I have pleasure in presenting the Fifty Eighth Annual Report and Financial Statement.

Following the retirement of club stalwarts and former first class players, Corey Richards, Scott Thompson and David Freedman, season 2008-09 was always going to be about re-building and consolidation.

So, it is with great pleasure that I can report that we finished fifth in the Club Championship, won the prestigious Poidevin-Gray Shield after a 'drought' of 19 years, and that our gutsy first grade side was defeated in a tightly-fought semi-final by Premiers St George — having qualified for the finals series as tearaway winners of the Minor Premiership in both the two-day and one-day competitions.

Congratulations to our 'Cricket Operations Committee' – headed by Geoff Spotswood, Mark Grant and Chris Gane – for the strategic and practical planning that underpinned our on-field results.

Jerry Cassell walked through the gate via Brisbane and London on Corey Richards' recommendation and asked "any chance of a game?" A handy 805 runs at 50 average later we were indeed very lucky to have such a class player join the squad.

Danny Waugh will be stepping down as first grade captain next season due to increasing work and family commitments. What a gem of a bloke — and a huge cricket talent to boot. Let's hope Danny can find time to stay actively involved as we desperately need his experience, talent and personal style.

The redoubtable Dean Magee again let his bat do the talking with 626 runs at 52 average in second Grade. To say Deano has a competitive nature is an understatement — so this rebuilding phase is tough for him. His passion for the game and his club is a huge asset.

Daniel Moy and Brad Christensen have announced that they won't be able to captain third grade and fourth grade respectively next season. To have progressed from playing cricket in the Bankstown Junior Association as ten year olds, to becoming fully fledged grade players and finally to have captained a grade side is a fantastic effort and Daniel and Brad should be very proud of their achievements.

In fourth grade, Ryan Donovan was in great form with the bat averaging 63 while in fifths Luke De Celis showed he has a bright future taking 35 wickets at 15 average.

Ray Hall, Rob Shaw and David Clifton formed a cohesive coaching and management team for our AW Green Shield campaign and the players responded with solid performances. Jake Cormack led the statistics with 182 runs at 60 average and he is clearly an exciting prospect.

And so to the victorious Poidevin-Gray Shield side. The Lance Keen-managed and Simon Keen-led side proved the adage that a champion team will always rise above a team of champions, as every player in the squad, at some point, made a significant contribution towards the premiership.

Anthony Sams showed his class, winning the Shane Lee Medal as 'Player of the Final' and scoring 362 runs at 51 average throughout the series. Daniel Burns should also share the plaudits for his efforts as co-skipper and snaring 12 wickets at 17 average.

Off the field the club continued to provide support to the Bankstown Sports Women's Cricket Club. This Club has emerged as the leading women's club in the state, and probably the country, winning successive club championships and first grade premierships. Add the Brewer Shield title last season and you start to get some idea of the quality of the club's performances.

All credit to President Rob Smith who carries a workload that rivals the best efforts I've seen from cricket administrators in my twenty-odd years on this side of the cricket fence! Also to Rob and Robyn Mack — you are just fantastic at fostering our emerging talent.

The Women's Club also has the services of two fantastic long serving senior members, Sharon Millanta and Belinda Allard. Clubs don't thrive unless they have senior players like Belinda and



"An outstanding community citizen making a valuable contribution to Bankstown, our partners, people and sport"



The major projects this year have been...

Breast Cancer

For the fifth consecutive year, our wonderful ladies group again conducted their fundraising Fashion Night where they raised just on \$2000. It was decided that this money again be directed to the fight against Breast Cancer, the insidious disease that has so affected our club and specifically towards an awareness campaign for senior schoolgirls conducted by Jill Allsopp.

Like many in the cricket and wider community, the club was saddened at the passing of Jane McGrath and made a significant donation in her memory to the McGrath Foundation. All players were issued with pink bat grips in support of Breast Cancer awareness and we congratulate them for their unanimous acceptance of this initiative.



FATHER CHRIS RILEY'S ACEH (INDONESIA) ORPHANAGE

Tony Stewart MP, the State Member for Bankstown and long time supporter of the club has for many years aided Fr. Riley in his outstanding humanitarian endeavours.

In March, when the two gentlemen traveled to Aceh in north-western Indonesia, an area decimated by the tsunami, to open an orphanage Fr. Riley had built for survivors, they took with them two full Kanga cricket kits which the club donated.

We have received independent reports that the kits have been a great hit with the children who are really enjoying their cricket.

UGANDA CRICKET ASSOCIATION

In 2004 we became aware of the great work being done in Uganda to develop cricket in the most difficult circumstances

With a population of just over 30 million, where in excess of 80 per cent live in poverty and the average annual per capita income is just over \$US200, Uganda had approximately 20,000 youngsters playing cricket, predominately with hand-crafted (home-made) gear.

We conducted a campaign to collect used and unwanted cricket equipment in 2005 and were able to ship a container load to the Uganda Cricket Association to be distributed amongst schools and clubs

We assumed that this would be a one-off occasion. However, the response from Uganda was so positive, it was decided that we would conduct a second campaign which was launched at the 2007 Ashes Test. With wonderful support from clubs, schools, manufacturers and individuals, we were again able to fill and ship a container.









We again assumed this would be the end of the project, however donations of equipment continued to roll in as the awareness spread and we have recently shipped a third container which will arrive in Uganda and be distributed prior to their new season commencing in September 2009.

Each container has included approximately 250 bats, 400 pairs of batting pads, 350 pairs of batting gloves, 90 pairs of wicket keeping gloves, 100 helmets as well as protectors, thigh pads, stumps, balls etc. In the most recent container, we were able to include a huge amount of cricket clothing including over 2000 shirts, most of which are new.

Also included in this container was approximately 2000 books, kindly donated by Keith Ainsworth Pty. Ltd., and which we have organised to be distributed to schools, along with a carton of much-needed surgical equipment donated by Ron Wright of Parramatta DCC which is going directly to hospitals.

Getting a container to landlocked Uganda is not easy and is very expensive. After leaving Sydney, it is trans-shipped in Singapore to Mombassa, Kenya where it is unloaded and transported by train to Kampala in Uganda. We remain most grateful to our outstanding sponsor, Bankstown Sports Club - which has met the \$8000 shipping cost on each occasion and without whose support this project could not have happened.




Our Club believes that providing ongoing financial support to the BDCA is a high priority.



I would like to acknowledge the outstanding performance of our Poidevin-Gray Shield team in their premiership win. The team was well led by captains Simon Keen and Daniel Burns whilst Lance Keen provided strong support as manager.

The club is indebted to Danny Waugh and his first grade team on their excellent season where they were the pace setters throughout the season.

The fifth grade team this season was very young and inexperienced but the potential on show promises a bright and successful future for the club. It was a privilege to journey with these young players this season and to experience their development first hand.

The team gelled well as a unit and enjoyed the experience of grade cricket — for many players this was their first season in grade. Grade cricket can be soul destroying at times when runs and wickets are hard to come by and disappointments can often outnumber the successes. It is a test of a players' character and requires resilience and a desire to keep persevering and working at your game. Life is full of challenges and it's how you deal and learn from them that defines if you've been successful.

The record will show that the team won five of its fifteen games but closer scrutiny tells a different story.

Five losses were very close run things – with only a couple of wickets or a few runs the margin. Against eventual premiers Campbelltown-Camden, the game went down to the wire and only an excellent innings from their captain decided the outcome in their favour.

The strength of the team was the bowling with Luke De Celis taking 35 wickets at 15.9, Daniel Elliott 21 wickets



at 15.2 and Ryan Caffrey 20 wickets at 16. Luke consistently bowled the team into a winning position and his 8/44 effort against an experienced Sydney University team was most memorable.

Daniel was our strike force until he was deservedly promoted and Ryan was dangerous with the new ball and improved as the season progressed. Matthew Doab, until unfortunately injured, performed solidly with the ball with 18 wickets at 16.9 as did Jake Cormack with 15 wickets at 22.9 and Geoff Robson with his off-spinners.

The batting was a disappointment with wickets falling regularly which made it difficult to gain momentum and build partnerships. The team scored over 200 runs on only three occasions during the season. No batsman scored over 250 runs and this is an area to focus on next season. There were some excellent individual performances with the bat, but a lack of supporting efforts generally resulted in these efforts being shining lights in mediocre team totals.

Matthew Doab played well early in the season, contributing significantly to

three of the team's wins with innings of 53 not out against Penrith, 42 against UNSW and 79 against North Sydney. Other fine performances were recorded by Jake Cormack 41 and 57, Mitch Baker 129 not out, Curtis Leman 41 and 76, Ken Butcher 52, Ryan Donovan 59, Josh Hilder 63 and Mark Morley 53.

The fielding was solid and at times outstanding, with Mark Morley setting a high standard behind the stumps. Mark is to be congratulated on taking the most dismissals in the competition with 25 which included 12 catches and 13 stumpings. Best performed in the field were Geoff Robson, Jake Cormack, Michael Chalita, Ryan Caffrey and Dean Picklum.

The team was well supported by a hardy group of supporters who were there each week to help create a positive team environment. Special thanks go to Mitch Morley who scored for most of the season. My gratitude is also extended to Shane Cormack, Ross and Lisa De Celis, Wally Challita, Angela Morley, Paul and Julia Robson, David and Kay Elliott for their loyal support.




Geoff Spotswood.

AW Green Shield Report and Player Profiles

Ray Hall

Congratulations to North Sydney on winning the AW Green Shield for the first time, defeating Blacktown on run rate.

While we finished in equal 9th (same as last year), this position genuinely belies the successes of the season. This was the first season for the coaching team after taking over the reins from the highly-successful lan Gill, so it was all new to nearly everyone - except the four grade players from last season. Thank you to the parents of the players — we had some superb afternoon teas. Thank you to Rob Shaw and David Clifton who provided invaluable assistance during the season as Assistant Coach and Manager, respectively.

It truly was a season of what might have been...

- we beat the team (North Sydney) that won the final – thrashing them by 90 runs – which was their one and only loss of the season (including the final);
- we lost to the team that finished the rounds undefeated and equal first, with us needing 1 wicket for victory in the 57th over (Fairfield/Liverpool);
- we beat last year's finalists (St. George);
- we lost the last game by 1 run (Mosman);
- we lost to the team that finished 6th by 12 runs (Manly);
- there was only one game where we didn't bat past 56 overs (that game had reduced overs, the other five we batted at least into the 58th over) and that was the only game we got thoroughly beaten (Campbelltown – who continue to cause us problems in Greenies); and,
- we beat the team that finished 7th (Wests). That particular game was why cricket can be such an exciting spectacle and was finished off by two of our youngest players (Jake Cormack and Daniel Solway), who got us home on the last ball of the game. Outstanding effort.



It's very important to note that had we won those three very close games, we would have finished in the top three, with six wins from seven.

There are a number of reasons which could be attributed to the losses, and that is for the coaching staff to consider, then train both existing and future players and hopefully improve on performances next season. In most games, our top order batting let us down by simply not getting enough good starts (almost regardless of the order or the personnel). Our 'tail enders' typically got the bulk of the runs - we were often 7 for 100 at the half-way mark. Only three batsmen scored over 50 runs in any game... Jarrad Woods 64, Mark Morley 59 and Jake Cormack 58no. Overall, our batting simply wasn't good enough.

On the other hand, our bowling, especially our three main pace bowlers (Daniel Sams, Dean Bush and Josh Hilder) was very, very good - taking 35 wickets between them, and beating the bat very frequently. Our four spinners (Matthew Clifton, Jake Cormack, Luke De Celis and Geoff Robson), who had taken 49 grade wickets between them prior to Green Shield (in 3rd, 4th and 5th grades), didn't have the penetration we were hoping for, nor did they fire together on the same day — taking just 18 wickets between them all.

Our fielding was usually outstanding - we rarely dropped catches, took most run outs when we had the chance – either with direct hits or long throws into the gloves – and saved a lot of runs in the outfield with committed attempts at stopping the ball. Some players were simply brilliant in the field, while others do need to lift a bit - more work at training under pressure situations as well as an increase in general fitness will help this.

There was fantastic camaraderie in the team and their parents, which was demonstrated in many small ways throughout the season, culminating in an excellent after-season barbecue – for which Wal Challita and Jim Woods must be thanked again publicly for their outstanding hospitality.

As an aside, congratulations to four of our AW Green Shield players who were invited to try out for NSW U17 City side, based on both Green Shield and Grade performances (Sams, Bush, Clifton and Cormack).

AW GREEN SHIELD PLAYER PROFILES

Dean Bush - captain

Dean, along with Josh Hilder, led the team well, and took on the responsibility that goes with the position. Dean picked up wickets regularly and finished up as our top wicket-taker with 13 — which included an outstanding bowling performance against Fairfield-Liverpool with 6/28. Dean probably didn't perform as well as was hoped for with the bat, although he provided some stability in the middle order.

Josh Hilder - co-captain

Josh responded well to the responsibility handed him, and in doing so, demonstrated future captain potential. Josh generally bowled extremely well, taking 4/26 against Mosman and 3/33 against Wests. Josh came into the batting line up as an opener with a lot of expectation after his previous performances with the willow, but by his own admission, just couldn't get going at all. With a top score of 23, it simply wasn't a true indication of Josh's batting ability.

Michael Challita

Michael was one of the younger players in the squad and showed promise with the bat, with a high score of 34 against Fairfield. With maturity and concentration, Michael will convert his good starts into big scores. Has a big future as a middle order batsman. His slips work is also very good, and is something to keep working on.

Matthew Clifton

As one of the four senior players in the squad, Matt's Green Shield season was well below expectations with both the bat and the ball (in contrast to his bowling in grade). As opener, Matthew had a top score of 27no against St George and a best bowling of 2/32 against Wests. However, his fielding was usually outstanding and often set the standard for the team.

Jake Cormack

Jake was one of the younger players in the team and had an excellent season and was the stand-out performer. He showed maturity beyond his years with the bat – despite batting well down the order – and was our leading run-getter with 182 runs at an excellent average of 60.67 (the only player to average over 30). Jake also performed with the ball, taking 8 wickets at 16.50.

Luke De Celis

Luke also had a lean Green Shield season with the ball, which belies the fact he was the top wicket-taker in the entire club during the main season! While he didn't bat, his outfield throws were excellent. His 4/16 against Campbelltown was one of the few highlights of the day!

Aaron Ford

Aaron had a Green Shield season below his own expectations after some good early performances in the trials. More intense turf-based training will help Aaron develop his batting further.

Matthew Greaty

Matt showed signs of being a very good top-order batsmen after a great 44 against North Sydney and a few other solid performances. Batting at 3 or 4, he was often out in the middle a lot earlier than he should have been.

Matthew Lozinski

Matt was the "Bullpup" of the squad (only just) — at just 12 years of age — but showed outstanding commitment at training sessions and all games. He showed what is meant by the "Bulldog Spirit" and was rewarded with game time against Mosman.

Mark Morley

Mark had a very good first season in Green Shield, with a top score of 59 against North Sydney in a display of solid shots along with some of Mark's now-trademark flair. Mark also kept wicket extremely well, finishing 3rd overall in the Green Shield 'keepers with 10 catches and 6 stumpings. His on-field assistance to the captains was well-directed and displayed good cricket knowledge.

Geoff Robson

Geoff also had a lean Green Shield season with the ball, and just found it hard to really penetrate with his off-spin. Geoff batted solidly, earning a welldeserved 26 against Fairfield-Liverpool.

Daniel Sams

One of our most senior players, Daniel opened the bowling and beat the bat more times than runs were scored off him – with an economy rate of 2.18. With 4/23 against St George and 3/22 against Manly, Daniel was always looking for, and very nearly getting, wickets. Daniel's batting didn't really show what he is capable of, but a well-earned 38 not out against St George and 29 against Manly showed some of the ability we know he has.

Daniel Solway

Daniel is another of the young-guns on the way through, and his match-winning performance with Jake against Wests showed he really has what it takes to succeed – mental toughness. With very limited opportunities this season, Daniel will continue to progress his batting and in keeping with the training, effort and commitment he puts in, will do very well.

Jarrad Woods

Jarrad was hoping to do well with bat and ball, after showing plenty of bowling venom early in trials. However, it was the willow that did the talking, with a top score of 64 against Wests, along with 47 against Mosman and 32 versus St George. Jarrad has the strength and ability to really hit the ball hard, and with more turf exposure, should develop into an excellent batsman.


