vale dion bourne

It is with profound sadness that we advise the passing of Life Member Dion Bourne on 18th June 2013.

Dion was the most prolific first grade run-getter in the history of the Club with an imposing 8149 first grade runs and 9131 runs in all grades.

"Lunch", as he was affectionately known, did it all for Bankstown, captaining the under 21 Poidevin-Gray side and quickly working his way up to the top grade, which he captained for a record seven successive seasons.

Dion was a hard-hitting opening batsman with a devastating hook shot and his aggressive nature and quick scoring inevitably got the side off to a flying start. His flashing blade enabled him to dominate many of the topline N.S.W. fast bowlers of the day including Australian pace-men Frank Misson, David Renneberg and Gordon Rorke.

At one stage of his illustrious career he was asked if pace worried him and in his own laconic manner replied "No it has never been a concern up until recently when I faced our young pair of fourth grade quicks. They are undoubtedly the fastest bowlers I've ever seen and could be anything" Dion was of course referring to the young Bankstown tear-aways, Jeff Thomson and Len Pascoe..

Cricket is more than just a series of statistics but the fact that Dion Bourne won the first grade batting average six times and also the aggregate six times is testimony to his consistency. No batsman in the proud history of the Bulldog Club has won the first grade batting average so many times and only Rod Bower has equalled Dion's feat of winning the aggregate on six occasions.

In an era when 11 a.m. starts were unheard of and most two day games started at 1 p.m., on uncovered pitches, it is even more impressive to note that five times Dion scored 500 or more runs, and in the 1971-72 season reached the pinnacle when he amassed 812 runs. In his early days Dion formed a devastating opening combination with Grahame Thomas. Both were ferocious hookers of the ball and they became the scourge of pace bowlers, but an absolute delight to spectators. Dion debuted in Bob Madden's first grade side in the 1960-61 season and the skipper described him as a solid young opener in the making, and a fine slip fieldsman. "Lunch" consolidated his position in 1961-62 scoring 76 in a great opening stand of 138 with Grahame Thomas against N.Ds. Dion once again combined with Grahame in 1962-63 with a partnership of 197 versus Uni and 147 against Mosman.

The pair were gaining quite a reputation for their opening stands and this was considerably enhanced in 1963-64 when they really cut loose with 156 versus Cumberland, an unfinished 128 run stand against Waverley, 112 versus Paddington, 105 against Norths and 62 against Glebe. Dion notched 516 runs at an average of 43 including a dashing 111 not out against Northern District, his initial top grade ton. A total of 522 runs in 1964-65 was followed by 423 in 1965-66 when he won the aggregate and average for the first time with 30.21.

Dion snared both honours again in 1966-67 with 573 runs at 38.2, but really hit his straps in 1967-68 plundering 752 runs at 47 to comprehensively dominate the batting. Dion's 162 against Randwick was an absolute gem of power hitting and included 22 boundaries in just 198 minutes at the crease. However, his 119 against Gordon was even more sensational coming in just 91 minutes with 19 fours and 3 massive sixes. Dion scored 459 runs in 1968-69 and won the batting average in 1969-70 with 511 runs at 30.58. Once more in 1970-71 he was a class above the rest of the batsman accumulating 642 runs at 33.78. Again he punished the Gordon attack ruthlessly, thumping 101 in a mere 147 minutes with 11 boundaries.



Captaincy in 1971-72 made Dion even more determined and he amassed 812 runs at 40.60 to win the batting honours in his best season to date. He posted 100 versus Norths, 87 against Petes, 87 versus Randwick, 85 against Manly and an explosive 63 against Sydney in just 60 minutes.

His 500 runs in 1972-73 enabled him to eclipse Bruce Urry's record as the Club's leading run-getter and he improved on this with 414 in 1973-74, 329 in 1974-75, 423 in 1975-76, 227 in 1976-77 and 202 in 1977-78.

In his last couple of seasons Dion unselfishly dropped himself down the order to give the younger players like Steve Small, Bob Vidler and Rod Bower a better go, and in 1978-79 he handed over the reins to Trevor McDonald. Dion elected to play on in John Dunn's seconds but after averaging 34 he was called back up to the top grade and his experience proved invaluable.

"Lunch" spent most of the next two seasons passing on his experience to John Dunn's second grade and eventually hung up the boots at the end of the 1980-81 season. It was a long and distinguished career for the 'Dogs and it was ironic that in retiring he left a vacancy for his nephews Mark and Steve Waugh who both played seconds the next season.

Dion was renowned for his vociferous appealing from all parts of the field but he excelled himself one day against Balmain at Drummoyne. He leapt into the air with great enthusiasm and let out an enormous roar. Unfortunately, he crashed to the ground in a crumpled heap and had to be helped from the field. It could only happen to Dion, he had torn a calf muscle appealing!

Dion was Honorary Treasurer for a record nineteen seasons, was Chairman of Selectors and a member of the Selection Panel for over ten years. He served several seasons as a NSW Selector and was a member of the BDCC Management Committee for 33 years. He was also appointed as a Director of Bankstown District Sports Club in April 2003.

In 1995 Bankstown City Council named the Bankstown Oval scoreboard the "Dion Bourne"

scoreboard. In April 2013 Bankstown City Council transferred this honour to the new d i g i t a l scoreboard, the most



sophisticated of its type erected at a suburban ground in Australia.

The Bankstown Club and the wider cricket community club extends deepest sympathies to Dion's wife and loving companion Brenda, daughters Jacinth and Cassandra and son James.

president's report



On behalf of the management committee, I want to say thank you to all that contributed to what was a wonderful season. It was clearly a great year. We were 2nd in the club championship, three teams played finals and training attendance and intensity was outstanding. Off the field, we achieved our decade-long dream of opening an indoor cricket and sports centre.

If there is one secret, it is simply that you have to keep doing things extraordinarily well, to demand consistently high standards all the time." This is John's mantra and it must be ours. We can apply and embed these principles into our own amateur club in relation to attitude, culture and process. No doubt it is hard, but that is what makes success so worthwhile.

We are fortunate to have so many volunteers that contribute across the club, that give their time and commitment unreservedly. We are fortunate to have enduring support from Bankstown City Council and an outstanding partnership with the Bankstown Sports Club. In the Sports Club we have a sponsor, a friend and a leader in the community. This coalition delivers impetus and support for our evolution. We have a legacy of best practice and we have a desire to never leave well enough alone.

Thank you again, for an outstanding year, for your individual contribution and collaboration.

sixtysecond annual report



I have pleasure in presenting the club's Sixty-Second Annual Report and Financial Statement.

In my report last year I wrote that I felt we had all the right elements in place to we perform well in 2012/13 and that we'd need to be very creative at making excuses if we didn't deliver.

So it's great to report that we don't need any creative excuses because we did deliver on our potential with season 2012/13 proving to be successful both on and off the field.

On the field, running second in the Club Championship and having our Second, Third and Fourth Grade teams play in the SCA finals series was a vast improvement on our results in recent seasons.

Off the field, the opening of the John Mackay Sports Centre and the Bankstown Sporting Hall of Fame on 3rd March 2013 was the culmination of more than a decade of effort by club administrators. These facilities set a new benchmark for Grade cricket clubs nationally.

The Club remains indebted to our loyal Patron Daryl Melham MP, the Member for Banks, for his tireless efforts on our behalf in securing the Regional Infrastructure Grant from the Australian Government that made our dream a reality.

Our improved playing performance was underpinned by a committed captaincy group supported by a dedicated coaching team.

Jarrad Burke demonstrated excellent tactical acumen and general leadership skills in his first season leading first grade. The Club received a lot of positive feedback from Umpires about the manner in which he led the side and the positive contributions he made during formal post match meetings. Jarrad is an immensely talented all-rounder with a strong sense of loyalty to his teammates and his Club. He has a keen eye for spotting strengths and weaknesses in players and is a great supporter for giving opportunities to young players.

Dean Magee was at his passionate best in leading Second Grade to a semi-final appearance. Dean was able to get the best out of a side that was big on potential but short on experience. Dean is one of true characters of the Bankstown Club and of Sydney Grade Cricket as a whole. His eats, sleeps (and drinks!) grade cricket. The demands of modern life mean it's rare for grade players to have extended careers – it's even rarer for them to remain competitive in senior grades. Dean has achieved both these feats. Dean has announced his intention to retire from playing and we hope he is able to remain involved with the club so he can share his knowledge and experience with our younger players.

Mat Kelly was joint-winner of the SCA 'Third Grade Captain of the Year' a just reward for leading his side to a minor premiership. A key aspect underpinning Mat's success was his ability to blend experienced players like Mark Grant, Andrew O'Brien and Brad Roworth with a group of promising young players to form a well rounded team capable of playing different styles as circumstances dictated. Mat is a young man of the highest character and a great role model for younger players.

lain Ridley scored 716 runs at 39.78 and this combined with his decisive on-field leadership was a key factor in Fourth Grade running third in the minor premiership. Iain has much to contribute to the Club whether it is as a team leader or as a specialist batsmen in higher grades. Despite his many duties as team captain lain is always willing to help with general club administration tasks and the Committee is very grateful for his assistance in this area. Mat Doab calmly and effectively handled the toughest job at the Club, that being Fifth Grade Captain. Mat got the best from his young players, leading the side to ninth place just one win away from a finals series appearance. Mat can be very proud of the way he supported young spinner David Lozinski who finished 10th in the SCA honour list. A very passionate and committed Bulldog Mat is a terrific role model for our young players both on and off the field.

Jake Cormack and Matthew Hudson skippered our PG and AW Green Shield sides respectively and both showed that have the characteristics to develop into excellent leaders as they progress up the cricket ladder.

Another important element of our improved playing performance was the contribution from our coaching group led by Gary Crowfoot and supported by Dean Burke and Ray Hall. Gary is passionate about players' achieving the highest standards of performance and his enthusiasm and determination to succeed is infectious.

Our Cricket Operations Sub-Committee plays an important role working as a bridge between the players, coaches, selectors and the Management Committee. Mark Grant, Darryn Bull and Byron Hackshall again performed this task efficiently and enthusiastically. This group was heavily involved with both the strategic and operational aspects for the recruitment of our two overseas players Harry Gurney (UK) and Daryl Tuffey (NZ).

The final piece of the playing performance puzzle was provided by Phil Kelly in his role as Chairman of Selectors. Phil's even-handed approach to selections and his focus on clear communication with players was a positive factor in our improved on-field performance. Phil was ably assisted by two enthusiastic roving selectors in John Bull and Mark Condron.

We continue to benefit from the high standard of grounds provided by Head Curator Warwick Starr and his team. Bankstown Memorial was deservedly joint winner of the First Grade Ground of the Year Award while Jensen Oval was second in the Lower Grade Ground of the Year and Grahame Thomas ninth.

Bankstown Sports Women's Cricket Club, under the leadership of Rob Smith, Gary Penman and Justin Newman, had another successful season with First Grade winning an amazing sixth straight premiership. The result was again achieved despite losing a nucleus of experienced players to Women's National League duties throughout the season. Many pundits had written our side off in the Final to the powerful Universities unit, but no one should ever doubt the depth and determination of this outstanding group of players. Kerrie Dick again achieved fantastic press coverage for the side and became the first person to score a match on the new Dion Bourne Digital Scoreboard at Memorial Oval.

The Club's dedicated volunteer group remains our heart and soul. Whether it is helping out with covers on match day, scoring, providing afternoon teas or sitting on a club committee, it is the sum of all these elements, big and small, that makes the Club what it is. It is your efforts that give the Club its good name and allows our Captains and players to focus their attention on performing at their best, because they know off-field matters are in good hands.

While on the topic of volunteering, it's perhaps poignant to reflect that during the last year the Club lost four of its finest servants - Life Members Maurie Lilienthal, Bob Bower, Ian Gorman and Dion Bourne. When I joined the Club it was people like Maurie, Bob and Ian who gave me a sense of the importance of making a contribution beyond the playing arena. I wish all our young players could have known Maurie's passion for the game, Bob's low key, no nonsense approach to solving issues and what an amazing cricketing talent Ian was and just how much he contributed to the playing and social culture of the Club.

On behalf of all players and supporters I'd like to single out the following people for their special and continuing contributions:

Scott Grant continued to lead the club with distinction. Scott is highly respected by our sponsors, community leaders and senior cricket administrators and this reflects very positively on the club as a whole. When operational or sensitive personal issues arise we can always rely on Scott's calm, logical, fair-minded and inclusive approach to ensure we get a common sense solution.

Eris and Margaret Dignam continued their unselfish service to the Club and the Bankstown sporting community in general. Their efforts touch every facet of our operations from book-keeping, practice coordination, canteen operations to cleaning! Their efforts supporting women's cricket are also greatly appreciated by the BDSC Women's Club players and Committee. Margaret and Eris are unquestionably two of the greatest contributors in our Club's history.

Brian Freedman has now clocked up over three



decades of selfless effort supporting cricket at all levels. A tireless worker for the men's and women's grade clubs, Brian also sits on the SCA Committee of Management and numerous CNSW working parties. Brian has just returned from a trip to the Uganda Cricket Association where he saw first hand the operation of the equipment donation program he initiated within the Club seven years ago. Despite his wonderful contribution to cricket in Australia, it may well be that Brian's most significant legacy for the sport will be the life changing results this program is delivering for tens of thousands of young African kids every year.

MEMORIAL OVAL COMMUNITY SPORTS FACILITIES

The Club is proud to report that on Sunday March 3 2013, in conjunction with our partner organisations, we unveiled a \$4.5 million upgrade to the Memorial Park precinct. Two new buildings have been constructed, an indoor sports centre and a media centre, which also houses the Bankstown Sporting Hall of Fame and a state-of-the-art electronic scoreboard.

Memorial Oval, which was built in the early 1920s, has been the proving ground for such local cricketing greats as Steve and Mark Waugh, Jeff Thomson, Len Pascoe, Grahame Thomas and Steve Smith.

Last year, Federal Minister for Infrastructure, Anthony

Albanese, and local MPs Daryl Melham and Jason Clare announced a \$2.7 million cash injection for the redevelopment. Tony Stewart the former State Member helped secure grant funding from the State Government and the rest of the money was raised by the Bankstown District Cricket Club, with both Bankstown Sports Club and Revesby Workers Club providing significant financial assistance.

The multipurpose indoor sports complex includes four cricket training nets that can be retracted to allow the centre to be used as a common open space. Within the building there is a gymnasium, training rooms,

change rooms and a kitchen. Bankstown Girls High and Bankstown Primary Schools, located within the Memorial Oval precinct, will be using the centre sports activities during school terms.

After due consideration, Bankstown City Council took the decision the new centre should be called the John Mackay Sports Centre, a decision fully supported by this Club. During his time of leadership at Bankstown Sports Club, John was steadfast in ensuring the values espoused by its founders remained front and centre in all its decisions. The City of Bankstown and particularly its sporting communities, continue to be the major beneficiaries of this focus. Of equal importance to the financial support has been the wonderful advice and guidance John has given to sports people and administrators over the years. In our view he is clearly a major reason Bankstown enjoys such a rich sporting history. Between 1985 and 2012, through Bankstown Sports Club, John Mackay OAM, was instrumental in directing over \$28 million in financial support to more than 40 local sporting clubs.

The new Sporting Hall of Fame inside the media centre, is a visual educational resource that not only exhibits historical artefacts and memorabilia but most importantly tells the story of more than 130 Bankstown area sporting icons who helped define our nation and our community through sport.

Using touch screens, visitors can explore information on all of the hall of fame's inductees. Among them are newly inducted sporting legends: Hazem El Masri (rugby league), Ian Thorpe (swimming), Don Talbot (swimming coach), Billy 'The Kid' Dib (boxing) and Tony Cronk (Hockeyroos). Earlier hall of fame recipients include greats such as Damian Keogh (basketball), Steve and Chris Mortimer (rugby league), John and Ilsa Konrads (swimming) and, of course, our cricketing heroes.

Among the wonderful collection of sporting memorabilia on display is a cricket bat signed by the Australian cricket team (including Steve and Mark Waugh) and a copy of the score sheet from the day Steve Waugh hit a four off the last ball of the day to make 100 in the Ashes.

The building also contains a meeting space with kitchen facilities that is available for community use or educational purposes and has great views of Memorial Oval.

The new digital scoreboard will be named 'The Dion Bourne Scoreboard' in recognition of Dion's efforts on and off the field over four decades. The state of the art digital board can also be used to support general community events including family movie nights.

Mayor of Bankstown, Clr Khal Asfour, said, "Memorial Oval has played host to many men's and women's international games, Sheffield Shield matches and community events for the NSW Deaf Cricket Association, the Blind Cricket Association, and primary and secondary school sports carnivals.

"This wonderful new facility builds on Bankstown's sporting heritage and creates greater opportunities for the families of Bankstown to play sport and experience all of the highs and lows that come from giving your all."

some observations from brian freedman's recent visit to uganda



It was Steve Waugh who first said

"ANYONE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE"

The major reasons for accepting the invitation to visit the Uganda Cricket Association (UCA) during May/ June 2103 was see to first-hand how the game is being managed and developed in that country, and, to be able to reassure ourselves and our generous donors that the equipment and clothing we have collected and shipped was being properly utilised.

Only a little time of looking, talking and listening was needed to come to the conclusion that with very limited financial resources, the UCA was doing a sterling job in managing and growing the game and that the equipment and clothing that we had shipped was having a much more significant effect than we had ever imagined. Uganda is a landlocked country bordered by Kenya, Sudan, Congo, Rwanda and Tanzania. While it is a very fertile and pretty country, it is very poor with the average per capita income across the country is estimated to be approximately USD350 per annum.

An example of earning capacities in Kampala is the head groundsman at their main oval earns USD140 per month which makes it easy to understand why cricketers there do not buy many \$700 bats.

For a project like this to be effective the three elements of collection, shipping and distribution must all work. Over time the club has refined the publicity and collection aspect, we are blessed to have Bankstown Sports Club support in covering the substantial cost of shipping and the UCA are fastidious in logging every single item we send and then keeping a ledger of its distribution to either their national teams, clubs or schools.



The UCA believe the best way to improve cricket in Uganda is to grow their base. When we commenced this program in 2005/06 there were less than 15,000 cricketers in Uganda, most of whom played with "hand crafted" bats. Their official statistical return to the ICC in 2012 shows that this number has grown to 47,193 with our equipment and clothing being given as the major reason for this expansion. They no longer use "hand crafted' bats.


As well as blind cricketers, the UCA have instigated participation programs for the physically handicapped, something I am not aware we do in Australia. It is rather inspiring to see people without legs playing the game.

Literally dozens of people thanked me, Bankstown and Australia for what we are doing for them. One comment from the UCA development officer John Trust Mayeku is somewhat sobering; "You do not realise what a difference you are making to so many peoples' lives."

The visit to Uganda coincided with the African Qualifying Tournament for the ICC U/19 World Cup to be held early in 2014. Apart from Uganda countries taking part included Nambia, Zambia, Tanzania, Botswana, Kenya, Nigeria and Sierra Leonne. It would be an understatement to say their cricket associations were envious of what we are doing for Ugandan cricket. There is no valid reason why cricket clubs or associations in other Australian states can not adopt one of these countries as we have adopted Uganda.

For the record, we are well on our way to filling a 7th container.


round one next season, so that we can continue the development of our younger players.





DEAN MAGEE

Dean Magee's career with the Bulldogs commenced in 1989 when he was selected in the A.W.Green Shield team and since then has played in every grade and competition in which the club competes.

During that time Dean amassed 8461 runs of which 2529 were in first grade and he is the 5th highest run scorer in the club's history.

Telstra will be all the poorer for Dean's retirement. He had (and still has) more friends and acquaintances in and conversations about Sydney grade cricket than any other ten cricketers combined as attested by the gathering at his recent 40th birthday.

Dean was awarded life membership in 2012, a richlydeserved honour. He will be sorely missed on the playing field but we can rest assured that he will be around cajoling and urging his beloved Bulldogs on to higher honours.

JAMES BOURNE

When James Bourne was selected in the A.W. Green Shield in 1995, it meant that the Bourne name that first graced the scoreboard via Dion in 1960, would continue on our playing list for another 18 years.

Like Dean, James has also played in every grade and competition in which the club competes and his honour board entry details he has scored 5820 runs in all grades.

Highly admired for his fair and friendly approach – especially when captaining 2nd and 3rd grade teams, James again this year displayed the best of his selfless qualities by dropping himself when he believed his form was not good enough to continue in 2nd grade.

James has always been happy to assist in the running of the club, especially in tasks like managing and coaching the PG teams. Hopefully, this will continue into the future as his smiling face and good nature are a pleasure to be around.





MAURIE LILIENTHAL

Maurice Lilienthal was born in Hastings, New Zealand on December 17, 1917, one of 10 children to Ruben Lilienthal, a tailor, and his wife, Yenta. The family moved to Australia after Ruben had visited to find work as a clothing designer and a house in Clovelly. Maurice loved the sea and living near the beach, and in those days the family never locked their doors.

In the early 1930s, he started going to the SCG to watch rugby league and the major cricket matches in the summer. He saw Alan Kippax, Don Bradman, Jack Fingleton, Bill Brown, Bill

Ponsford, Bill Woodfull and Bill O'Reilly, and watched Lindsay Hassett score a century in each innings against NSW. He also saw Stan McCabe score 189 not out against Douglas Jardine's feared bodyline attack. It was important for him to watch them bat because as a young fellow he had no coaching in the game at all.

The AW Green Shield under 16s competition started in 1935. Maurice was picked for Marrickville Under 16s team, which won the competition, and Bradman presented him with his winning cap. The residential qualifications meant that Maurice had to play in the area where he lived, so he had to play for Cumberland, which was at Parramatta. In a game against Mosman he caught Stan McCabe on the leg side. As McCabe passed him on his way to the pavilion he was full of smiles and he said to Maurice "well caught".

Lilienthal left school and became a shop assistant; at about 19 he owned his own grocery shop. He worked there for 50 to 60 hours a week and played cricket on Saturday afternoons, catching trains and trams to get to matches.

In 1941, he married Gladys Goldman and they moved to Concord West, so he played with Western Suburbs as a batsman and wicket keeper.

During this time, Lilienthal became friends with Jack Fitzpatrick and they became pivotal members of the force that saw the Bankstown Cricket Club enter the Sydney Grade competition in 1951 with Lilienthal as its first chairman. Over the years, the club produced a host of talented representative and international players, including Steve and Mark Waugh.

Lilienthal was associated with the Bankstown Club from 1951 to 2001. He played in the lower grades in the debut year and was on selection committees as well as the management committee. He was a delegate to the NSW Cricket Association and in 1957 was appointed manager the NSW Sheffield Shield Team, which included Grahame Thomas, the first Bankstown player to play for Australia. As Lilienthal became a successful retailer, he was also a generous benefactor to the Bankstown Club.

Lilienthal was later appointed manager of the NSW Colts but his most important state role was as chairman of the country committee for the association. It was an onerous task because of distances involved but he realised the depth of talent available in the bush and the importance of tapping into it. Looking at the number of country boys who went on to become superstars for Australia, it is obvious that cricket promotion in the bush was important - from Doug Walters right through to Mark Taylor, Glenn McGrath, Michael Bevan and Michael Slater.

For his dedicated service to NSW cricket, Lilienthal was made a life member of the NSW Cricket Association as well as the Bankstown Cricket Club. In 2001, he received the Order of Australia Medal.

Maurice Lilienthal is survived by daughters Robyn and Wendy, son-in-law Graham and grandchildren Lyndon and Tristan. Gladys died in 1990.



IAN GORMAN

Club Members were saddened to hear of the sudden death of much-loved player and administrator lan 'Canuta' Gorman in July 2012.

lan debuted for the club in 1961-62 when he played two games in Green Shield. The following season he was a member of the Premiership winning AW Green Shield side. From 1963 – 64 Ian worked his way through the grades before being selected in First Grade in 1967-68. Ian also represented NSW Colts in the same year.

lan continued as 1st Grade wicketkeeper until the 1974-75 season when injury and illness ended his exceptional run in the top grade. Ian continued to play lower grades even helping mentor our young players in 5th Grade. Remarkably, or perhaps unremarkably for someone of lan's character, he was again selected in 1st Grade in 1978-79 before returning down the grades to skipper 5th Grade in 1981-82.

In addition to his exceptional on-field efforts Ian was a wonderful off-field contributor. He was Social Secretary for over a decade, organising harbour cruises, cabaret nights and even overseas tours. He was a Senior Vice President and served on numerous selection panels and sub-committees.

In 1981 Ian was awarded Life Membership for his sterling efforts to the Club both on and off the field.
