

The official opening of Grahame Thomas Oval in conjunction with the ING Cup match NSW vs SA was an outstanding success and highlighted how much has and can be achieved through the outstanding working relationships that exist between Bankstown City Council. Bankstown Sports Club and ourselves. The Memorial Oval precinct continues to blossom in a way that brings great pride the entire Bankstown community and be the envy of the cricket world. Eris is known, seen and loved everywhere. No better testament of Marty's vision, professionalism and dedication could be shown than his management of our ING match or his management of our indoor centre project which I can say without hesitation, would not and could not happen without him.

As noted previously, I will not be seeking re-election as President after 24 years in the role. I have been proud and honoured to lead the club during this time when we have enjoyed a good deal of success and generally moved forward.

Again I thank Marty and all who have assisted me but most of all I would like to thank my darling Rosie for her unswerving support and assistance. I could not have done it without her.

The time comes when we need new ideas, thoughts and direction and in Scott Grant's leadership, we will get all of these. I welcome him to the role and assure him of my total support.



I have pleasure in presenting the Fifty Fifth Annual Report and Financial Statement.

Last season marked the beginning of our transition to a new and exciting group of young players. This group has the potential to represent our club with distinction for the next decade. With Scott Thompson leading our on field efforts, supported by David Freedman, Mark Grant, Chris Gane and John Bull who drive our Cricket Operations Committee, there's not doubt we have a group of committed and experienced members driving the 'changing of the guard'.

After a wonderful run of victories by First Grade in the early rounds, perhaps we all thought this transition wasn't going to be as difficult as we thought. But as the season wore on the reality that such a transition requires time, patience and great effort was starkly evident.

In order to nurture the skills, abilities and attitudes of young players the Club must set realistic performance goals. And our young players need to accept that while they will get every possible support, there is a time to 'stand up and deliver' - to turn

promise into performance.

Our overall team results were somewhat at odds with what I felt was a well managed and implemented coaching and training program led by Shane Duff. Shane was capably supported by Steve Smith, Ray Hall and John Betsey. That such a high quality coaching program did not return the dividends it deserved cannot be simply written off to 'the inexperience factor'.

Shane and the coaching team, the Cricket Operations Committee and the general Management Committee have reflected hard on this issue and players will notice a change in emphasis for our coaching program in the new season.

We congratulate our players who achieved representative honours:

- Corey Richards NSW Pura Cup and ING Cup
- Aaron Bird NSW Pura Cup, ING Cup and Twenty20
- Patrick Darwen NSW under 19 side and Australian U/19 squad tour to India

- Simon Keen NSW U/19 side and Australian Under 19 side to Sri Lanka
- Anthony Sams NSW Under 17 side, Australian Under 17 squad

As always our off-field effort was a tribute to the fantastic band of volunteers that is the heart of our Club.

We successfully managed the ING Cup match between NSW and South Australia in October. Broadcast nationally on Channel 9 this event incorporated the opening of the Grahame Thomas Oval (formerly Outer Memorial Oval.) We also hosted the final of the Australian Under 17 Championships, The Albert Cup (Second Grade) Final and the SCA Women's Final.

None of these fixtures could have been staged without the support of our volunteers. There are too many to thank here but I must mention these special contributors:

Always top of the list is **Rosie Freedman** who last season added 'inspirational' to the list of superlatives we've used over the years to describe her efforts. How could anyone fail to be inspired by the

manner in which Rosie has challenged her illness. Her physical and mental strength is just amazing.

Eris and Margaret Dignam continued to contribute with distinction in so many ways. The management of our finances, ordering and stacking supplies for the canteen, training co-ordination and attending Cricket Council meetings and functions are just some of the many ways Eris and Margaret contribute to our operations.

Mick Stephenson is an iconic figure around the Club and his efforts with publicity are unmatched in Sydney Grade cricket. Mick is currently updating his book on the Club's history and we plan to publish 'Bankstown Cricket – 55 Not Out' later this year.

Sherrol Gane did a fantastic job as first grade scorer and maintaining statistics for all grades using a computerised database. The trial by the SCA of a new

internet based match scores reporting system resulted in a great deal of frustration across all clubs and Sherrol bore the brunt of that on our behalf. Despite the seemingly endless range of issues that cropped up Sherrol never lost her sense of humour and showed what a class act she is.

David Clifton is a newcomer to our Club volunteer ranks. David has designed new Club logos for use in publicity and advertising, taken photographs for special projects and more recently assisted with the graphic design layout for this Annual Report. When one considers that David was already contributing as a cricket volunteer in a number of areas his willingness to give so freely of his time to assist our club is greatly appreciated.

Brian Freedman is stepping aside as President after 24 years of selfless service to our Club and the wider cricket community. Brian's contribution to the development of our Club is without

equal. From the beginning Brian quietly set about raising the bar in terms of what we thought we could achieve as a humble little grade cricket club. His first goal was improving our finances and administration. Next on the list was upgrading our on-field playing facilities. Once those goals were achieved former local players began returning and quality new players wanted to join us. On-field success followed and we entered a period of unprecedented success. The final strategy was to redevelop our offfield facilities so that we could showcase our community and club regionally and nationally. That we are recognised as an innovative leader in Club cricket nationally and internationally is due to Brian's leadership. Brian isn't going away - he is committed to assisting President Elect Scott Grant and the Committee with the same enthusiasm and diligence that has marked his Presidency.

In writing about our season I would first like to acknowledge Northern Districts as the 2nd Grade Premiers. Congratulations to Jonathon Tait and his team for winning the minor premiership before defeating UTS Balmain in a close final.

The 2005-2006 Season was not one of our club's best, sliding to ninth in the Club Championship. As was the case last season, there was only one award for anyone connected with Bankstown at the annual Sydney Cricket Association Awards evening. That being for Warwick Starr and his team, who ran third in the Ground of the Year competition. There were no Grade Premierships (no grade in fact made a Qualifying Final), no Club Championship, no Captains of the Year, no Green Shield trophy, No PG trophy, nothing. Surely off-season planning must focus on turning this around for next season.

I would like to thank Warwick Starr, his staff, and the volunteer brigade for both Bankstown grounds and for Jensen Oval, which were always presented to a very high standard indeed. It's a pleasure to train and play on such facilities.

The 2nd Grade season itself fell short of many expectations. Provided we could regularly score 270+ runs I thought we had the bowlers to do very well during the season. Our bowling attack consistently included Fred and Scott Truashiem, supported at times by Clint Price (1st grade), Patty Darwen, Michael Polson and Daniel Moy. Unfortunately, the season showed that in general, we could not score the 270+ runs, especially after Christmas when we did it only once.

We had some memorable matches. Close wins were fought with Campbelltown-Camden and Hawkesbury in particular, while comprehensive victories were secured against Parramatta, Manly, Sydney University and Blacktown. However, it was our inability to win closer matches that cost us dearly. As is so

often the case. the difference between good season and one like ours is the win/loss ratio in the closer matches. This was best shown bν narrow losses to St George, **Fasts** and University of NSW, two of whom made finals series. is lt obvious to say, but our batting was found wanting against better opponents.


F o u r centurions

graced our scorebook this season. One each to Pat Darwen (V Sydney University) and Chris Ridley (a mighty 185no against Parramatta), while Chris Gane secured consecutive centuries against Premiers Northern Districts (123) and North Sydney (109), consequently he spent the rest of the season in 1st grade. Contrasted with centuries being scored in four matches was the fact that on six occasions we were 5-55 or worse. It's hard to win matches from such positions. Statistics across the club show that batting was sub-standard, 2nd grade fared no better. Steve Smith, our Batting Coach, continues to pull his hair out.

Later in this report are the team's statistics, showing just three batsmen scored more than 330 runs (Chris Gane, Chris Ridley and myself) and a host of players averaging under 30. In the modern day of covered wickets, it is very ordinary for a batsman not to achieve either or both of these two targets. Needless to say then, our bowling was

our strength in 2005-2006. It could have been even better had we held our catches, most often whilst fielding on the fence. Bowlers regularly bowled well together, with our spinners Fred, Patty, Pols and Chris Small, together with developing quick Scott Truashiem, taking 2/3s of our wickets. The aforementioned spinners were generally competitive with the ball, even on unresponsive wickets, while Scott's first full season in 2nd grade shows he should be working to gain a place in 1st grade during next season. His 30 wickets, including seven in the match against Penrith, showed he could be a potent force with the new ball. Five wicket or better hauls were secured by Clint Price (6-43 V UTS Balmain), Steven Burt (5-17 V North Sydney) and Michael Polson (5-66 V Northern Districts).

Keeping for us was shared during the season between Chris Gane and Anthony Sams. Chris capably took 15 dismissals (8c, 7st) while Anthony never looked out of place when taking over to capture his 8 dismissals (7c, 1st). As you

can see, most dismissals did not involve our two 'keepers.

No captain can have an enjoyable season without strong support. Special thanks to David Freedman and Chris Gane for their on and off-field assistance, but also to Daniel Moy, Pat Darwen and Brad Roworth for providing ideas and input throughout matches as their selections allowed. To Brian Freedman, Marty Klump, Eris Dignam and my colleagues on the Management Committee, thanks for again extending the opportunity to me to captain. My thanks also to the Selection Panel, chaired by David Freedman, who ensured all players were observed and given a fair hearing when determining team balance. The opportunity to think through various competing factors, and to debate and discuss cricket issues led to consistent selections 2nd grade players could understand, many thanks!

Special thanks must also go to all the ladies in the Canteen for preparing lunches and afternoon teas. It's just another reason why playing at Bankstown Oval is a wonderful experience. Last but not least, I want to thank Maree Truashiem and Lindsay Roworth for the assistance they provided the team through their scoring and managerial roles. To Lindsay go my thanks for the other thousand tasks asked of you at short notice. If I have left anyone out, my apologies. I do mean to thank anyone that assisted the team at any stage throughout the season.

Finally, I would like to thank all of the players who played 2nd Grade during this season. We enjoyed each others' company, but let ourselves down with our application, particularly batting and outfield catching. If all players, especially batsmen, looked at themselves in the mirror and thought about their performance, just 5% more application to the technical and mental skills of batting might have allowed us to compete in the Final series. Mark Grant

Mark made impressive contributions to the club on a number of levels but there's no doubt in my mind that preparing young players for first grade is his most important role. Mark again led by example on the field topping the batting averages with 342 runs at 38.0. Off the field he provided wise counsel and mentoring to help his young players cope with the challenge of playing against hardened senior grade cricketers. Ryan Beaven

Beavo came into the team after good performances in 3rd grade before taking a top order batting position in the team. His ten innings @ 23.2 against the newer ball often showed good potential, with excellent, controlled aggression a feature of some innings. However, with 60% of dismissals being bowled or LBW, all after Christmas, this presents an obvious area for improvement in establishing himself as a top order batsman. Beavo was also a keen contributor in the field, with his ground fielding proving to be very reliable.

Chris Bennett

Chris played his eight innings in the early part of the season, scoring 94 runs @ 11.8. Unfortunately, batting in either the opener or top order positions, other than his 63 V Eastern Suburbs, Chris struggled to get a start. Attention in the coming season needs to be given to getting a start (batting to 20) against the newer ball, particularly his proportion of LBWs and bowled. Chris always gave 100% in the field, possessing an excellent arm.

Steven Burt

Steven is a likeable young quick who played the last four matches with us, earning his way into the team with credible performances in 3rd grade. With 5-17 against North Sydney, Steven showed the ability to bowl line and length while

swinging the newer ball. His challenge will be to play the coming season in 2nd grade and allow his natural growth to assist him in increasing his pace. Hard work will be needed on occasions on flat wickets against quality opposition, Steven possesses the will and drive to prove his ability at this level.

Patrick Darwen

Patty's season was pretty much split between us and 1st grade. His 6 innings @ 38 included a century against Sydney University, earning him a return to 1st grade as a batsman in his own right. Patty's improvement in his batting overtook his all-rounder status, becoming dominate at the crease with an aggressive attitude for an opener. The goal for Patty is to temper this natural aggression with respect for the new ball to build consistency as an opener, essential in retaining 1st and/ or 2nd grade selection in this key role. Very capable fieldsman in any position, though his excellent hands makes the slips cordon logical.

David Freedman

Fred's an enormous asset to our side, and still bowls as well as ever. In fact, searching for a different bowling mix, 1st grade stole him for the last two rounds (where he snared eight wickets!). Fred's attacking bowling style, combined with his competitive nature, ensured he remained our strike bowler, returning 29 wickets @ 18. Not to be underestimated, Fred's catching at 1st slip remained at a very high standard, while his batting was at times very useful, best shown by a quick 25 against St George.

Chris Gane

For most of the season Chris was our wicket keeper and high order batsman. His 'keeping was always tidy and enthusiastic, ensuring bowlers and fieldsmen alike were kept on their toes. Ganey had a great second half of the season, finishing with consecutive centuries, earning promotion to 1st grade and getting a half century to boot. His 123 against Premiers Northern Districts showed the patience his game had adopted against better bowling,

while the 109 V North Sydney blended defence with aggression. 1st grade only next season Chris.

Byron Hackshall

"Ronnie" came from 3rd grade with consistent batting form, but really blossomed under the challenge of playing the higher grade. His 8 innings @ 29.5 often displayed his technical game, playing very straight down the ground and well under pressure. This was best shown in only his second innings, against Hawkesbury, where Ronnie was placed under pressure to form a partnership to win us the game. Also, once set, Ronnie showed the ability to accelerate the run rate. I anticipate Ronnie will develop into a heavy run scorer in 2nd grade next season.

Daniel Moy

Daniel's 12 innings @ 20.3 is misleading, with game circumstances of needing quick runs leading to the loss of his wicket. Combined this with two unlucky run outs, and one gets the impression his batting was better. Daniel's bowling was very important to us, returning 14 wickets @ 21.4. His ability to swing the older ball, often the only bowler who could, was vital to us in several matches, none more so than his 4-23 against Campbelltown-Camden in a very tight one-dayer. Daniel gives 100% in any position in the field. Looking forward to 2006-2007 Daniel.

Andy O'Brien

Andy played just four games with us, with work and the inability to train causing a much lower performance level than would normally be the case. With just 43 runs @ 10.8, this former high grade player grossly underperformed. Always alert and quick in the field, Andy gave 100% to his team-mates. Here's hoping for a return to the training routine and quality performances he is capable of.

Michael Polson


Mick should be disappointed with his 15 innings @ 20.6, he is capable of much, much better. His second innings 65 against UTS Balmain was outstanding under pressure, showing what he is capable of. Batting in both the middle order and as opener, Mick's task remains to convert the huge proportion of starts he gets to more than 30. With the ball though, Mick consistently bowled well to take his 19 wickets @ 26.8, including a best of 5-66 against premiers Northern Districts. A major feature of his bowling is his ability to bowl to the field set for him, especially when opening the bowling. Gives 100% in the field, but I'm looking for more runs next season Mick!

Clint Price

Clint played a third of the season with us, with the bulk of his time spent in 1st grade. Clint was a much more valuable player than his 12 wickets @ 32.8 and nine innings @ 23.3 showed. He generally bowled with certainty and authority, hitting good lengths and lines early on with the new ball, though not always getting the return deserved. However, it was Clint's batting that provided some surprises for himself and the team, often showing the type of determination and application missing from our team's batting. While in 2nd grade, Clint is very much a genuine all-rounder and an experienced, leading player in our team.

Chris Ridley

Chris was our leading run scorer, with 388 runs @ 35.3. In his first season in 2nd grade, Chris showed plenty of patience in the opening role, with none better than his 185 not out against Parramatta. Chris's concentration and application, and respecting the new ball then working it around, was a feature if his batting. If he can consistently bat long periods of time will develop into a prolific high grade run-scorer for the club. His challenge to this is to eliminate being judged LBW, with a technical flaw the



major contributor. Chris has great hands in the slips and gives 100% in the field.

Brad Roworth

Brad fought hard throughout the season to consistently score runs. At times he showed he could play well under pressure (70 V Campbelltown-Camden) yet could be controlled while attacking (55 V Parramatta, 84 V Uni NSW). Whenever there was a dubious decision given, Rowie was often on the end of it, causing his statistics to be worse than is fair. Rowie's bowling remained useful, though it is fair to say played second fiddle to his batting talent. With luck next season Brad should reap a much better return on his batting endeavours. Gives 100% anywhere in the field.

Anthony Sams

Samsy came in to the side to keep in the last four matches, and didn't let anyone down. His 'keeping was sharp, with concentration for the longer form of the game seemingly not a problem. He was equally capable when standing over the stumps or when keeping back to the quicks. Anthony's batting was also very useful to us, with his determined batting never better than against Penrith. In fact,

With 50% of dismissals seeing him caught between 'keeper and gully there is an obvious technical flaw to be addressed. On a more positive note, Chris bowled his leg spin with great effect, snaring 7 wickets at 25.9 from his 42 overs. This is an area for further development next season.

Scott Truashiem

Scotty was our leading wicket taker, with 30 wickets @ 21.7. He also was often the bowler responsible for leading our bowling attack, a tough ask in your first full 2nd grade season. However, Scotty did everything asked of him, giving 100% with old and new ball. If he can consistently bowl that awkward length, in a good line, he will soon be in 1st grade. Scotty began to work on his batting throughout the season with Chris Gane, greatly improving Chris' game and his own! With increased strength work in the off-season, Scotty can only get better. One of the few players who worked hard on his batting, bowling and fielding.

Bevan Van Blerk

Bev played five games with us, with no-one giving more effort. Bev bowled better than his five wicket return would indicate, often being the unlucky bowler. However, his effort with the new ball against St George was outstanding, returning 1-21 from his 10 overs. FIFTH GRADE THE DAVID SHERWOOD CUP

In writing about the Fifth grade season the team would firstly wish to congratulate the Randwick-Petersham club for winning the Fifth grade premiership.

This years Fifth grade made the change from the Punchbowl Oval facilities to the excellent facilities at Jensen Oval which was a good opportunity for our young batsmen to show their wares but not so good for our inexperienced bowlers.

The 2005/06 season saw 35 players turn out for the Bulldogs which is the most number of players in a single season for the ten years that I have been playing for the club and the results for the side are a reflection of this.

The Fifth grade team finished in about 14th position in the competition on 30 points with a total five wins, 2 draws and 8 losses, with two of the losses chasing 300 runs with the side just falling 2 runs short in heart breaking finishes. The team conceded 3339 runs taking 116 wickets at an average of 28.78 runs and scored 3313 runs for the loss of 141 wickets at an average of 23.49 runs.

The quality of the Jensen wicket shone through with the side compiling over 250 runs in 6 of the 10 matches that were played at home. On the flip side of the coin the team only managed to dismiss our opponents 6 out of the 15 rounds with this being mainly at Jensen which we all know is a very good batting wicket.

Not meaning to make excuses for the bowlers, but when the team drops on average five catches a match it becomes increasingly hard for the bowlers to produce that wicket taking ball especially when playing on Jensen oval.

The statistics for the Fifth grade team tell the story with only two batsmen qualifying for the averages this season namely Brad Christensen, 8 innings for 308 runs at an average of 37.75 and Mitchell Baker, 11 innings for 371 runs at 33.72 runs.

The bowling average and aggregate



was taken out by yours truly with 23 wickets at 19.17 from 11 matches. Only one century was scored this season by Brad Christensen with a magnificent 153 against Penrith in round 13. Two other players went close to three figures namely James Hopkins with 97 against Northern Districts in round 8 and David Spaul with 96 against Eastern Suburbs in round 2.

As mentioned earlier, Jensen Oval is very good for batting and this is highlighted with 10 players recording half centuries these players being:

Mitchell Baker 84, 69, 62 and 51; Lance Keen 77 and 62; Tharun Kaliyanda 83 and 65; James Hopkins 97 and 84; Tim Burns 54; Brad Christensen 65; Chris Khoury 56; David Spaul 96; Mitchell Davis 61 and Matt Hopkins 77.

The bowlers toiled away honestly all season but the inexperienced younger members of our attack found the going hard as they were not use to bowling tight lines and good lengths for long periods of time on excellent wickets to good batsmen who knew they would receive two balls an over with which to score off.

Twenty six bowlers were used during the season with a wide range of results for all the bowlers. Peter Moy took out the bowling honours with 23 wickets for 441 runs from 148 overs at an average of 19.17. Other bowlers to take wickets were Tim Burns with 9 wickets for 236 runs from 86 overs at an average of 26.22. Lance Keen with 9 wickets for 240 runs from 108 overs at an average of 26.66. Shah Khan with 9 wickets for 291 runs from 89 overs at an average of 32.33.

Wicket Keeping duties for the season were in the main were shared by Mitchell Davis and Mitchell Baker. Mitchell Davis 12 matches for 6 catches and four stumpings. Mitchell Baker 2 matches for 7 catches and one stumping.

Complete match statistics for the season can be found later in this report. To sum up the season this was the start of a very hard learning curve for many of our young players and hopefully you will be stronger better players for it.

I would like to thank club executive and management committee for again giving me the chance to skipper the fifth grade team and although we did not perform that well I again enjoyed playing cricket for the best club in Sydney.

I would now like to thank Brain Freedman, Marty Klumpp and Eris Dignam for all their support throughout the season as well as my fellow captains and the supporters of the fifth grade side.

I wish to thank in particular the many family members of the players for the off field support with afternoon teas, scoring and cleaning up of the tea room facilities your assistance was greatly appreciated.

A.W. Green Shield Report 2005-06

Congratulations to Campbelltown-Camden on consecutive victories in the A.W. Green Shield Competition.

Unfortunately, the Bankstown campaign over the 2005/06 Season was nothing short of disappointing. An unusually poor preparation during the preseason, caused by inclement weather, and the tight schedule with State and District cricket, meant that our usual development sessions did not take place, and our results tell the story.

Starting the campaign with a relatively young and inexperienced group of players, our task was made even more difficult by a first round loss to eventual finalists Gordon, followed by a close loss against Saint George, and a further loss to a strong Western Suburbs side. A victory in either of those games may have turned our season around, and the rounds after the Christmas break may have seen the boys go in with a more positive frame of mind, and in doing so, picking up a winning habit.

But, as our results will show, Rounds 4 to 6 did not do us any favours, losing to Manly-Warringah in Round 4, and then a loss to Fairfield-Liverpool in a rain shortened Round 5 clash at Jensen. A wash-out in Round 6 against Randwick-Petersham found us going in to the last Round against Mosman, without a victory. As things turned out, it was the boys best effort for the Season, resulting in a 76 run victory. In closing, to the members of the side, thank you for your participatipn during the series and I wish you all well in your future cricket careers. To those boys returning in 2006/07, I look forward to seeing you next year, and hopefully, our performances will be so much better.



A Silver year for Bankstown

As Bankstown celebrates its 25th anniversary since it was declared a City, we reflect on Bankstown's history, praising and acknowledging the achievements of the many who have developed outstanding skills and talents here.

These talented Australians come from many different backgrounds, and often many different countries and cultures - before rising to the peak of their profession. From entertainers to athletes, swimmers to singers, a leader in wemen's rights, and a leaders of the country.

Grahame Thomas - Bankstown's cricketing-great

Grahame Thomas was born on March 21, 1938 at Greydon Park - part of the Canterbury-Bankstown sporting estebnent area. He joined Bankstown District Cricket Club as a teenager in the summer of 1953, at the age of 15, and played with the Club until 1966.

It wasn't long before he was selected to play First Grade for NSW. At the age of 19, he was selected for the 1957-58 season and went on to play 100 first class matches for his bome state.

His first chance to wear the baygy green cap was in 1964, when he was selected to play for Australia in a five-match away Test series against the West Indies - and became Bankstown's first Test cricketer.

Thomas went on to play against England in the Askes the following season, eventually playing 8 tests for Australia, and totalling 325 runs.

Grahame will be remembered by countless cricket lovers as a quick scoring, devastating batsman. He has continued to give back to the game and maintained a strong interest in Bankstown cricket, assisting the Club with coaching and fundraising activities.

He has been described by England-great Denni- Compton as the best No.3 since Bradman, and by others as a *rigit-land baseman whose book shot was described as the best in the game.* Altogether be accumulated 5182 runs for Bankstown with 4244 of those in first grade, and 15 grade centuries for the club.






