president's report



A successful year

Last summer was billed as the biggest opportunity we'd had in a number of years and it lived up to that promise on all measures.

Our men's and women's 1st grade sides winning both of their respective limited over competitions and premierships was record breaking and truly amazing. These results are a testament to the commitment of our playing group and dedicated coaches – congratulations to all!

Parents and friends loved the summer's cricket. We had an array of volunteers across all teams assisting off the field in high numbers with a common purpose; a great sense of community was evident.

Our sponsors remained by our side and were generous in their support. In particular the Bankstown Sports Club who has been with us for such a long time, continued to find new ways to integrate and support us and the wider community with professional guidance.

Facility development continued with the installation of new Memorial Oval perimeter fence and sightscreen. The much anticipated replacement and enhancement of the main oval playing surface and centre wicket has started and will be ready for the 2016/17 season. The removal of 90mm of the wicket square top surface, the installation of two additional wickets to the side of the square and the removal of the old practice wickets from the outfield area will produce an even better 1st class playing environment.

The Bankstown City Council remains a valued partner in these and other facility initiatives and I thank them for their enduring local support and commitment more broadly to the game of cricket.

Improvements to our clubs governance continued in the areas of Responsible Serving of Alcohol (RSA), Working with Children and the development and application of Code of Conduct statements for players, administrators, coaches and managers, and parents and guardians.

Bankstown cricket, which is working with more goodwill and unity than ever before, is keenly aware of the importance of ensuring our community of all backgrounds see themselves reflected in our favourite national sport. It is great to see so many cultural backgrounds united in their passion for the game of cricket and we welcome all at Bankstown.

Our pathway programme, the Pups academy and our support of women's cricket remain key strategic pillars for the development of our club. Pleasingly, a record number of players attended trials and our involvement and support of local cricket clubs and the Bankstown District Cricket Association (BDCA) is ongoing.

While our key performance indicators and statistics are encouraging, local cricket still has work to do to encourage more sustainable participation, to keep people, particularly volunteers in and around the game over time.

We will continue to invest in a "one team" approach across cricket administration to the benefit of our community. I believe cricket is already more united locally than any other major sport. Our united purpose will provide a compelling competitive advantage for cricket, our players, supporters and sponsors.

Off the field, I thank my colleagues from the management committee, the coaches and selectors, the hard-working volunteers and those throughout grassroots cricket for a collective effort that helped make 2015-16 an outstanding year.

sixty-fifth annual report



I have pleasure in presenting the Club's Sixty-Fifth Annual Report and Financial Statement.

Season 2015/16 saw the Club repay our sponsors and the community by winning the two most prestigious trophies in Australian Premier Cricket - The Belvidere Cup and The McDonalds Limited Overs Cup.

We owe a huge debt of gratitude to our sponsors: Bankstown Sports Club, Bankstown City Council and Bankstown City Credit Union for supporting our player development programs and day to day operations. We could not achieve this level of success without your support.

The results achieved by our first grade side were heavily influenced by the enthusiasm, dedication and expertise of our coaching team led by Head Coach Gary Crowfoot, capably supported by Dean Burke. We are indeed fortunate to have people of this calibre in our coaching ranks.

Ken Hall is a legend of the SCA and this Club and his presence as Team Manager and mentor is undoubtedly an inspiration to every player in the squad. Skipper Jarrad Burke continued to provide tactical nous and an ability to read the game that is without equal in the SCA. Jarrad's enthusiasm and outstanding personal performances with both bat and ball make him a huge asset for our Club.

Successful clubs are built on the principle of having good team captains and we were lucky to have a cohesive and dedicated group last season. Andrew Jamieson had a frustrating year with Second Grade but Jammo is as decent a bloke as you could find and he has a very positive influence on the Club through his mentoring of our younger players. Andrew O'Brien's Third Grade side ran hot and cold but no one could ever doubt Obe's passion for the Club or the positive impact he has on our younger players. Damien Loy answered Chairman of Selectors' Phil Kelly's call to step up and skipper Fourth Grade - a huge task for a 20 year old, but Damien's enthusiastic approach to the role, both on and off the field, was impeccable. Damien is a young clubman whose contribution should not be taken lightly. Mat Kelly is another player who put Club before self as he juggled family commitments and his position in the NSW Police Force while captaining Fifth Grade. Mat's exceptional personal form with bat and

ball resulted in him winning the 'Bankstown Sports Club Player of the Year Award' but just as importantly he made a positive contribution to developing the knowledge and skills of his young players' week in and week out.

Our Cricket Operations Sub-Committee drives the thinking and decision-making around coaching staff and team rosters and acts as a bridge between players, coaches, selectors and the Management Committee. Mark Grant continues to do a great job behind the scenes making sure our plans for retaining, attracting and developing players are well thought out and executed. In his Cricket Operations role, Mark works closely with our Chairman of Selectors Phil Kelly. A Clubman with a wealth of 1st grade and general administrative experience, Phil uses sound, consistent processes, statistics and effective consultation to underpin selections. His ability to develop good relationships with team captains is also an important string to his bow. Linsey Roworth also assists Mark and his common-sense approach to issues is a great asset.

Head Curator Warwick Starr approached the task of preparing wickets professionally and despite the difficulties of working with a very tired wicket square (25 years old) the overall feedback from representative and SCA sides was positive. I'm pleased to report that a new and expanded wicket square was laid at Memorial Oval in April 2016 and we are all looking forward to discover what characteristics Warwick will tease out of the new Oberon soil and Santa Ana couch turf.

We are lucky to have good people like Rob Smith, Gary Penman and Justin Newman leading the Bankstown Sports Women's Cricket Club. Women's First Grade continued their remarkable feats winning both the T20 and LO Premierhips (the latter for the eighth time in nine seasons). The addition of juvenile girls' teams playing under the Club's banner is an important step towards ensuring the Club has a new breed of players to carry on the task in years to come. Emma Newman is to be congratulated for her outstanding efforts in this area of the Club's operations.

Our Club would not exist without the efforts of a dedicated band of volunteers. Whether it is helping out with basic tasks such as laying and removing covers on match day, scoring matches, providing and hosting afternoon teas, each is an invaluable and necessary contribution towards maintaining and developing the Club. The efforts of our volunteers means our players are able to focus on their match-day preparation and not worry about off-field requirements.

Every volunteer's contribution is important but on behalf of all players and supporters I believe it's appropriate to make special mention of the following people:

our Uganda project turns a youthful 10!



The Uganda project celebrates its 10th birthday.

When this project was proposed ten years ago, the plan was to organise a one-off shipment only, never thinking for one moment that it would be still going stronger than ever a decade later.

A major reason for this continued success is that all three fundamental elements, collection, transport and distribution all working splendidly.

Our strategy to pick up donations makes it easy and convenient for the very generous public, clubs, associations, schools and companies who see fit to support the project as evidenced by the increased volume year by year.

The cost of shipping to land locked Uganda is very expensive, approximately \$10,000 for a 20 foot container and \$15,000 for a 40 foot container. The biggest of thanks go to the Bankstown Sports Club who have met the shipping cost of all ten containers. Put simply, this project could not happen without the support of the Sports club and we remain ever grateful.

Many schemes such as this fail because the goods fail to reach their projected end point because of the lack of organisation together with pilfering etc at the receiving end. It is gratifying to note that we have had none of these issues with the Uganda Cricket Association being fastidious in the recording and distribution of all the gear and clothing to clubs and schools throughout their country.

Having this gear available is a major reason they have been able to build their base to over 60,000 from about 10,000 when we started and we applaud the Ugandan Cricket Association for instigating a bottom-up rather than a top-down development strategy – which will make the game in Uganda much more sustainable in the long term.

As Steve Waugh says “anybody can make a difference”.

It would be great if a club in each of the other states would adopt another cricket-playing African country as we have in Uganda.

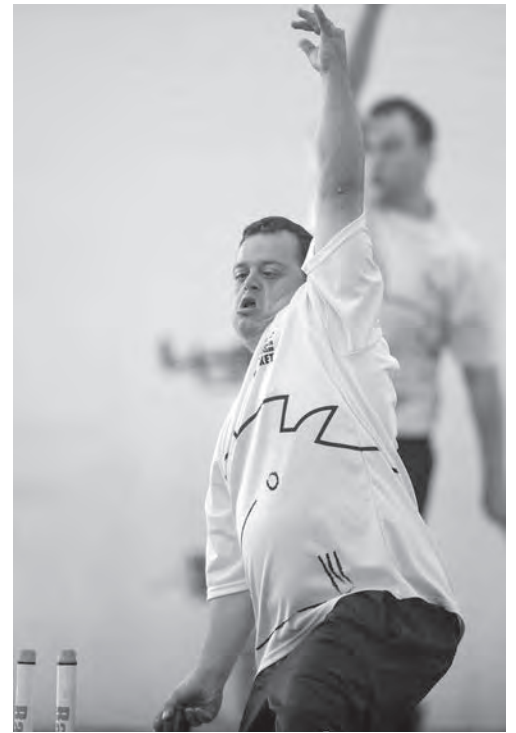

Well what a year! 2015/16 a season to remember! Bankstown Belvidere Cup and Limited Overs Premiers in the same season – truly an outstanding effort from a great team.

Sitting in the North Sydney change rooms last year after our second successive loss in the final I was wondering when the next time would be that we'd get the opportunity to hold up the prestigious Belvidere Cup, I knew we had a great team and had been the most consistent team in the last few years but I also knew how hard it was to get there as there are another 19 teams fighting for the same prize as us.

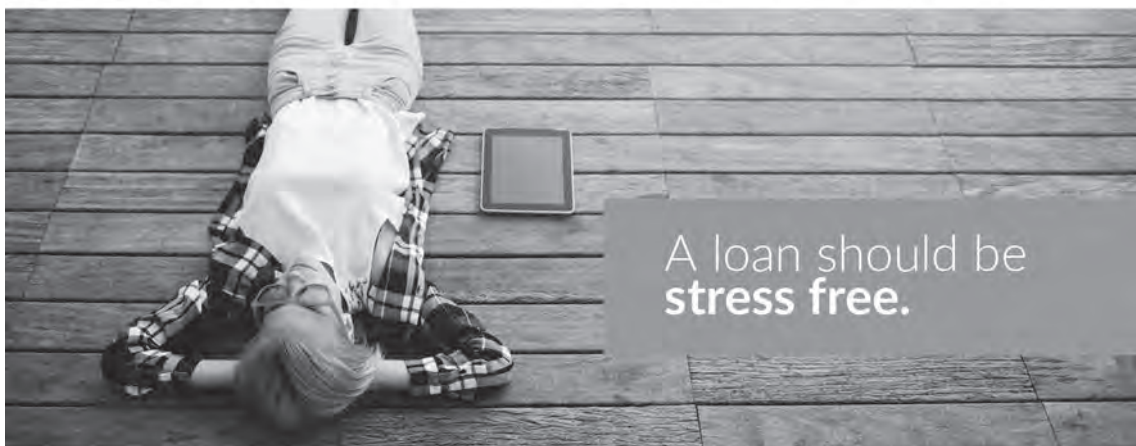



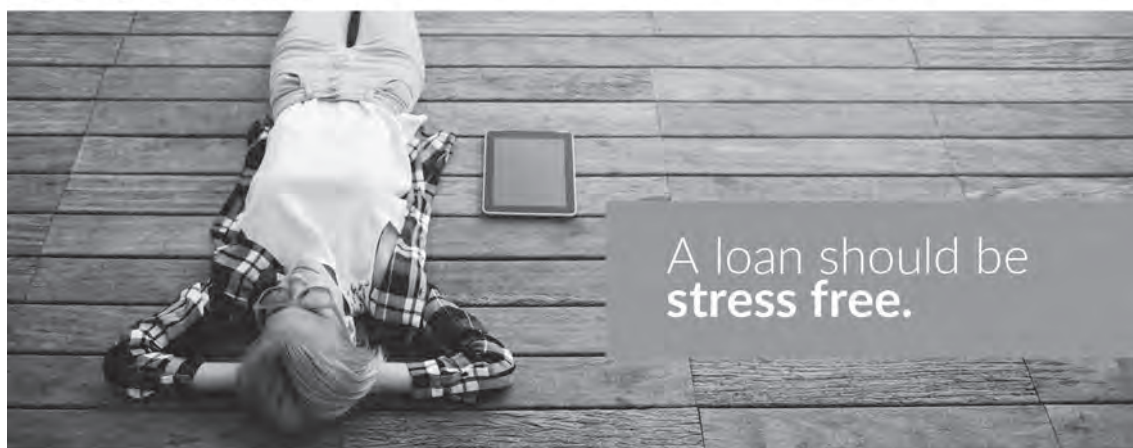
