp, John Byron, Ken Butcher, Trent Vella and Cameron Phelps this season. There was evidence of strong batting performances in the future, provided players continue their desire to learn from their mistakes and build on their strengths.

It was in the bowling department the team struggled as we only dismissed the opposition on three occasions from fourteen innings! All bowlers toiled hard but were unable to consistently apply the prolonged pressure.

Bowlers who performed creditably were John Byrom (17 wickets), Matthew Doab (14 wickets), Emil Koleczek (13 wickets) and Cameron Dunn (11 wickets). Our home wicket at Grahame Thomas Oval was an outstanding batting surface and the opposition proved to be able to bowl more effectively on it than we were. This needs to be addressed next season by our bowlers developing more variety in their deliveries and bowling a more consistent line and length in games.

Fielding was generally good and at times outstanding and much of the credit for this goes to Shane Duff and David Drew who ensured this vital part of the games was consistently practised throughout the season. Players who regularly set the standard in the field were Josh Naidu, Mitch Baker and Tim Burns. Ken Butcher performed well behind the stumps and was always full of enthusiasm and positive encouragement.

Playing our matches at Grahame Thomas enabled the Fourth and Second Grades to mix socially after matches and it was pleasing to see the support the two teams provided for each other during their respective breaks in play.

Warwick Starr has performed outstandingly in the preparation of the outfield and wicket and the high standard is regularly commented on by the opposition and umpires.

I would like to extend my thanks to the loyal supporters who assisted this season. Dave Baker acted as team manager, scorer, counsellor, baby sitter and dummy collector and his generous and friendly nature was appreciated by all.

Thanks also to the parents who supported and helped the team with afternoon teas, putting out covers and sight screens, scoring, organizing drinks and sweeping and marking the creases.



To Eris Dignam who for so many years has made sure the Bankstown machine keeps rolling along, my thanks for not only his tireless efforts but his friendship and perceptive, if not subtle observations and comments.

The coaching this season was most professionally performed and the club is indeed fortunate to have Shane Duff as the Head Coach. Shane organised training very well this season where he planned challenging and interesting drills and skills development activities. He was well supported by Ray Hall who brings a wealth of experience to the club, Steve Smith and David Drew who kept all players working hard with fielding routines. Nothing is ever a trouble for this great club man.

David Freedman has done a great job again as Chairman of Selectors and in conjunction with the team captains and Shane Cusick (roving selector) has ensured that all players are given every opportunity in selections.

Simon Keen (c)



STATISTICS UPDATE AND HIGHLIGHTS

During the season, the SCA ruled that runs scored and wickets taken in the Diamond Draft and Light Ice Limited Over competitions held between 1992/3 and 1999/2000 should be incorporated in club and association first grade records.

Previously, the club has ignored these performances in its records but has now incorporated the adjustments into this season's updates.

Highlights from this season's performances and the adjustments include...

Corey Richards

Has now scored 7001 first grade runs, including twenty centuries – two of which were doubles. He is now second behind Dion Bourne (8149) in the all-time history of the club for first grade runs scored.

Scott Thompson

<u>Ugandan Cricket Equipment 2nd Appeal</u>



In 2005/2006 Past President of BDCC Brian Freedman was managing the Under 19 cricket team, when it visited Bangladesh to play in the World Cup. Brian noticed that when the team for Uganda went in to bat they were transferring their cricket gear from one to another because there was not enough to go around.

Brian could recall how the Under 10s team in Australia used to do this well over 20 years ago. Brian spoke to the Manager for the team from Uganda and was told the per capita income for the country was approximately US\$200 per annum.

The young players just could not afford to buy cricket gear even when they travelled overseas to play in an international tournament.

Returning to Sydney, Brian garnered the support of club members and Bankstown Sports Club and co-ordinated a campaign to collect used gear. Those efforts resulted in the largest ever single donation of its kind being shipped to the Uganda Cricket Association (UCA.) As well as very positive response to the shipment from the UCA we received numerous testimonials from expat Australians working for non-government organizations in Uganda. The common theme of these testimonials was that the recycled gear had a wonderful effect on young kids as it enabled them to participate in a team sport that helped build their self esteem. Life member John Bull visited Uganda as part of a work related trip and he got to see the equipment being used and also reported favourably on the value it provided for the local kids.

So when the 2006/07 season rolled around with all the hype surrounding the Ashes Series we thought it was an appropriate time to embark on a second drive.

What began in January as a one month appeal to collect unwanted or old cricket gear to be sent to the Uganda Cricket Association has turned into a six month project as more and more gear was pledged. The response has been overwhelming. Pledges have been made from as far as Brisbane, Broome and we even had a call from a team in England wanting to donate equipment!"

During the appeal Brian Freedman has travelled over Sydney and as far as the Central Coast to collect pledges from schools, individuals and sport equipment manufacturers.

All goods collected are scheduled to be sent to the Uganda Cricket Association for distribution amongst schools and junior teams in the region. Without donations from such appeals the children are forced to play cricket with handmade equipment.

Over 20,000 children play cricket in Uganda and with an average yearly income per capita still very low, buying the new cricket equipment isn't an option. For these kids cricket is one way to forget the hardships they face each day.

The campaign would not have been as successful without the continued support from the community and Bankstown Sports Club.

Cricket Masala <u>Africa and Sri Lanka Lions victorious</u>



Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan and Offstick Productions presented the second Commonwealth Bank Cricket Masala over the weekend of April 14-15 in perfect weather at Memorial and Grahame Thomas Ovals in Bankstown. The event featured international food and entertainment and a 2 day 6-A-Side cricket festival featuring the best community cricketers and SpeedBlitz Blues imports. On the Sunday in a suspenseful rain-delayed final, Team Africa took out the Mini World Cup with a win over the fancied Bradman Foundation by 16 runs. In the Saturday community competition, the giant killing Sri Lanka Lions defeated the highly fancied NSW Tamils team in a closely contested final and securing the wildcard qualifying spot in the Sunday tournament.

The victorious African team captained by Kevin Pillay, included Speedblitz Blue Murray Creed, current Zimbabwe player Vusi Sibanda, ex Zimbabwe fast bowler Eddo Brandes, Parramatta's Neshen Munusamy, South Sydney's Shane Pargeter and Campbelltown's Ardil Domingo. Sibanda, who recently returned from national duty in the World Cup in the West Indies, scored 30 runs off an over in the semi finals against Pakistan including 4 towering sixes. He was thrilled with the win "I was so disappointed that Zimbabwe did not make the super 8's of the World Cup, but Africa's win today has brought a big smile to my face". Over 4000 people attended the festival over 2 days which featured a total of 149 sixes, over 30 lost balls and one smashed windscreen courtesy of a massive six by Pakistan's Usman Khawaja.

In the Sunday Mini World Cup, Bangladesh captain Naiian Yazdani won the bowler of the tournament with 5 wickets for 26 runs. Nick Watkins from the Bradman Foundation was awarded player of the tournament and also cleaned up the best batsman and Concorde VFR high flying 6's trip to India award with 11 sixes in total. Watkins who is Australia's premier deaf cricketer was thrilled to be part of the day "What a great concept and a positive day. The cricket was of the highest standard and my Bradman Foundation team mates were great to play with. A big thankyou to the organisers for their originality and we look forward to next year".

In the Community Competition, Bankstown Sports Club was knocked out in the qualifiers of the Saturday tournament and will no doubt learn from the experience. Sri Lanka Lions cleaned up the awards with Player of the Tournament going to Kasun Bulathsinghala, best bowler to Vinayak Sasitharan and best batsman going to Pradeep Vidanapathirana with 115 runs. Pradeep also tied the Most 6's award with Afghanistan's Aziz Naibkhil and Pakistan Sports Club's Aamir Abbasi with 6 each. The NSW Breakers womens team did not win any matches against the men but won the spectators hearts with their valiant efforts and Cricket Masala remains the only integrated tournament in Australia. Lisa Sthalekar, the Australian women's vice captain enjoyed herself "It's a beautiful day and great to see everybody come together at the end of the season" Lisa's Indian team performed credibly but did not make it through to the next round.

Gambhir Watts, Event Manager was satisfied with the day and observed; "The cricket was unbelievable and I was amazed by some of the Crowd catches including the winner Sadan and Karmakonde who won a trip to the Gold Coast for 2 for the first crowd catch after 1pm. Thanks to all of our sponsors for their support and we will be back next year with more innovations". India had a strong team with skipper Lisa Sthalekar and former Indian Test cricketer Subroto Banerjee but were again disappointed, winning only one of the three matches and failed to qualify for the semi-final.

Led by Usman Khawaja, Pakistan made a strong bid to enter the final, but they lost to Africa in the semis after a titanic struggle. Africa scored 3-86, the highest team total for the day and an amazing total off just 5 overs. The current Zimbabwean Test cricketer Vusi Sibanda who had earlier scintillated in the 2007 World Cup scored an astounding 30 runs in an over including four sixes. Pakistan bravely replied with 1-73, with Usman smacking sixes all over the Steve & Mark Waugh Stand, smashing a car windscreen in the process! Thus 159 runs were rattled up in 10 overs, an exhilarating run-rate of 16 runs an over!

The final was reduced to 3 overs per team because of rain. Africa made 1-45 and beat Bradman Foundation's reply (2-32). The talented Zimbabwean star Vusi Sibanda who represented champion team Africa was the most popular cricketer in the Competition. "I was so disappointed that Zimbabwe did not make it to Super 8 in the 2007 World Cup in the West Indies. But today has brought a big smile to my face."

Nick Watkins of the Bradman Foundation who scooped awards for being the best batsman and was voted the most valuable player of the Championship. He also top scored with an individual score of 48. Nick and his twin brother Andrew play for Parramatta in first grade and along with Bradman Foundation teammate are 3 of Australia's premier deaf cricketers having represented on a number of occasions. Nick also won the Concorde VFR high flying trip to India for hitting most sixes, 11 in one day.

The Sydney Morning Herald of April 14 previewed Cricket Masala by titling the story: Cricket spiked with masala, and a staid game gets sixier. And "sixier" it did get with 78 sixes skied on 14th and 71 on 15th April. Many of them were huge hits, going over the Stadium and crashing down with a bang. Thirty balls were lost as towering sixes followed each other in rapid succession.

Dignitaries in attendance included former Australian test cricketers Alan Davidson and Lenny Pascoe, Cricket NSW CEO David Gilbert, Consul General of India Hon. Sujan Chinoy, Mayor of Bankstown Ms Tanya Mihailuk and Hon. Darryl Melham, Federal MP for Banks who was present on both days. Mr Melham commented "What a fantastic event and what joy you have brought to a lot of families".

Rina Hore, Director of the Bradman Foundation and Cricket NSW, and John Faulkner director of the LBW Trust, were amongst a ray of other dignitaries who graced the event over two days. Ms Lisa Cartwright, General International Manager. Customer Services, Commonwealth Bank graced the occasion with her day long stay and led the prize distribution ceremony in the late evening on Sunday. The running commentaries and comedy by MC's Paran Nadeswaran, 19 and Rajith Raghavan informed and entertained as they interviewed cricketers, dancers and VIPs with a touch of Test class and humour, ably assisted by Deepthi Raghavan and DJ Neil. Cricket editor Kersi Meher Homji and Patrick Skene contributed rich editorial for the Match Program designed by Prem Gangadharan and Utkarsh Doshi. In original articles Kersi highlighted the world class strength of the NSW representative team Speedblitz Blues, and cast light on performances of our talented female cricketers.

Divya Raghavan managed operations for the event with Utkarsh Doshi, who led a team of Bhavan volunteers and special thanks to Marty Klumpp, Brian Freedman and Eris Dignam of Bankstown Sports for their support. Rajesh Katakdhond assisted with luncheons, and we are grateful for his efforts and those of all other volunteers who helped with the event. Our special thanks to Tournament Director Sutha Siva and his team from NSW Tamils who ran 42 games played over two days at two venues with pinpoint punctuality and kept immaculate statistics.

LuckyspectatorSadanandKarmatokonde won a trip to Gold Coast for two for taking the first crowd catch. Shamima Begum of Lakemba won the door prize consisting of trip for two to India including airfare five nights' stay in Delhi, Agra, Jaipur and ground transportation with the courtesy of India Tourism Sydney, Malaysian Airlines and Taj Hotel Resorts and Palaces.

Senior Cricket Journalist Alex Brown wrote in the Sydney Morning Herald on April 21, 2007. "The important administrative lessons to be taken from Cricket Masala were not from the games being played. Those are the domain of players and coaches. Rather, the moral of this story is how organisers driven by passion, as opposed to profit, can inspire the masses with an event authentic, fun, and without the unmistakable scent of Dettol. Informal, spontaneous. Fans treated as fans, not commodities. Boundaries lined with cooks from local curry houses, dishing up baltis hotter than a Greg Chappell effigy. Singers belting out tunes in English and Hindi (think Brett Lee in his post-Six & Out phase, but better). Between the singing of the crowd and the singeing of the balti, the carnival at Bankstown Oval was by far and away my cricketing highlight of the past few months."
