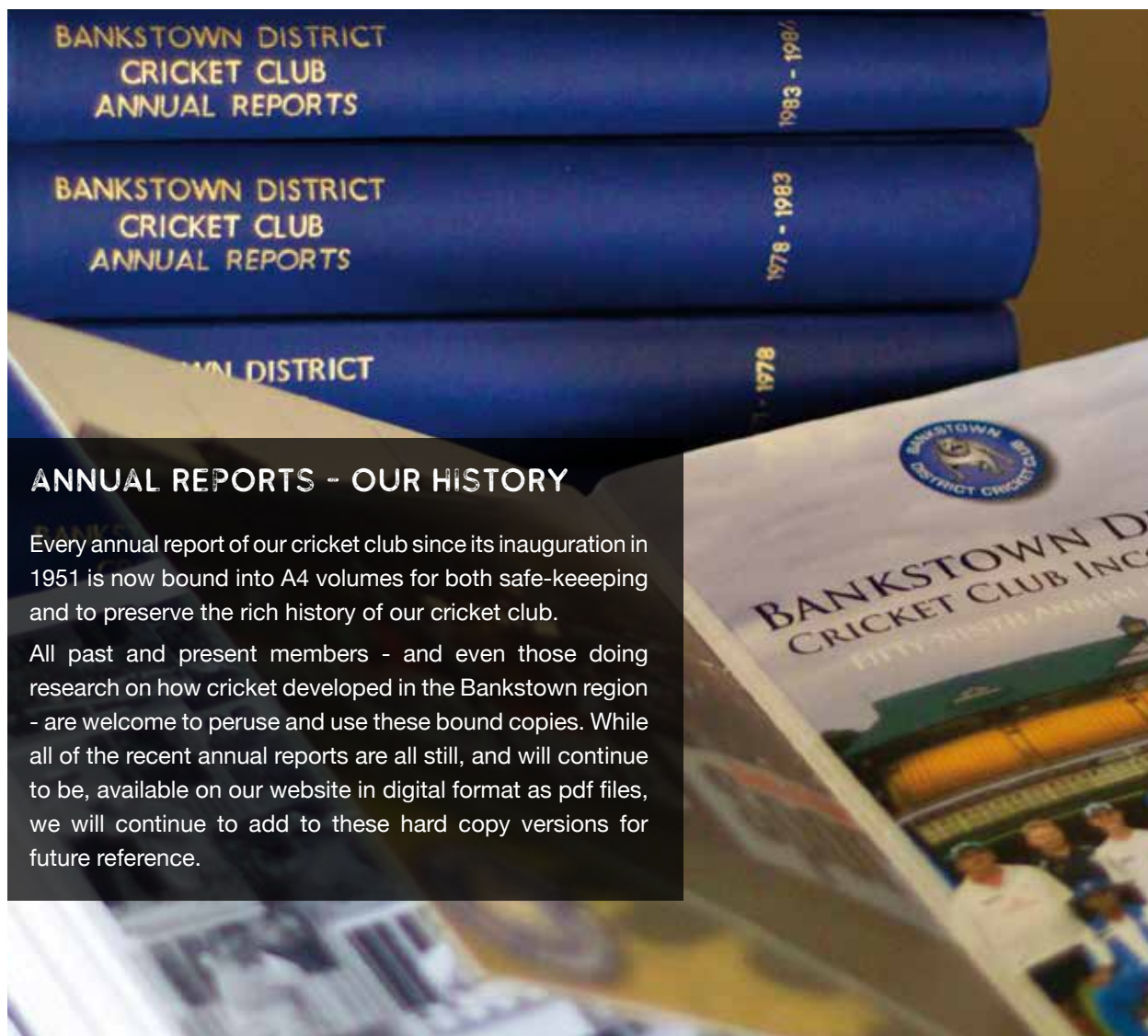

Joe and Nathaniel from our RSAC group. Both RSAC players performed well but the team finds sometimes finds it difficult when up against players from other states who play competitive cricket regularly and are consistently exposed to challenging real game scenarios.

There was also a major change to the management of the program, as David stepped down in December 2025 after volunteering for the RSAC / BDCC cricket program as

manager and coach for well over 10 years of. His efforts and dedication have been greatly appreciated by players and their parents.

Once again, we thank Bruce, Ian and Cindy for their support and help at our sessions as they provide a critical support network for both coaches and players and ensures variety and skill development through their help.

UGANDA COMMUNITY PROJECT

AUSTRALIA REACHES OUT TO UGANDA THROUGH CRICKET : TWO DECADES OF FRIENDSHIP, EQUIPMENT AND HOPE — A STORY 22 YEARS IN THE MAKING...

What began as a chance encounter at an international cricket tournament in 2004 has grown into one of Australian sport's most enduring acts of generosity. Over 22 years, the Bankstown District Cricket Club — guided by the tireless spirit of the club's amazing band of volunteers — has shipped 19 containers of cricket equipment halfway around the world, helping transform Uganda from a nation of fewer than 10,000 cricketers into a thriving cricketing community of more than 70,000.

A chance encounter in Bangladesh

The story begins not in Sydney or Kampala, but in Chittagong, Bangladesh, at the 2004 ICC Under-19 Cricket World Cup. Bankstown Cricket Club Life Member Brian Freedman, then managing Australia's Under-19 squad, watched in quiet astonishment as the

Ugandan team prepared to bat for their country — sharing bats and helmets between players as each one walked to the crease.

A conversation with the Ugandan team's management revealed the scale of the challenge. There were fewer than 10,000 cricketers in the entire country. Most bats were hand-crafted — fashioned

from whatever timber could be found. For a nation where the average annual income sat at just \$200 USD, a proper cricket kit was an almost unimaginable luxury.

For Freedman, the memory of that tournament never faded. Back home in Sydney, inspired by the motto of Bankstown Cricket Club's favourite son, Steve Waugh



— “Anyone can make a difference” — he resolved to act.

Filling the initial container

It took more than 12 months of collecting, repairing and sorting donated gear, but in early 2006 the first container landed in Kampala. The Ugandan Cricket Association issued a media release that was picked up by ABC Radio and newspapers across Australia, sparking a wave of new offers from clubs and members of the public eager to contribute.

A second shipment followed in November 2007, carrying 300 bats, 450 pairs of pads, 98 helmets and 230 pairs of batting gloves — enough to outfit all five Ugandan national teams: the Senior side, Under-19, Under-17, Under-15 and the Ladies Team, with surplus equipment directed to Uganda’s Schools Development Programme.

The decision that changed everything

The turning point came quietly... almost by accident. When the club invited the public to drop off gear at the SCG Test match, the response was modest — but the phone calls that followed told a different story. People had gear to donate; it was just impractical to get it to there.

The club’s decision to offer pick-ups changed the entire dynamic of the program. Suddenly, donating was effortless. Word spread organically, and the club found it no longer needed to advertise. Donations arrived from suburban front verandahs, school storerooms, retailers and manufacturing wholesalers across New South Wales and beyond.

One phone call has become something of a legend within the club. A man rang from

Broome, Western Australia, asking if they were still collecting. “That might be a bit bloody hard,” he said when they offered to pick up. “Why?” “I’m ringing from Broome.”. The gear was collected, courtesy of a generous interstate freight company.

Twenty-two years, nineteen containers

By 2026, the program has shipped 19 containers to Uganda — with the 20th currently being processed. What began as cricket equipment has evolved over time to include cricket clothing and, where needed, school uniforms and textbooks as well as a smattering of gear for sports like football, rugby and tennis that the Uganda Cricket Association passes on to orphanages and underprivileged schools.

The Uganda Cricket Association distributes equipment to male and female national teams, clubs, schools and grassroots development programs. Their own accounting is the most telling measure of the program's impact: participation in cricket across Uganda has grown from fewer than 10,000 players in 2004 to more than 70,000 today – a seven-fold increase that the UCA attributes, in significant part, to the steady supply of equipment from Bankstown. A historic moment happened in December 2023 when Uganda qualified for the 2024 T20 World Cup, a feat that many felt was in no small means a result of the steady supply of donated equipment via Bankstown Cricket Club since 2005.

Partnerships underpin the program

There is no doubt this program would never have happened if it wasn't for the financial support provided by Bankstown Sports Club. The Club's Board and Senior management have been fantastic supporters, encouraging the cricket club's volunteers every step of the journey and providing practical support packing the shipping containers.

Freight costs for landlocked Uganda are steep – as much

as \$15,000 per container. The total freight bill across 18 completed shipments exceeds \$270,000. Not one dollar of that has been paid by the Uganda Cricket Association. Bankstown Sports Club has covered every cent.

A further contribution has come from John Murray OAM, who recently stepped down as President of the Sports Club after more than 20 years in the role. In 2025 Murray donated a mechanical wicket roller to the program

– a piece of equipment that was desperately needed at the UCA's home ground in Kampala. This special donation is an example of the partnership's growing sophistication and ambition to support all elements of cricket operations in Uganda.

Many donors provide annual donations with organisations like New Balance, Kookaburra Sport, Kingsgrove Sports and Cricket NSW making significant contributions. Many local clubs think of

the program when they are cleaning out the clubroom and don't want to send equipment to the tip. And likewise, lots of 'mums and dads' (... to be fair, it's often the mums) are motivated to give us a call when kids leave home and their old gear is left cluttering the garage.

The spirit of cricket

Brian Freedman does not dwell on the numbers when he speaks about the program. For him, the reward is simpler – the knowledge that a child in Kampala, or in a school on the outskirts of a Ugandan town, picks up a bat that was once swung on an oval in Sydney.

"Much is said about the 'spirit of cricket' these days – it means many different things to different people. This is an incredible example of the Bankstown definition of the Spirit of Cricket."

The story of Uganda and Bankstown is, at its heart, a story about what sport can do when its good people look beyond the boundary. It is a story about a shared game, a long friendship and the quiet, persistent generosity of a community that decided, more than two decades ago, that anyone can make a difference.

Our 2025/26 season concluded at the end of the regular rounds with a 10th placed finish with an even number of wins and losses (7 each). over 400 runs batting in the middle order and had some outstanding contributions including some match-winning performances (30* vs Fairfield in a T20 and 67* vs UNSW). He also had an outstanding season with the gloves taking 34 dismissals and hardly missing a chance.

Ryan Freeman had a tough start to the season, although showed his class contributing scores of 67, 129* and 64* in his last four innings. Ryan ended up averaging 54 for the season and his two not out scores in his last two innings helped us win both games. Ryan has contributed significantly over the past few seasons in Second Grade and I'm sure a permanent role in First Grade isn't far away.

Ethan Debono had a good season after starting the year in Third Grade. An explosive player with the ability to change a game in no time, Ethan played a vital role in our win against Manly with a quick fire 40* on a terrible wicket at Manly Oval. His highlight for the season was his 116 off 90 balls against Wests as he opened the batting and helped us chase down their total with ease.

Alex Kouventaris provided our team with the stability he's done over the past three seasons. Kouvi was always there for me to lean on for advice and was always looking to contribute off-field as well as on-field. Although Kouvi's prep was hindered by getting to training late due to circumstances outside of his control, he didn't let that affect his work ethic or

attitude. With a change of circumstances I'm looking forward to Kouvi getting more out of his prep in the upcoming season and get back to hitting 500/600-run seasons again.

I was very impressed with the growth and development of young Rehaab. He had a very good season with the bat, getting many starts of which I'm sure he will capitalise on in the seasons to come. Rehaab also contributed well with the ball, improving throughout the season in taking 22 wickets. Rewarded with a First Grade cap and selected to play in the First Grade Finals series is a testament to the work he's put in over the course of the season. A strong competitor, we all enjoyed having (fast-twitch) Rehaab with us.

Gurinder Hara was a consistent performer throughout the season which is what we've become used to from G. Another with some off-field challenges which hindered his prep on occasion, it never affected his attitude toward his team. I've had the pleasure of playing cricket with G for the best part of about 10 years now and am extremely grateful for everything he adds to our environment.

It was great to see Zane get through an entire season injury-free. Having had an entire season off, it was always going to be challenging to gain confidence and have an immediate impact this season. His work ethic and commitment to his training

under such adversity is a credit to his character. I'm looking forward to seeing Zane back to his best next season leading any bowling attack he's a part of.

It was good fun working with Nick Freedman this season who bowled well in his first full season of Second Grade. I was happy to see the growth and progression throughout the season, learning to bowl on different wickets and in different conditions. Nick worked extremely hard at training and by the end of the season found himself able to contribute with the bat as well as ask a lot more questions of batsmen by adding some more variety to his bowling. His 4/38 against Manly late in the season was an exceptional spell of bowling showing he's got the ability to succeed in this grade.

Koby Layton was ever reliable this season. His 33* against UNSW helped us win a game from a near impossible position. Koby was very economical with the ball providing our

bowling group with the ability to control games with the ball from time to time. His experience across all three aspects of the game were certainly valued in a season that was a little more disruptive than previous seasons.

Hayden Barrett had a good season and showed much promise. His 2/33 off 15 overs against Parramatta and a 4-wicket haul against Penrith were standout efforts. Consistency and confidence will come with more time in Second Grade but Hayden should be proud of his progression this season.

Luca Croft had a mixed season with an early season injury preventing him from playing more of a role. Luca has the natural assets to play an important role in any team and we saw glimpses of that throughout the season. I'm looking forward to seeing Luca continue to progress his all-round skills to be an impactful player with both bat and ball.

In all, the 10th placed result was disappointing

in comparison to the high standards and expectations we set ourselves as a group. Although it was pleasing to see many players take steps forward individually throughout the season, I'm sure with a couple of minor changes and a re-focus on our goals we will be playing Finals cricket in the upcoming season.

I'd also like to thank Jen for assisting me and the team once again throughout the season. Her passion for our group and our performances is second to none. It's a pleasure to have her around each week at training and on the weekend and we all thoroughly appreciate everything she does for us.

I'd also like to thank the Club, coaching staff and volunteers, especially Jen Campbell, for their time and dedication, as well as allowing us to train and play at a top-class facility. Looking forward to season 2026/27. Thank you, Mitch Hinds

The 2025/26 4th Grade season would rank amongst my most enjoyable with the club, as I had the privilege of captaining a terrific group of young men who represented the club to high standard.

In some contrast Kingy bounced back from a rough trot in the finest style against Blacktown, showing his maturity and class to pace the perfect one-day innings, making 120 at better than a run-a-ball. Both continued to develop as leaders and are players I would take into battle any day of the week.

(When he wasn't being barbecued by his captain!), the experience of Jehan Bilimoria added similar steel to our batting lineup and was instrumental to a late season push. Billa and Anthony Melnyk at the start of the season were valued fill-in captains when I was unavailable and continue to be selfless clubmen.

The side saw plenty of promise from some of our Green Shield batsmen, with Aarav Daddikar and Wahaab Ahmad both showing flashes of their class across the season. I am sure the pair will have learned plenty

about their games through the season and will be back to stamp their claims at full time spots in 4th grade (and beyond) in 2026/27.

The best thing about 4th grade is seeing young players grow in confidence and understand their games. Nobody exemplified this better than Hassan Jamil, who returned after some challenging seasons battling injury and managing his studies to be one of the sides most reliable players. Hass' batting came on in leaps and bounds, to the point where he calmly got us over the line in several close games and seemed to relish the high-pressure moments. With this new bow added to his super accurate spells with the new ball bowling and terrific fielding, this was a year to be proud of for a very hard-working and well-rounded player.

Taking the gloves for the first time in 4th grade this year was Jack Grives, who equally proved to be one of the club's biggest improvers. Jack plays the game with tremendous spirit and a classic Bulldog grit - qualities which shone through with the bat, as he refused to give his wicket away without a fight. His innings against

Sutherland to see us to an unlikely win was a prime example of this. His glove work seemed to get better each game out, finishing the year with 23 dismissals and 162 runs at just over 20. Jack's results were a testament to his efforts at training week-in week-out and reflect his strong character and determination.

Our bowling unit once again was led by the spinners - Reagan Sidhu finishing once again as the leading wicket taker with 21 scalps. Reags showed himself to be an emerging leader; stepping up when the side needed him most and continuing to find a voice. His best bowling remains far too good for 4th grade batsmen, and he showed great resilience to battle spells where he struggled for rhythm and consistency. His off-field antics continue to entrench him as a favourite amongst teammates, responsible for a good chunk of the laughs across the season. He sits just 2 wickets away from 100 poles for the club in just 64 matches,

reflecting his strike power and sheer wicket taking ability - I've been grateful to watch many of these scalps and look forward to cheering on the next 2.

Sam Cordingley's 3rd place finish in the Player of the Year voting started with an unbelievable run in 4th grade to start the season, taking 17 wickets at 13.12 in just 6 games. This included a 5-wicket haul against finalists Parramatta on a flat Merrylands Oval, which proved to be the entree for a remarkable 7/36 off 24 overs to lead us to an unlikely win against Mosman. Sam's promotion to 3rd grade and his success was no surprise to those who see him go about his business. His control and accuracy for a leg-spinner his age is second-to-none, and the addition of a wicked wrong-un saw him bamboozle many batsmen through the season. Sam sees and thinks the game well beyond his years, and I'm sure will continue to make great strides next year.

The spinners were given great new ball support from

3 quicks who also saw time in 3rd grade during the year. Talha Khalid captured 14 wickets, showing a high-level of discipline to go with smart planning. His late-innings spells in short form games were particularly impressive and proved the difference in several matches. Someone who clearly cares about his cricket and works very hard on his game, Talha should be proud of his return this season.

Despite a tough year with the bat, Sam Freedman regularly delivered important spells with the ball, taking on tough spells with confidence and composure on his way to 12 wickets for the year. One of the most mature and intelligent young players I've ever taken the field with. I've no doubt Sam will be on for a big year next season.

Ben Smith came back with added pace and zip with the ball that he used to great effect, cementing a place in 3's through the back end of the year after impressing in 4th grade. Benny consistently applied pressure and seemed to always be in the

game with his relentless channels. Another who I'm sure will be looking to go bigger with the bat next year after not getting a lot of opportunity, Ben could be primed for a huge 2026/27.

The experienced Rhys Ward also played a key role through the year, often bowling without luck, but always applying pressure for his teammates at the other end. A great fella to have back around the club and who was a good leader for the young guys in our side.

To the other players who took the park for 4th grade this year, I appreciate your efforts and hope that you've felt more confident in your cricket at seasons end.

To the parents in our side

who assisted with various match day tasks, for their support and getting the team to the ground, I offer my sincere thanks. I must single out Gamini Perera, whose scoring and photography was greatly appreciated by the whole side (particularly the former given some of the scoring blunders from our younger players through the year!)

As always, I maintain my stance that the committee at Bankstown is amongst the competition leaders and certainly goes unmatched in their commitment and passion for the club. I thank them for their time and effort this year, and every year, to give the playing group the best chance to be successful

on the pitch.

I would also like to thank Chris Ridley and the coaching staff for their efforts across a long season. I'm a huge fan of how Chris has gone about his work since taking the coaching reins, being not only highly approachable and personable, but setting clear standards and driving a positive culture for how we approach our training as a club.

I look forward to seeing what Year 75 of the Bankstown DCC can deliver, but until then wish all players, volunteers and supporters of the club the very best wishes for the winter months.

Since 1990 when I made my Grade Cricket debut against their 2nd Grade team, I was in awe of the Bankstown Club. For a young bloke from the country, I was impressed with the club's professionalism, talent, competitiveness and appearance. I remember leaving Rawson Oval after the first day of a two dayer thinking "gee they would be a great club to play for".

Fast forward 35 years and awe has turned into reality. With the help of good mate, Tony Clark and discussions with Jehan Bilimoria I joined this great club.

Before I report on the season past, I would like to thank the Bankstown Cricket Club for making me so welcome and throwing me a lifeline to keep playing Premier Cricket after my previous club squeezed me out because of my age. It's probably seen as a big risk taking on a 56-year-old but my mantra as I head towards the end of my career is to share my knowledge with and help develop young players as they start their journey in Premier Cricket and hopefully climb up through the grades and on to bigger and better things. During pre-season I was so impressed with the talent the club has and after a season as Captain I am even more confident in the club's ability to convert talent into silverware soon.

Enough about me, now, time to report on a season where we played a lot of good cricket, some poor cricket and a lot of cricket at

a standard in between. Given that we had some eight Premier Cricket debutants this season we can be satisfied with 16th position on the table (an improvement on last year's 20th) on the proviso we buy-in as a squad with real determination to make finals next season.

The season got off to a good start at Petersham Oval with a T20 win over Randwick Petersham. Having not played much T20 cricket it was a real unknown whether our 123 off 20 overs would be enough on the small ground. Hassan Jamil and Josh Grives cracked the top order open early and Randy-Petes never recovered being bowled out for 92 in the 17th overs. Hassan was the pick of the bowlers with 3 for 13 off 3 to add to his 24no and it was obvious to me that we wouldn't be seeing much of Hass again during the season as he moved up the grades. Our Premier Cricket debutants Josh Grives, Josh Casey, Varchas Malik and Aaditya Shivalkar all picked up wickets whilst Satvik Emmani got the innings off to a good start with 20 and Shivam Lakade played a little gem of a knock with 31 not out at the end. So pleased for our debutants being able to contribute on a special day for them – a day they will remember for the rest of their Premier Cricket careers.

After the euphoria of winning our first game of the season we were quickly brought back down to earth with a poor performance against eventual Premiership winners, Fairfield. Losing the

toss on a wicket that did a fair bit our batting showed very little method or ticker, and we limped to be all out for 75 in the 20th over. Fairfield with the better of the conditions came out hard and passed us 4 down in the 17th over. The less said about the game the better.

Round 3 saw us up against Sutherland in a one dayer – a chance for players to build an innings with the bat and build pressure with the ball and in the field. After losing both openers early the middle order consolidated with all getting starts but not going on with it – to the point where we were struggling to bat out our overs and in fact didn't – being bowled out in the 47th – a cardinal sin at Grahame Thomas Oval. Sutherland chased down our total with ease passing us in the 46th over thanks to a superb 101 not out to Sam Jaques, son of former Australian Test Player, Phil. In my 30 odd years in Grade/ Premier Cricket I don't think I have seen a better innings by a teenager. As a Captain and a Coach if you wanted to tell a kid to model your innings on a certain template you would point towards this innings. The temperament and maturity shown by a 14-year-old was just next level. Yes, he probably has a thousand balls thrown at him each week, but you still must put those skills in to play. Whilst we were on the wrong end of Sam's innings, I'm sure our young batters got something out of watching it.

The next two games against Parramatta and Uni of NSW showed us at

our absolute worst with an outright loss to Parra and then our absolute best with a sensational win in the one dayer against UNSW where after a controlled start we came home like a steam train chasing 110 off the last 10 overs to overhaul Uni's 6 for 245. Matt Fitzgerald steered the ship home with a sublime 78 not out, off 48 balls terrorising the tennis players in the neighbouring courts with 7 sixes and 4 fours. Luke Bean and Harley Cutting showed great maturity in their innings not panicking when things were

a bit slow making 63 and 51 respectively – great to see Beany back amongst the runs after making a golden pair against Parra in the previous round. Aadi Shivalkar deserves mention with his accurate spell of 2 for 29 off 10 overs which for the size of the ground at Alexandria was outstanding. This was a game that gave us plenty of belief in ourselves to chase any total down if we still have wickets in the shed to work with.

Day 1 against Mosman was a disaster – not only for the \$ 30 fee charged for

the privilege of parking at Balmoral but for the chaotic start where we lost our first four batsmen for ducks and were 4 for 14 and never really recovered scrambling to 174 largely thanks to the rescue missions launched by Matt Fitzgerald (37) and Farhan Mohammed with 42. Aaditya Shivalkar played a gem of an innings with 45no to give the innings some respectability, but 6 ducks on the day was just not up to 5th grade standard. Our shot selection was poor on most dismissals, and we didn't give the Mosman bowling the

respect it deserved. Mosman passed us 4 down with the pick of the bowlers being Zach Pagano with 3 for 34 off 12.

Failing to bat out our overs on a good deck was again our downfall against St George at Grahame Thomas. Our Chairman of Selectors, Jehan Bilimoria showed how it was done with a hard hitting 74 off 83 balls with 5 fours and 5 sixes – a fantastic knock in only his second game back from shoulder surgery. Saints showed how easy batting should have been at GT passing our total in the 32nd over just 5 wickets down.

Our batting found it's mojo again in the Round 8 game against Blacktown at Grahame Thomas. Satvik Emmanni showed his true potential with a brilliant 95 and deserved to get a hundred – in hindsight he probably could have been a bit more selfish and made sure he got there, but played with a team-first mentality that day which you can't help but admire and praise. Evan Hoskin played a brilliant innings with 73 off 61 balls to really crack it open for the Dogs allowing the rest of the innings to be played out with plenty of freedom. Shiv Lakade capitalised

on this with a destructive 46 not out off just 18 balls. As his batting partner at the other end, it was just a privilege to sit back and watch the entertainment – in particular the Blacktown players arguing amongst themselves!

In the field I thought we showed a lot of maturity for such a young group, knowing that Blacktown would probably come at us hard in the chase of a big total. However, despite only picking up one wicket we bowled tight lines and kept the Warriors to just 103 in the first 25 overs for the loss of 2 wickets. The Bean brothers bowled well in tandem in the middle overs picking up a couple of wickets for a run rate of around four leaving Blacktown to score at 9 an over for the last ten overs with just 4 wickets left. Josh Casey was reintroduced into the attack for the last 12 overs with a mantra to take wickets. That he did, taking 4 for 49 off 9.3 overs. Josh Bean mesmerised the Blacktown batters with his spin taking 4 for 48 off 10 and special mention should go to Guhan Mani Maran who had it on a string opening the bowling with a miserly 0 for 7 off 6 overs. This was a great win

after our poor performance against Saints and instilled confidence in the teams all round ability.

Our good form with the ball continued in Round 9 against Sydney Uni on a newly laid deck at Camperdown with a 40-metre boundary square to the wicket on the western side. Winning the toss and bowling, Josh Casey and Guhan blew the top order away leaving Uni at 3 for 26 and 4 for 57. Some poor fielding, in particular catching allowed the Sydney Uni middle order to get them back in the game. Josh Casey was brought back in the 41st over and did what was asked of him taking 3 wickets including the all-important wicket of the captain, Cain who was on 52 at the time and looking to launch out. In his Premier Cricket debut Wahaab Ahmad showed great maturity taking 2 for 28 off 7 to nullify Uni's attempt on increasing the run rate. Guhan took 2 for 45 off his 10.

Our start in chasing Uni's 202 was a disaster. Poor shots and running left us at 3 for 10 in the 3rd over with 202 looking a long way away. Harley Cutting and Farhan Mohammed came together for a rescue Mission, batting



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very sensibly for a 91-run partnership before Farhan disappointingly ran himself out trying to take on the fielder for a second run. At 4 for 101 in the 25th over the game was still in the balance particularly with the big quick, Cowan to return still having 7 overs left. Showing no nerves at all Wahaab set about his work and showed his real potential finishing on 49 not out off just 54 balls completing a fantastic all round performance in his Premier Cricket debut. However, for me, the pick of the players was Harley Cutting with his 72 not out off 142 balls to steer the ship home. Whilst an innings like this won't excite some private coaches who continue to preach nonsense about strike rates and 360 degree-shot capabilities, it still has a place in 5th Grade – particularly in two-day cricket. Great knock Harley!

Round 10 saw us at home again on an incredibly hot day against Easts who were competition leaders at the time. Winning the toss and batting first, we didn't do the wicket any justice and limped along to be all out in the 50th over for 151 which was never enough on GT. Harley Cutting continued his good form with 37 but nobody went with him and we made a very ordinary off spinner look like Harbhajan Singh failing to put any pressure on him and at least pick up singles. Easts showed how easy it was to bat on that wicket passing our total in 38 overs.

Our last game before the Christmas break against

Wests was a must win game if we were any chance of making finals. At one stage it looked like we weren't going to get on at all with Wests inadequately covering their square from the overnight rain laying down just a single strip. Finally getting underway around 1pm we won the toss and put Wests into bat.

West's got off to a flyer with some ill-disciplined bowling, racking up 61 off the first 10 overs for the loss of just one wicket. The introduction of senior statesmen of the team, Melville and Kelly brought wickets and put the brakes on the innings with Wests 5 for 99 in the 23rd Over with just 14 overs left in a rain reduced fixture. Mat bowled out his mandated 8 overs to take 4 for 35 whilst Zach Pagano did a great job taking over from Matt at the grandstand end with 2 for 20 off 6. Charlie Fitzjohn returning from injury looked so much better in his second spell with 2 for 31 off 8 overs.

Chasing 145 off 37 overs at just 3.9 an over should have been a simple task and openers Jackson Moore and Satvik Emmanni made it look so for a while with a partnership of 82 until Satvik stepped back on his stumps for 32. From there we lost 4 for 10 with some real poor shot selection and finally cricket was more than a long way off. Mat Kelly tried his best to salvage the game but was left with too much to do and little resources left. We fell short by 7 runs and any hopes of playing finals were gone.

First round back after Christmas was drawn with the first week being called off due to extreme heat and the second week being washed out after 12 overs. Full credit to all players for their efforts trying to get the game on but mother nature won the day.

At Killara in Round 13 we played a near perfect two-day game with a resounding win over Gordon. Achieving our primary goal of batting all day we posted 9 for 301 declared. Marcus Winning, in just his second game in 5th grade made 76. Satvik Emmanni, Harley Cutting and I all made forties. Farhan Mohammed and Shiv Lakade both made 20. If there is to be any criticism of our innings, a lot of blokes made starts but nobody went on and made a century. But hey, I will take batting all day and making 300 anytime!

Josh Casey blew away the Gordon top order and any chance of them winning with an ambush on day two. Taking the first four wickets to fall, the Stags slumped to be 4 for 25, 5 for 53, 6 for 63 and all out for 145. Case showed how much he has improved this season bowling a brilliant line and great shape. His bouncers were pinpoint accurate and certainly rattled the Gordon top order before the deck flattened out moving towards the tea break. Josh took 4 for 25 off 10, Mat Kelly 2 for 13 off 8, Zach Pagano 1 for 9 off 4 and Aaditya Shivalkar 1 for 8 off 11 looking almost unplayable when he got the ball above eye level. Six points to the good guys and a game that showed up so

many positives about this team.

While we ended up on the wrong side of the ledger, I couldn't be prouder of the team's effort and performance in the one-dayer against Manly at Grahame Thomas. A lot of players got starts but unfortunately nobody really kicked on. Farhan Mohammed and Aaditya Shivalkar put on 75 for the 6th wicket to give the innings some respectability at 8 for 226 off our 50 overs – probably sub-par for that deck in those conditions. Manly got off to a steady start losing their first wicket for 43 in the 13th over – Flynn Salter taking his first Premier Grade wicket on debut. The captain picked up a couple

of wickets thanks to two excellent catches and Manly were 3 for 68 in the 18th over. Manly recovered with a 61-run partnership which was broken by the newly introduced Aadi Shivalkar who used great guile and flight to pick up 4 for 24 off 10. Flynn picked up another wicket, as did Melville and Manly were 9 for 222 in the 47th needing 5 off 23 balls with just one wicket in hand. Manly scored the winning runs with 15 balls to spare. 24 extra deliveries from wides and no balls really came back to bite us.

Given that Manly went close to beating us outright last season the whole team should be proud of pushing a top three side to their limits and going oh so close to

taking the six points.

Unfortunately, all our good work post-Christmas was undone with some poor cricket in the last 2 rounds with a comprehensive first innings loss to Penrith in Round 15 and an even more resounding outright loss to Northern Districts in the last round of the season. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Farhan Mohammed for taking the side in the last two rounds in my absence being away with the Australian Over 55s and then the subsequent injury I sustained on tour. Thanks also to Harley Cutting for the leadership role he played as well.

In summary, the season was a considerably better one than the previous. We



finished 16th with 5 wins for the season as opposed to last year where we were last with just one win. While the squad can be happy with the improvement, I think we won't be satisfied with the season's result. There is too much talent in the squad to be content with 16th and we must set ourselves a realistic goal of making finals next season. Key areas needing improvement next season are our batting, where we need to learn to bat longer periods and put a bigger price on our wicket. Our catching needs more work as we shelled some relatively simple chances that cost us dearly at times. Our control with the ball needs some work also, particularly in one day and T20 games where we as a collective bowled too many wides and no balls.

On a positive note, there were some great performers with bat and ball during the season. Satvik Emmanni in his debut Premier Cricket season was leading run scorer with 354 runs at 22.13. Harley Cutting (339 runs at 21.19) and Farhan Mohammed (294 runs at 18.38) were 2nd and 3rd in the batting aggregates.

With the ball, Josh Casey in his debut Premier Cricket

season coming from parkies was leading wicket taker with 19 wickets at 23.6. Aaditya Shivalkar took 16 wickets at 25.81 and looked so much better when he gave the ball some air. Rounds 5 & 6 were extremely close contests with Jake Monie the difference in both games hitting 99* and 103 respectively to help us register a 3rd place finish in our pool.

We were dominant in our

Quarter Final against St George at Hurstville with Riley Kingsell hitting 161 off 132 helping us post 6/312. In what was always going to be a tough chase in overcast conditions, Rehaab was outstanding with the ball taking 6/24 off 9.4 overs in an outstanding spell of bowling. In our Semi-final against Parramatta at Old Kings, we won the toss and batted first on a good wicket. Riley Kingsell then came out and just about took the game away from Parramatta smashing 148 off 60 balls in an innings that included 12 x 4s and 14 x 6s that left everyone at the ground speechless. 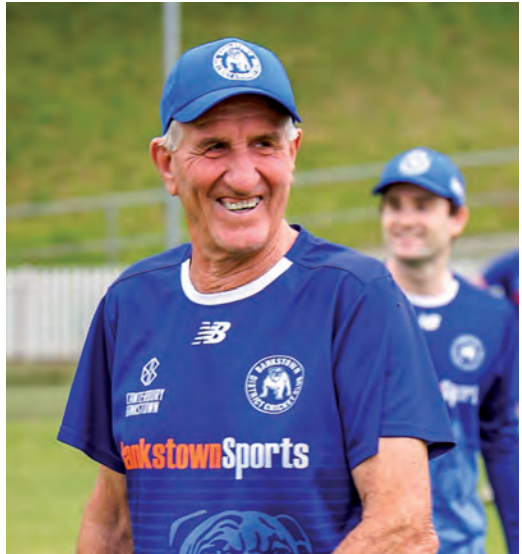
