president's report

A grade cricket club can only exist through the continued effort and dedication of many people both on and off the field. In 2010/11 we were again blessed to have many outstanding contributions.

On the field

We finished 6th in the club championship.

Pleasingly, our 5th grade team made the quarter final, our 3rd and 1st grade teams made it through to the semi-finals and our Green Shield team won the coveted competition for the second year in a row. They are a great group of boys who are very well coached and managed. There is no escaping hard work and these boys put in a huge amount of effort throughout the season both on and off the paddock. Winning the competition was a just reward for their dedication and teamwork.

Under the watchful eye of head coach David Drew, training was engaging and generally well attended. Individually, it was clear that a number of players improved with a solid off-season and a continuous effort over the summer, but for some players the year never really got started or the consistency dropped away at times.

Our results in the 'Spirit of Cricket' were less than satisfactory (finishing 15th). Some teams or players seem to play without incident, but others seem to attract unnecessary attention. I know this will be an area of some interest to the management committee as we approach

next season. We must do better in this important aspect of the game and I encourage all players and supporters to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and etiquette.

Off the field

The club's strategic plan continues to be implemented and in particular further progress was made toward our major facility redevelopment program. With the support of Federal and State governments, Bankstown City Council, Bankstown Sports Club and many other significant sponsors and supporters, the reality of an indoor sports facility is very close.

We were again the beneficiaries of great support from our sponsors, in particular Bankstown Sports Club – to whom we owe a substantial debt of gratitude.

The efficacious staging of the Women's Australia v England Test Match at Bankstown Oval was a highlight. Further, our support for junior cricket in the Bankstown district, our involvement in Women's cricket and our annual cricket equipment appeal in support of cricket in Uganda are all testament to the club's broader ability to manage cricket interests with a high degree of success.

I have pleasure in presenting the Sixtieth Annual Report and Financial Statement.

Season 2010/11 will be remembered for the wonderful back-to-back premierships by our AW Green Shield boys and the Club's creditable sixth in the Club Championship.

Less flattering was our fifteenth placing in the Spirit of Cricket rankings – an area we'd hoped to improve last season. Clearly we have more work to do in this regard.

James Allsopp should be applauded for the manner in which he led First Grade. The addition of some younger talent and new players to the club meant James had a real challenge trying to build a harmonious, disciplined and positive team culture, as well as deal with inherent imbalances in the sides underlying skill-sets. Hindsight is perfect sight – if we had our time again we would have ensured James had some extra support to help him deal with the challenges. The upside is that James learnt a lot from the experience of 2010/11 and we will reap the benefit of that in coming seasons.

Dean Burke was an enthusiastic skipper of Second Grade who was widely respected by his own players and opponents. Player's 'Player of the Year' award winner James Bourne stepped in to lead the side when Dean was injured and did an admirable job.

Darryn Bull's Third Grade made the final four but the side failed to 'click' in the pressure cooker that is semi-finals cricket. Darryn's contributions to the Club go way beyond his captaincy duties and we are lucky to have someone of his calibre and with his commitment in our ranks.

Steven Wise's Fourth Grade performed creditably, retaining a sniff of the qualifying finals until the final rounds. A loyal clubman, excellent leader and well performed lower grade player I hope Steven can continue his involvement at the Club for many years to come, in whatever capacity he can squeeze into his already busy life. He has the passion, the common sense and intelligence to make a huge contribution to our future.

Iain Ridley did a great job guiding the Fifth Grade to a place in the qualifying finals. This side showed on several occasions during the season that it had the raw talent to win the premiership. Iain's efforts on and off the field were of the highest calibre and I'm delighted he will be building on his results by leading the side next season.

Mat Doab again led the Metropolitan Cup side – arguably the most challenging on and off field role at the club. If there is a selection hiccup anywhere in the club it's poor Mat who ends up with the challenge of filling his side and does so with great efficiency. A very committed clubman

Mat is making a positive contribution to our future though his efforts developing our youngest players.

Lance Keen tried to mould a competitive side for the Poidevin Gray Shield (Under 21) but hindsight suggests we could have given Lance with more support than we did. We'll need to learn from this experience in planning our PG campaign next season.

It was a real thrill to have the AW Green shield win a second consecutive final. Skipper Luke Condron showed leadership skills beyond his years and the boys responded with outstanding personal and group performances, meeting every challenge the opposition or the environment threw at them. Great credit goes to Coach Ray Hall, Assistant Coach Rob Shaw, Manager and 'Jack of all trades' David Clifton for the skill and dedication they applied throughout the series. Iain Ridley and Mark Morley provided coaching and match-day warm-up support and Mark Condron never missed a beat as official scorer.

The Women's Club consolidated its position as the premier club side in Sydney Women's Cricket Association. Which in my opinion makes them the best in the world! Winning a fourth consecutive First Grade premiership is an awesome achievement but the real buzz comes from the fact that we have a highly talented group of young players who will hopefully ensure we maintain our competitive position for many years to come. The recent selection of Sharon Millanta in the Australian side is just reward for her dedication to the sport. A section on the Women's Club's season is included in this Annual Report for the first time.

Warwick Starr and his team continued to provide great facilities. Memorial Oval come in second in the 'First Grade Ground of the Year' with Grahame Thomas Oval winning the 'Lower Grade Ground of the Year' Award. The staging of the Australia versus England Women's Test Match was a resounding success with the ground receiving accolades from players and officials from both countries.

In June, the Club shipped its fourth container of cricket equipment to the Uganda Cricket Association. Matthew Clifton led a group of young kids who wore promotional 'sandwich boards' and handed out leaflets during the Sydney Test Match in January 2011 and this activity, combined with some great radio coverage courtesy of Jim Maxwell and Peter Roebuck, meant the response to the appeal was quite amazing. Along with cricket equipment and 700 cricket books donated by the Primary Club, the shipment also included schoolbooks and other materials to support general humanitarian projects in Uganda. There is no doubt this activity brings great kudos to the Club via an enhanced reputation within the cricket community and in both business and government circles.

I'm pleased to report that we are very hopeful to be finalising a grant of \$2.71m from the Australian Government to Bankstown Council that will see construction of a multi-purpose indoor sports centre and a media centre / clubroom at the southern end of Memorial Oval. All going well, we hope construction will commence late this year and the facilities will be operational for season 2012/13.

test cricket comes to bankstown oval

In January 2011, the club was honoured to accept an invitation from Cricket New South Wales and Cricket Australia to host the one-off Women's Test between Australia and the old foe England at Bankstown Memorial Oval.

A function on day one attracted numerous VIPs to the match including the Governor General Quentin Bryce, NSW Premier Kristina Keneally, Federal Minister for Sport Mark Arbib, Mayor of Bankstown, Cl. Tania Mihailuk, the CEOs of Cricket Australia and England and Wales Cricket Board, James Sutherland and David Collier (respectively) and senior management from Cricket Australia and Cricket New South Wales.

The catering for the function, as well as the players' and officials' requirements was carried out by the Events Department of Bankstown Sports Club and drew much praise as did the presentation of the ground and facilities.

England won the toss and elected to bat on a wicket described by both captains

as a "belter" and were restricted to a score of 207 despite a wonderfully controlled and undefeated innings of 107 by their legendary captain Charlotte Edwards – who was well supported by Jenny Gunn who scored a well compiled 33.

The spearhead of the Australian attack was the remarkable twenty year-old dual international (playing both cricket and soccer for Australia) Ellyse Perry who took 4/56 off 28 overs of blistering speed.

In reply, Australia could only manage 159 despite worthwhile contributions from Alyssa Healy with 37 and Jessica Cameron with 30.

In their second innings, England were looking very strong at 3/90 however a remarkable spell by Panania-born and raised Rene Farrell who took four wickets in five balls and only the second hat trick in the history of women's test cricket saw England bundled out for 149 and leaving Australia needing to score 198 in their second innings to regain the Ashes.

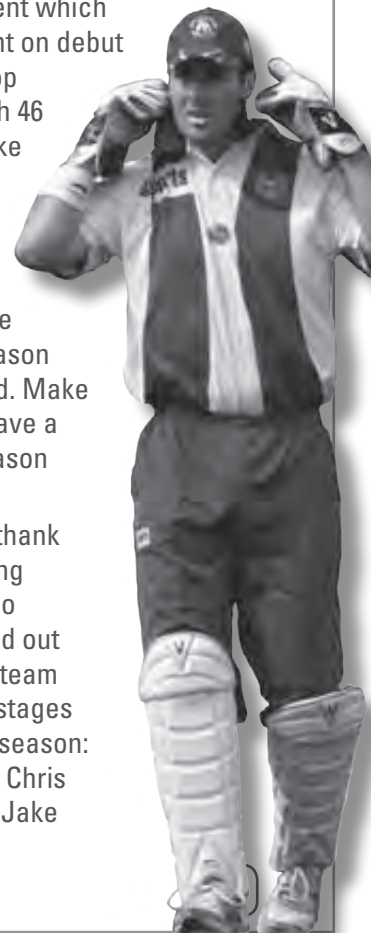
Brett Collison

Ben Smith

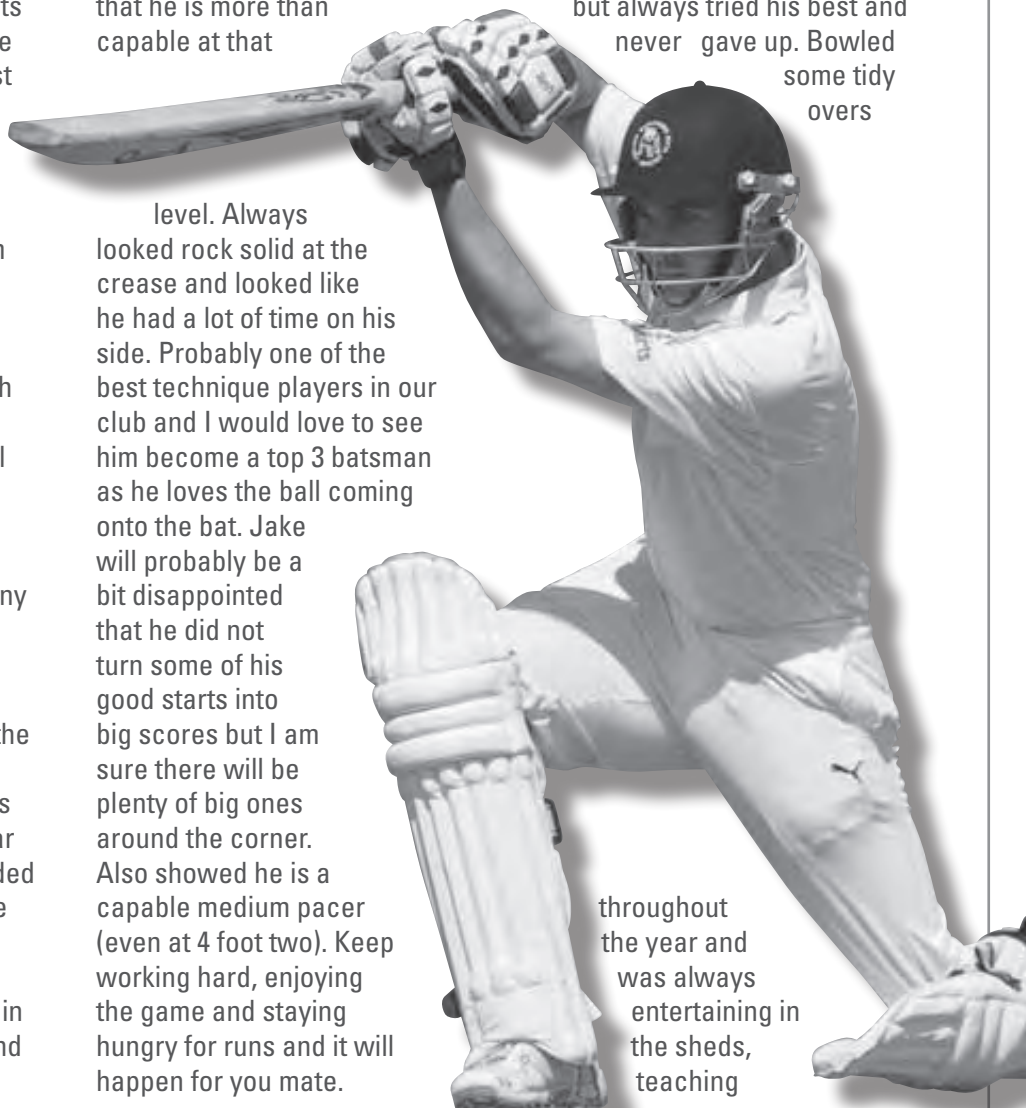

Congratulations to Sydney, who defeated Gordon to take the Reid Cup.

Losing only twice during the year and boasting an assortment of stars, they were always going to be hard to beat. I take pride in our closely fought round 10 battle with Sydney, more than holding our own against a vastly more experienced side.

Congratulations also go to our victorious Green shield team, winning for the second year running. Ray Hall richly deserves the result, having done an outstanding job as coach again. Such a strong performance is good news for the club as a whole, with many of the players already pushing their way up the grades.

Also for the second year in a row, 4th grade finished just out of a finals spot – this time 7 points shy of 6th. Despite a strong finish with 3 consecutive wins – including a comprehensive bonus point demolition of Easts in round 15 – our draw after the break proved too much of a challenge. Up against the experience of Sydney, North Sydney and finally Sydney Uni we went close, but not close enough to points. While these losses ended up sinking our finals charge, the side learnt a lot from watching former top-graders such as Mark Atkinson and Tim Harrington in action. Guys like

these remain very, very good 4th graders.

A major positive from the season was the performance of our bowling attack, which contained a mix of experience, youth and 'usually don't bowl in a game'. Matt Kelly anchored the attack with his new-ball swingers, often taking an early wicket or two. We also relied heavily on Matt Smith's offies, which were the best they've been in his career and Harry's Dean's often magical leggies. All three produced 5-wicket hauls and finished the season with more than 20 wickets each. Adding to this mix, the experience of Brendon Scott was invaluable in the last few rounds, as was the unearthing of Tristan Muir, whose pace and swing make him a genuine all-rounder. On this foundation guys like Evan Goodrick, Tharun Kaliyanda and even Josh Hilder showed that they have the talent to take wickets in 4th grade and I expect to see more of them next season.

The strengths our bowling were unfortunately not repeated with the bat. Inconsistent form throughout the club meant that few batsmen spent very long in one grade, making stability hard to come by. Frequent wet weather also meant that any form was fleeting and every run had to be hard fought.

Together, there were only two hundreds for 4th grade this season and few averages in excess of 30. However, there were certainly highlights. Michael Challita single-handedly defeated Sutherland with a flashing 139 n.o. while Dan Solway did most of the damage against Hawkesbury with his 87 n.o. Both finished in third grade, a fine season for two of our brightest youngsters. The cavalry arrived with a few rounds to go, with the return to form of James Hopkins (who found seeing a real benefit), Kieran Grey and Tristan Muir. Each was a class above 4th grade and I was very glad to have them visit.



Overall, we were again exposed by the swinging ball and often lost the mental battle against experienced campaigners. The lessons of last season, around the value of patience and concentration needed to be re-learned and will no doubt need to be reinforced again next season.

As for my captaincy, I was again the benefit of Mark Grant's seemingly bottomless experience and guidance. Not only did the veteran play a reassuring anchor role in our middle order (none better than his pressure cooker half century against Sydney) he was a constant support in every facet of the game.

I only fully realised how much I still have to learn from him on the occasions that I dared to bowl and he took the reins. His constant analysis, subtle tactical changes and ability to out-think batsmen will probably always be out of my reach.

In finishing off, I'd like to acknowledge the additional support 4th grade received throughout the season: Our parents were again a great

support. Due to many changes to the squad over the season, scoring duties were shared around, with appearances from Mitch Morley, Wayne Muir, Peter Goodrick and Mark Condron. It was also great to have Kev Hilder, Kerry Smith and Nick Dean as regular fixtures to help with drinks and afternoon tea. Nick just may be the new Eris we've been looking for. Also, thanks to Phil Kelly who was an inspiration to our bowlers, whenever his fitness allowed him to attend.

Many thanks to Nick Mamoulis, the tireless groundsman responsible for the top quality of Jensen each week. As is the case every year, it was the best ground we played on. Nick should take extra credit this year, maintaining a perfect strip despite disruptive dressing room renovations.

Eris, I say it every year, but none of us can do it without you mate. You took great care of me and my 4th graders for another season and we are very appreciative of it. If it was up to me, I'd be naming the new building in your honour – or maybe in Margaret's.

Thanks again also to Ray Hall for re-teaching me how to bat whenever I was at training. I can't give him enough credit for coaxing me through another season. A ten minute hit with him preceded every decent score I made.

Dean Magee did a fantastic job organising a Past vs Present game. If not for the weather, it would've been the best day of the season. Great initiative Deano.

3 wickets @ 19.33

Bakes looked good early in the season, responding well to a promotion to the opening position. A fast paced 50 in round 3, followed by 45 in the next round gave me the sense that he was looking at a bumper season. For mine his best performance was in round 10 against Sydney where he claimed 4 of the top 5 batsmen from the team that went on to win the comp. While his wrong-un still goes unpicked by the majority of opposition Harry is developing changes of pace and flight that make him an even better leg-spinner. His batting is highly under-rated, and hopefully the skipper will give him an opportunity up the order next season.

As one of our developing fast bowlers, Evan had a solid season which included some very valuable 4th grade experience. Difficult as it was, Evan was most needed for our tough encounters in rounds 10, 11 and 12. During that time he bowled to some ex-top graders and current 2nd graders, and learnt the hard way that bowling 5 great balls and one average one can often leave you with 0-4. I am convinced that these games will make him a better bowler next season. Evan should also continue to work at his batting, which is far better than he is given credit for. He fought hard in rear guard partnerships against Sydney and North Sydney – only succumbing against Norths after chasing a long-hop – and throwing away a hundred! With the HSC behind him, I expect that the coming season will see more of Evan's potential be realised.

Grant, Mark (14 games)

176 runs @ 29.33

Mark again anchored our batting line up, mostly batting at 6 or lower and coming to the crease all too often when we were in trouble. He continued



to impress a new generation of youngsters (unfamiliar with his run scoring records) with the high price he places on his wicket – and his still cracking cover drive. I especially enjoyed our fighting partnership against Sydney when we faced almost 300 balls between us for just 67 runs, in an attempt to wrestle the initiative back our way. These tough times stood in contrast to his breezy 36no against UNSW in even time, when for once the momentum was with us. Plant's value lies in his ability to teach by example and match his words with patience, concentration and ultimately runs. His contribution to our developing players is immeasurable.

**Gray, Kieran (5 games)
227 runs @ 56.75**

Kieran returned to 4th grade for the last few rounds after a lean season and showed some of his real ability. His 76 no against Manly in round 13 was the perfect opener's knock and the one he should be most proud of. Coming off 158 balls, it was an innings of concentration and endurance, battling the pressure of an experienced attack and the high temperatures. While he left the field with cramp and exhaustion, he had sealed a comprehensive win. Next round

he followed up with a flowing 75 against UNSW – proving that he has a big future as a specialist opener.

He is brilliant in the field and his seamers are underrated, as shown by his 4-wicket demolition of Hawkesbury. Next season I expect him to step up another level, dominating 4s (with bat and ball), and pushing for higher honours.

**Hopkins, James (8 games)

Joining us mid-season in waning form, Jimmy showed great fighting spirit and application against Hawkesbury and entertained in the 20/20 format next round. However, he did not break back to his best until after his new contact lenses were

fitted – and he was again able to see the ball! Brutal knocks of 57 and 87 against Sydney Uni and UNSW were a pleasure to watch, but were nothing compared to his last round annihilation of Easts, taking 48 from just 28 balls. Hoppa was a great man to have around the team and he will be missed next season, as he pursues his fortune in Europe.

MK added some much needed experience to our young bowling attack and I relied on him heavily to lead us with the new ball. Though the body was sometimes reluctant he was a workhorse for us, delivering over 150 overs for the season. For this he was rewarded with the most wickets, at the best average. His probing swingers often snared us an early wicket and against Sutherland he had dismissed 5 of the top 6 before tea. Batting in the middle order he also provided some crucial innings, seeing us home with 39no against Blacktown and getting us close against Sydney Uni with a 66-run partnership with Hilder. It was great to have Kell back with the Dogs this season and I hope he can do the job again in the next.

Labib again provided the safe hands behind the stumps that were so valuable last season. His ability to keep up to the stumps, to all of our bowlers, put the opposition under pressure and created wickets. He also was great for team morale, constantly chattering away to batsmen and team mates alike. Unfortunately he was not given many opportunities with the bat, coming in low in the order, or not getting a hit at all. However, we saw a glimpse of his best in round 15 where he relished a promotion to opener to blast an entertaining 34 at better than a run a ball. He has the technique and flair to contribute much more if given a regular higher order position.

**Muir, Tristan (4 games)

12 wickets @ 7

Tristan was a welcome addition to our batting line-up, returning from 3rd grade late in the season. He immediately rediscovered devastating form with a chanceless 75 against Sydney Uni – only robbed of three figures by a Ponting-like tickle down leg side to the keeper. The real strength of Tristan’s season was his bowling, which proved to be far too good for 4th grade. He finished with 12 wickets from just 4 starts, including a devastating 5-30 from 10 overs in round 15. His pace and control make him a real attacking bowler, often hitting pads and stumps. Tristan is a genuine all-rounder and should begin next season as such.

The secret to our success this season was the attacking brand of cricket we played, and playing with such a confidence, that there was always the feeling that there was a wicket just around the corner, or just 1 partnership would dig us out of the hole we were in, and true to form, we often did.

As we all know, when batting, partnerships are the key to success. This season we had 4 partnerships of 100+, highlighted by the opening stand of 223 by Ethan Leten and Daniel Solway in Round 5 vs Wests. This broke a 15-year-old record for the 1st wicket partnership in 5th Grade.

For two young men to show the patience and dedication they did was a pleasure to watch.

Individual highlights were never far apart this year, with a lot of players achieving, if not exceeding, their own expectations. This included 7 players scoring over 250 runs for the season, and 4 bowlers taking over 15 wickets. Ethan Leten was outstanding at the top of the order with 430 runs at an average of 47.79. Josh Hilder started the year with an unforgettable 209 versus Parramatta in Round 1. This broke Paul Crosson's previous mark of 207* made 16 years ago. It was no surprise to see Josh promoted through the grades not long after that innings.

Mitch Baker showed his class and experience when he returned to 5th grade halfway through the season and finished with 356 runs at an average of 39.56.

Other outstanding individual performances were made by Daniel Solway, Matthew Clifton and Geoff Robson.



Bowling honours were shared throughout the season, with seemingly a different bowler each week leading the ship. Tyson Sims, in his first season of grade cricket, led the way with 21 wickets at 22.00. For a young guy of his age, Tyson showed great control in the difficult art of leg spinning. In the spinning department, Geoff Robson showed his all round worth with 17 wickets. It was definitely an exciting opportunity to have spinners of this class bowling in tandem, and further emphasised the depth of quality young spinners we have at this club. Leading the attack from the front were our quicks Luke Condron (17 wickets), Daniel Elliott (15 wickets) and Tharun Kaliyanda (12 wickets). Having the higher grade experience of Daniel and Tharun in the side was invaluable, and both stood up and were counted when needed. The fielding was fairly good throughout, with our ground fielding being of the highest quality. Mark Morley lead the way behind the stumps with 24 dismissals. Matt Clifton, Mitch Baker, and Ethan Leten showed remarkable athleticism in the field, and set the standard week in, week out.

The team was extremely fortunate to have the support crew off the field that we did. Mentions need to go to Paul Robson, Mitch Morley, Mark Condron and David Clifton. The efforts that Paul put in this season really showed the true Bulldog spirit this club displays so proudly. Things such as turning up 2 hours prior to the scheduled start of home games, just to make sure the covers were off, the change rooms were cleared of gear, and the ground was ready to go, may have gone unnoticed by others, but it was a tremendous help to myself, and there aren't the words to display my gratitude. To Mitch Morley and Mark Condron, your efforts overseeing the scoring responsibilities on the laptop and entering the statistics onto MyCricket on your own time was very much appreciated. To Dave Clifton, your assistance off the field was second to none. I would like to thank David Drew for his tireless efforts as Head Coach, as well as his support staff of Ray Hall, John Bull and Phil Kelly. Having your experience and knowledge on hand for advice and assistance is a great asset to this club.

Many thanks must go to the entire selection panel, in particular to chairman Dion Bourne, and roving selector John Bull. Your advice and guidance in my first season as captain was invaluable, and I thank you for all your efforts. Credit must go to Warwick Starr and his crew for their outstanding efforts. Week in, week out, Grahame Thomas was in pristine condition, and it is no surprise that Grahame Thomas won the lower grade 'ground of the year' this year. A tremendous effort all round. As I said at the start, it was a privilege to captain 5th Grade this season. I see the role of 5th Grade captain as being a guide to the younger players coming through the system from Green Shield and preparing them for the strains of higher grade cricket. Teaching such things as discipline, patience and fight were my main goal at the start of this year. It was pleasing to see those traits coming through in all players throughout the year. To say I can't wait for next season is an understatement.

Winning one Green Shield is an honour. Winning two in a row and being undefeated is an outstanding achievement – one of which the club, the players, coaching staff and parents should be especially proud. The boys put in the hard work at the many gruelling training sessions that Ray conducted and they got the results they deserved.

They were simply the best-drilled and best-performed team in the competition and, as it turned out, by quite a long way. Former Australian Test cricketer and Penrith AW Green Shield coach, John Benaud, said the Bankstown boys were “simply a class above”.

When they performed to their best, they were unbeatable. When they didn't and some teams thought they had a chance, the boys dug deep and pulled out a stunning batting or bowling performance to finish off the opposition. For example, we were 5/65 against Fairfield-Liverpool and then the last 5 wickets added over 100 runs to get us to 169. We rolled them for 129 with 10 overs to spare with tight bowling and outstanding fielding. In fact, 12 run outs shared between 5 players shows the overall quality of the fielding – not to mention that Ethan got 8 of them!

There were other notable performances such as Daniel Solway scoring 50 plus in four games (with a top score

of 75), Ethan Leten's 106, Harry Dean's 98, Damien Mortimer's 92no and Michael Challita's 65 were the stand-out individual batting. However, it was often the smaller contributions of 10s and 20s in usually quick time, from middle and lower order players, that ensured we always had a total in the bank to defend or helped pass opposition totals with apparent ease.

The batting was matched by some sparkling individual performances as well, with Luke Condron tearing through Uni of NSW with 6 for 28, Harry spinning Parramatta out before afternoon tea with 5 for 17 and Damien demolishing Wests in the final with the amazing 5 for 3 off 6 overs. But this also belied the fact that every game, the bowlers were

tight and rarely went for runs – they bowled as a “pack on the hunt”. Most games they got 1, 2 or 3 wickets each – from good line and length with consistent, disciplined attack. Add to that the fielding pressure and most teams just couldn't get going at all.





We need to thank the club for supporting the team, the coaches and management and the parents. We especially need to thank Ray Hall who put on *many* extra training sessions – sometimes on or near public holidays – and always found time to get something extra out of a player.

Mark Condron did a superb job on the laptop scoring and ensuring Mycricket stats were in the system straight after the matches.

The parents truly deserve a very special thank you for their efforts...putting covers on and off – unless they were too heavy and preferred the easier Hessian Gang work over the Covers Gang...the Big E usually went AWOL about now only to surface back at the club. As well, parents ensured the boys were always at the grounds on time ready to go (usually - there was the odd dash home to get something left behind or a satnav “malfunction”).

Again, the afternoon teas at our home games were very special – great variety, quality and quantity – and were always commented upon very positively by the opposition and the umpires (who are also afternoon tea experts).

David Clifton, Rob Shaw, Iain Ridley and Mark Morley all contributed to the success of this team and worked with Ray to help get the best from the boys. Mark’s inspired bowling change suggestions – “bring on Jacko to this bloke” – always seemed to work (and Jackson nearly always got wickets in his first over!)

Rhys Williams

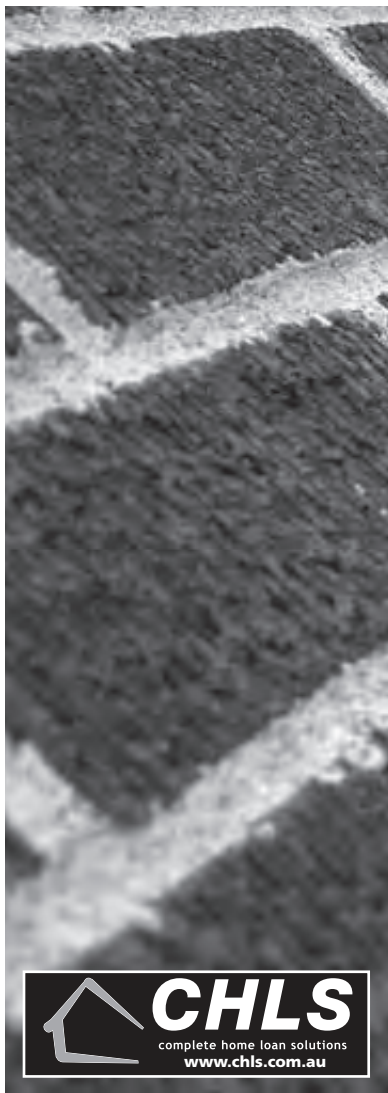

Time is nigh for a reinstated Johnson to fly: Walsh

WEST INDIES fast bowling legend Courtney Walsh says his expectations of Mitchell Johnson have not been met and the struggling Australian quick is facing a "critical" Test match.

"What I find difficult to understand is that when I first saw Mitchell Johnson bowl I was very very impressed. But since then I don't think his game has improved as much as I anticipated," Walsh said yesterday from Birchgrove Oval, where he visited the Sydney Cricket Club Metropolitan Cup side.

"Maybe my expectations of him were too high, but he hasn't gone forward as much or as quickly as I would have thought. To be honest, I hoped for a little bit more from him. I do think he's got something special in him and now it's a matter of getting it out and on to the ground."

"To be left out of the side (for the second Test) might have been the tonic he needed to re-energise himself and come back again. I think it's going to be critical to watch the way he performs in this upcoming Test."

Walsh had advice for Australia's selectors as they try to rebuild a side in a situation similar to the West Indies' regeneration after a series of

high-profile retirements from the Caribbean side in the early 1990s.

"What I think Australia might

have done wrong is to be a bit impatient and try to replace those players very quickly, particularly in the

bowling department," he said. "It's certainly a reality check, to lose two of the world's greatest bowlers at the same time."

The right approach to take, he believes, is to identify a group of players that you think long term are going to be able to do the job. I think rotating two guys in one position over a period of time enables you to start to see who is going to be up to the task. Once you know that one of the guys is starting to do the job, you must stick with them."

Walsh is in Sydney to work on his autobiography and heads to Perth this week for a MCC summer tour.

Bec is an allrounder who always ended up performing very well despite what she expected. Her antics on and off the field always kept the team amused, Santa suit included.

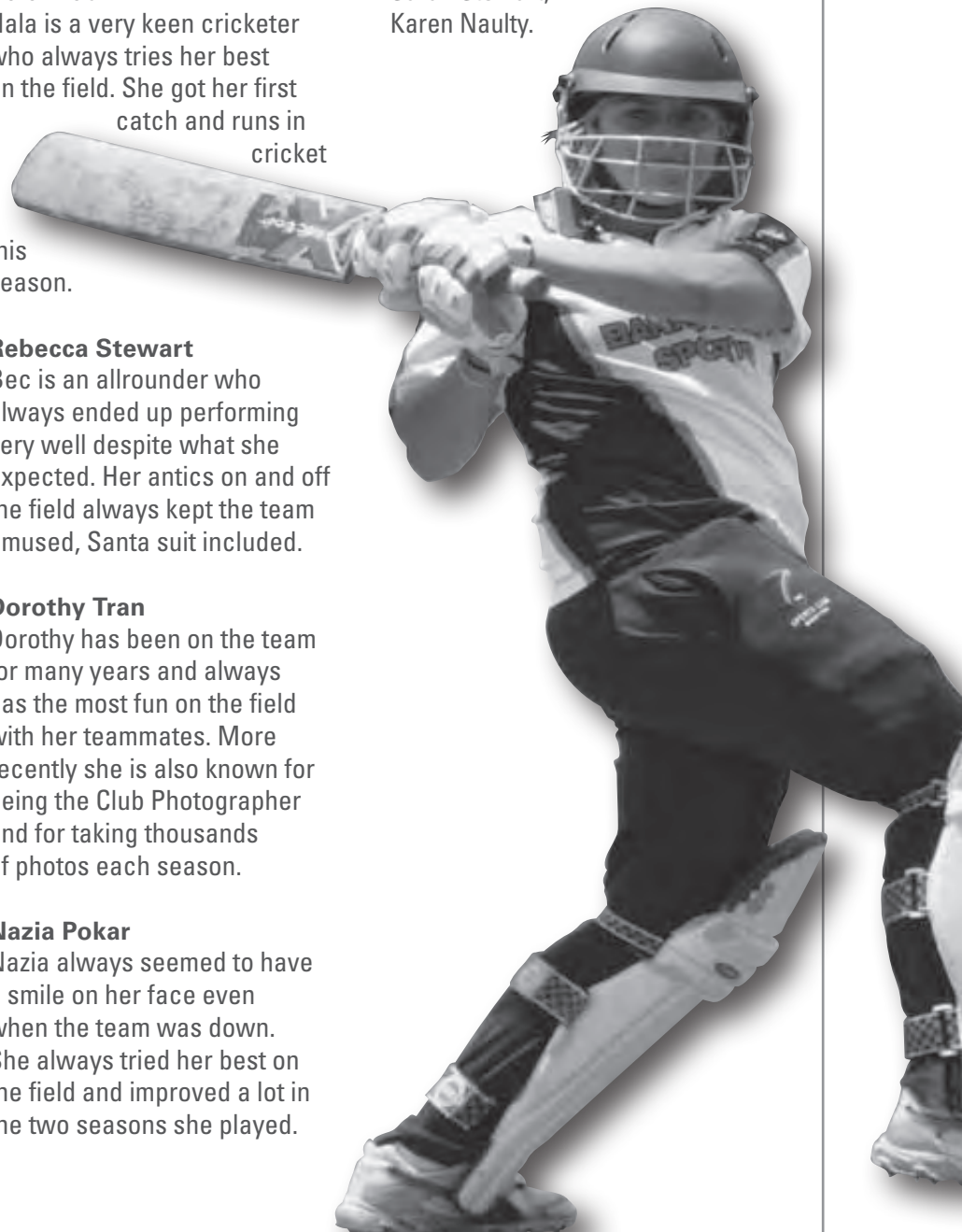

remembering arthur taylor

Bankstown cricketers were saddened by the news that legendary offspinner and Life Member Arthur Taylor passed away in May after a lengthy illness. Arthur started with Bankstown in the 1952-53 season and was an integral part of the club until he retired in 1978-79.

As an offie he tended to push the ball through with unerring accuracy but did not hesitate to give the ball plenty of air when batsmen failed to use their feet. A.T. as he was known loved bowling to lefthanders and very often had them caught behind or at first slip.

Just a couple of years ago Arthur bumped into Steve Small on the golf course and after exchanging salutations A.T. said I could still get you out you know. It is hard to imagine that his amazing record of 1188 wickets will ever be beaten. Despite this magnificent effort Arthur never bowled a ball in the top grade. In an attempt to rectify this situation the selectors picked him in first grade for his final game. Much to Arthur's chagrin the game was washed out without a ball being bowled and his ambition was thwarted. His bowling feats were remarkable and on no less than 10 occasions he captured more than 50 wickets in a season.

Undoubtedly the highlight of his career was when he captured five wickets in five balls against Manly during the 1965-66 season. Amazingly, second grade medium pacer

Kevin Tyson also claimed five wickets in five balls the same season. The feat was recorded in Wisden and remains part of Bankstown's cricketing folk lore. A.T. still holds the record for most third grade wickets with 73 in 1957-58. His offies claimed most wickets in a season 19 times and in 1960-61 his 5-65 against Balmain in the final proved crucial to Bankstown's premiership success. Arthur chuckled when told that 300 wickets was the figure required to make the honour board. He considered that target just a few season's work!

Arthur captained Bulldog sides from 1967 to his retirement in 1979. He was a shrewd skipper but was never reluctant to bring himself on to bowl. In the historic third grade match against St. George when Jeff Thomson claimed all 10 wickets it is hard to believe that he needed three spells to do it especially when he finished with 10-31.

Twice Arthur brought himself on to replace the tearaway at the bowling crease when the Dragons were on their knees. After the game Arthur joked that by introducing himself into the attack it made Thommo seem even quicker. Arthur added that Jeff Thomson would never play third grade again and he was so right about that.

A.T. captained a more than useful fourth grade side in 1971-72 which contained Frank Cicutto, Bob Lamaro and Steve Small. The final against Petersham at Petersham Oval

on a hot day started with Arthur winning the toss and fielding even though the pitch looked ideal for batting. Howls of protest from his young charges caused Arthur to reply that every time he had played at the ground the pitch was lively early. Arthur's decision was swiftly vindicated as left arm quick Peter Walker ripped through the Petes highly-vaunted batting lineup to claim 7-70. The home side crashed to be all out for 121 and Bankstown was on the way to outright victory and the premiership.

Arthur teamed up with his son Peter in the latter's wicketkeeping days. As the younger Taylor neared a ton in one particular game Arthur became more and more nervous. Peter was bogged down in the nineties but when he finally reached the coveted three figures Arthur bellowed "thank heavens for that, I wasn't this nervous waiting for him to be born".

In his younger days Arthur was a useful batsmen and altogether he compiled 3614 runs for his beloved Bulldogs. In his latter days he was dubbed the wily old fox for his ability to outthink batsmen, especially impetuous youngsters. From 1962 right through to the end of his career Arthur served on the Management Committee and in 1971 he was honoured with Life Membership. A true blue Bulldog. Condolences are extended to son Peter and the rest of the family.

facilities upgrade at memorial oval

This exciting (but long running!) project will hopefully come to a positive conclusion over the next 12 months.

When completed the new complex will provide a multi-purpose community indoor sports facility (including a four indoor cricket wickets) and a new Conference / clubroom and media building, servicing both Memorial Oval and Grahame Thomas Oval.

Fundamental to the project's viability is by a decision by the Federal Government to provide \$2.71m in Regional Infrastructure Funding. At the time of writing we have a letter of intent from the Government to this effect, however there are one or two

final compliance hurdles to jump before we will have a binding agreement signed.

All things being equal, we hope to issue a tender for the construction in August / September and commence building works either late this year or early next year. Besides the Federal Government we also have funding commitments from Bankstown Sports Club, Revesby Workers' Club, Cricket NSW, NSW Government, Bankstown City Council and Canterbury Leagues as well as a private benefactor.
