


I proudly acknowledge Marty's great leadership in bringing the 57th Annual Report together with wonderful support from David Clifton on the graphic design side of things.

I have pleasure in presenting the Fifty Seventh Annual Report and Financial Statement.

Season 2007-08 was always going to be challenging coming off the back of dual first grade premierships in 2006-07. While the first grade premierships remained the main prize, as a Club we had a very clear goal of achieving a substantial improvement in our Club Championship ranking. Finishing second in the Club Championship with 1204 points (Randwick Petersham snared this prestigious prize with 1297 points) was a huge improvement from 17th position the previous season. Much of the credit for this result belongs to the Cricket Operations Committee headed by David Freedman, Mark Grant and Chris Gane who devised specific strategies and plans to overcome our weaknesses in this area.

Scott Thompson, Corey Richards and David Freedman have decided to hang up their playing boots after outstanding careers at Club. State and National levels. We have devoted some specific space in this report to recognise their achievements and we have planned a special presentation at our AGM.

But on a personal level I'd like to record my personal thanks to Scott, Cory and David for the support they've shown me and the Club in general. They are all outstanding clubmen and I have high hopes they will continue their involvement with this Club and the wider Sydney and NSW cricket scene. Cricket needs people with their experience and integrity to ensure it remains strong into the future.

On the playing side, I'd like to recognise Aaron's Bird's efforts. The dedication this young man showed to refine his bowling action during 2006 was an outstanding lesson for all young players. Rewarded with 43 wickets at 22 average, I'd like to think the journey is just beginning for this affable and dedicated cricketer.

Also noteworthy was **Dean Magee**'s 694 @ 40 average while captaining the seconds to the final and Tristan Muir's 571 at 57 average in fourth grade surely a sign of promising things to come. Anthony Sams and Steven Wise are to be congratulated after they were named as leading wicketkeeper for the Sydney Cricket Association 'Albert Cup' Second Grade and Mitchell Cup Third Grade competitions respectively.

Shane Duff's appointment to a role with the ICL competition meant we lost a true professional in our coaching ranks. It's hoped Duffy can bring back some of the knowledge and skill he gains from working at this end of the game to assist us in the future. Shane's remarkable effort in securing the Sri Lanka National Team to play a Bankstown XI at Bankstown Memorial Oval was indicative of his influence and vision.

On the subject of the Sri Lanka v Bankstown match. I must thank our amazing band of volunteers who ensured that history will record this as a memorable day for the Club and the City of Bankstown as a whole.

Similarly, the Club's effort in sending a shipping container full of recycled cricket equipment to Uganda is a project that the whole community can be proud

We believe the 'Spirit of Cricket' extends beyond doing good things on the field and also embraces doing practical things to help develop the game in countries that don't have ready access to equipment and amenities. From little things big things grow!

None of these projects, the Sri Lanka match or the Uganda Equipment Drive, could happen without the financial support of Bankstown Sports Club. Secretary Manager John Mackay, Assistant Secretary Manager Mark Condi and President John Murray are enthusiastic supporters and their sound advice often acts as a moral compass for us as we assess future directions and plans.



The glue that holds our Club together is our wonderful band of volunteers. Thank you to every person who scores, rolls out or lifts covers, works in the canteen, acts a team scorer or generally makes life easier for players and visitors. Too many to name individually here, I think it's appropriate to single the following volunteers:

Eris and Margaret Dignam - the heart and soul of the club, Eris and Margaret play a part in every aspect of our operations. Canteen, equipment, clothing, financials, fund raising and on the list goes. All done with great enthusiasm, professionalism and dedication.

Sherrol Gane sets a very high benchmark as first grade scorer and general statistician. Sherrol is extremely popular with visiting players and scorers and she always represents our club with distinction.

Mick Stephenson's efforts over more than two decades on the publicity front

were recognised at the SCA Premiers' Dinner when he was judged winner of a Phil Tresidder Media Award for 2007-08. A Bulldog legend - on and off the field.

David Clifton assisted with graphic art production for the Annual Report, designed and produced some tribute montages for retiring players and acted as webmaster for the club website. Combined with his contributions to the Umpire's Association and All Stars Winter Cricket Association, David's efforts are simply outstanding.

Brian Freedman did an amazing amount of administrative work as Assistant Secretary. Combined with his efforts on the Uganda recycled equipment drive and the Sri Lanka v Bankstown event this workload would stop most people in their tracks.

However, what many people fail to appreciate is that Brian is also a member of the SCA Committee of Management. This Committee, in my view, is the hardest working of any group in the cricket volunteering arena. This group manages the competition rules, formats, programs, judiciary etc and its charter is to represent every member of the SCA, not individual clubs. It's largely a thankless, behind-the-scenes role, but nonetheless a vital one that Brian has performed for over a decade. Brian's knowledge and experience is continually being sought by Cricket Australia as it markets its intellectual property to countries such as India and the Board for Cricket in Pakistan recently wrote to Cricket Australia requesting Brian visit them to

share his wealth of knowledge.

Geoff Spotswood took on the role of Chairman of Selectors and Chairman of the Cricket Operations Committee and he performed both roles with typical enthusiasm and dedication. Spottie also organised a re-union dinner that was a fantastic success and will hopefully become a regular feature of our social program.

Our plan to build an Indoor Cricket and Sports Centre in the Memorial Oval parklands precinct has been plaqued by planning issues due to the centre's proximity to heritage listed homes in an adjoining street and the presence of a major storm-water channel between Memorial Oval and Grahame Thomas Oval. After ten months of bureaucratic endeavour Frank Burke's tireless efforts have finally received Development Approval for the centre. Frank is now working through the myriad of planning conditions attached to the DA so that a Construction Certificate can be issued. Realistically this project will not be completed until around mid 2009.

In 2008-09 we will have a new coaching team and face a generational change in our key player roster with the retirement of three of our all time greatest players. It's time for a new breed of talent to rise to the challenge and deliver on-field success and continue to develop our unique Bulldog culture. Pretty exciting actually!



FIRST GRADE - THE BELVIDERE CUP






















SECOND GRADE - THE ALBERT CUP

THIRD GRADE - THE MITCHELL CUP AND PLAYER PROFILES

In writing about our season, I would first like to acknowledge Campbelltown-Camden District Cricket Club as the 3rd Grade Premiers. I would also like to acknowledge our 2nd grade side, whose excellent form saw them contest the final. Though outplayed in that game, Dean Magee's side had an excellent season and are rightly proud of their consistent work.

Our own season fell well short of expectations, given that we led the competition by seven points after Round 6. By season's end, through injuries in higher grades, players promoted and on representative duty, and more importantly, a lack of consistency with the bat, saw us narrowly miss the finals series.

We had some close and memorable matches, wining some and losing others. In hot conditions, our remarkable win over Manly (9-258 v 248) in round 2 saw Brent Turner star with six wickets on the flattest Grahame Thomas wicket of the season, and take a remarkable one-handed catch on the fence. Shortly after, in round 4 (one-day game) we batted under difficult conditions after a late start at North Sydney Oval, posting 8-171. With the wicket having settled down, our bowlers restricted the Bears to 141 with Danny Moy and Darren Bull snaring 7 wickets at a cost of just 45 runs between them.

Even allowing for a rain-affected season, our batting statistics show the story for the year. Only two batsmen passed 270 runs, one centurion (Steven Wise's first for the club), and below-par averages. Compare this with 7 bowlers taking significant numbers of wickets - though only one taking more than 20. David Ward lead the charge with his 25 @ 10.9 runs.

I would like to thank Warwick Starr, his staff, and the volunteer brigade for both Bankstown grounds, which were always presented to a very high standard, indeed. It's a pleasure to train and play on such facilities.

No captain can have an enjoyable, competitive season without strong



routines and match day tactics.

Thanks also to the selection panel, chaired by Geoff Spotswood, who ensured all players were observed and given a fair hearing when determining team balance. Special thanks must go to all the ladies in the canteen for preparing afternoon teas. It's just another reason why playing at home continues to be a wonderful experience. Last but not least. I want to thank our various scorers (in particular Glen Burt) and Linsey Roworth for the assistance they provided the team. To Linsey, go my thanks for the thousand tasks asked of you at short notice, even when Brad wasn't playing. We all appreciated Linsey's reliability, dedication and

all-round good humour each and every week. Given Linsey's illness this season it's perhaps best that he saw less games!

Finally, I would like to thank all of the 25 players who played 3rd Grade during this season, an indication of the turnover we experienced. We enjoyed each others' company, but let ourselves down with our placing just outside the top six. With most players indicating they will return for the coming season, with better luck on the injury front, and much more consistency with the bat, 3rd grade may well hold the Mitchell Cup after the 2008-2009 competition.

Congratulations to Scott Thompson and Corey Richards who have both decided that the season past will be their last with the club. They both leave a fantastic legacy that I hope the younger players will try to emulate in the years

to come. I would also like to congratulate Randwick-Petersham on winning the Reid Cup this season as well as the Club Championship.

Season 2007/08 will go down as a season of frustrations for Fourth Grade, – mainly on what could have been – had the weather gone our way. We finished just outside of the top six this season, which was a great achievement considering we had five games that were




Scott Thompson

Scott played A.W.Green Shield in1987/88,was graded the following season and was selected in first grade just two years later.In the following eighteen seasons which included five at the StGeorge club from 2000/01, his performances with both bat and ball statistically make him the second best all-rounder in the history of Sydney grade cricket behind the famous M.A.(Monty) Noble. In the modern era , it is difficult to imagine anyone surpassing his 8682 runs and 659 wickets.

Scott won the TNT/Bankstown Sports Player of the Year on three occasions and won the O'Reilly Medal in1998/99

He played 17 first class and 23 limited over games for NSW and was selected twelfth man for Australia A vs West Indies.

Corey Richards

Corey was identified very early as a special talent and was selected in many under-age representative teams including NSW U/17, NSW U/19 and Australia U/19 for a tour of India.

He was selected in first grade for Campbelltown at the age of sixteen where he scored five centuries before transferring to Bankstown in1996/97 and immediately established himself as a run machine. His twenty one centuries, which include two doubles, is a club record unlikely to be bettered and when his Campbelltown tons are included, his total of twenty six places him in the top handful of performers in Sydney grade cricket.

As a stylist and technician, Corey was outstanding. He played fifty five first class and eighty one limited over games for NSW were he scored ten centuries and also scored a huge century for Australia A against England in Hobart.













In his formative years, Corey's fielding was considered to be not up to standard and it speaks volumes for his application and dedication that he finishes his career with the reputation of being one of the best fielders in the game.

His 7415 first grade runs makes him the second highest in the club's history behind Dion Bourne who totalled 8149.

David Freedman

In 1979, David trialled for A.W.Green Shield as a batsman, being too shy to tell the selectors that he bowled left arm "chinaman." When the coach, Max Macleay, saw him roll his arm over in the nets, he quickly advised the youngster that his future laid in that direction and 29 seasons, 5895 overs and 929 wickets later Max's advice could be considered sound.

Along with Steve Waugh, David was graded in fifth grade the following year and worked his way up through the grades but did not secure a permanent first grade position until 1991 when under Steve Small's captaincy and support he was selected in the NSW side in December of that year.

His representative career which saw him selected for an Australian X1 alongside Shane Warne and Australia A was highlighted by his 8/49 against the West Indies which got him extremely close to Test selection

He also won the TNT/ Bankstown Sports Player of the Year award on three occasions and his 929 wickets for the club is the second highest in the club's history behind Arthur Taylor while his 474 first grade wickets places him third behind Wayne Holdsworth's 511 and Scott Thompson's 479

Although he has announced his retirement, rumour has it that Freddy might make himself available for the odd game next season when his responsibilities as NSW assistant coach allows.



Club Reunion - John Bull's 3rd Grade 1978-79

Thirty years back from the re-union on 29 February 2008 at Bankstown Sports Club, John Bull's thirds were headed for a bitter disappointment. It was the second year of Bully's 3 Year plan to win the comp and the thirsty thirds were confident of completing the plan a year early. Bull's charges had never been out of the first four all season and finished equal second at the end of the rounds. The planning that went into the premiership win would have done Field Marshall Montgomery proud and General Bull led his troops into battle each game with a salvo of wicket-taking deliveries. His medium paced cutters were at times unplayable especially on the lively Punchbowl pitch and his remarkable 7-9 off 13 overs in the semi against Cumberland was testimony to this. Some of his fresh faced young corporals were stunned when Bull opted to play the finals on Punchbowl, not Bankstown, but the master tactician rightly ridiculed these comments. J.B. had some experienced campaigners to call on for advice in the form of Sergeants Suds Sydes and Schultz Stephenson. The triumvite worked well although calls for Bull to use a third man were always treated with disdain. There were several major batting problems that faced the side in particular the nervousness of talented youngster Ross Wheatley before going into bat. Bully solved this problem quickly by opening the batting with young Roscoe who never looked back. He reeled off two centuries and captured both batting honours to complete a great season. Steve Smith posed the opposite problem to the skipper in his debut season with the club at the tender age of 16. The obviously talent-laden strokemaker certainly did not lack confidence and cruised to 20 or 30 then inevitably holed out with a reckless shot. In desperation Bully asked Stepho to have a word to the brash youngster in the hope that a former first grade batsman might get the message through. The pair chatted amicably enough but mostly about the punt then Stepho said that the guy who lets a team down is not the one who gets a duck but the one who gets a start and fails to carry on. The youngster twigged straight away and said he thought he had been going ok. The veteran then said if a team has six batsmen and two fail the others must at least get 50s to post a decent total. Smith did score 40 that day but Stephenson did not realise the message had sunk in until several years later. He headed back to Bankstown Oval and saw Steve Smith after the first grade game against Sydney. Smith jokingly said I think I have finally learned not to throw my dig away. Stepho asked him how many runs he had scored and the future test star smiled as he answered 215 not out. Three games after that Smith plundered 162 against St. George and he was on his way. Grant Pride was consistent all season culminating in scores of 59 and 37 in the semi and final whilst Tony McCann saved his best for the final with a defiant 96 that rescued the side. David Smith hit his straps against Sutherland and Wests with 68 and 48 whilst John Boyd amassed 74 against Mosman before promotion to seconds. Lee Sterrey came up from fifths but then found his way into seconds to complete a truly meteoric rise through the grades. John Bull was impressed with the outstanding talent of David Thompson but reminded the aggressive youngster in the Annual Report that it is hard to concentrate on your fielding when you are talking all the time!! Burly Greg Jameson forced his way into the side early on and his 47 against Cumberland held the batting together. Geoff Liddle and promising quick Brett McKirdy proved a formidable pace duo. Liddle took 37 wickets at an amazing 11.78 but even that was not enough to win the bowling honours as the skipper snared 45 at 11.04. McKirdy was not far behind and showed portents of things to come with 34 wickets at just 16. Bob Waddington was the perfect foil for the guicks with his extremely accurate left arm spinners. Waddo took 21 at 16 and was extremely economical conceding just two and a half runs an over. Suds was in top form with the gloves snaring 19 catches and a lone stumping and proved the ideal vice captain with oft unsolicited advice offered to General Bull. It was disappointing that rain ruined the final with Bankstown 284 and Uni 3-23. Tony McCann's stylish 96 was the feature of the Bankstown innings after a 64 run opening stand from Wheatley and Pride. The nail in the coffin for the Students was the fighting 43 run stand by Geoff Liddle and Bob Waddington. Uni started disastrously in reply when McKirdy trapped their opener in front almost immediately. The ever alert Lee Sterrey pounced on a ball and fired in a rocketlike return for a sensational run out. Then Sudsy held a remarkable catch behind from McKirdy and the innings was in disarray at 3-23. However, the rains came soon after but there is no doubt that General Bull's Townie Troops were deserved premiers and celebrations started early at the Sporties. In the Annual Report Bully made special mention of the fielding which he described as "outstanding with Steve Smith, Ross Wheatley and Tony McCann superb in the slips cordon, Bob Waddington in the gully and the old warhorse Mick Stephenson lurking in the outfield. In this area we overshadowed other teams and this together with the exceptional team spirit secured us the Mitchell Cup".











CREATING HISTORY BANKSTOWN VS. SRILANKA

History was made on the 27th of January when Bankstown Memorial Oval played host to a first class cricket match between the Bankstown First Grade side and the Sri Lankan National side in a warm up match for charity. Locals turned out in droves to witness the spectacular with over 3500 passing through the gates.

Painted faces and flags transformed the grounds into a sea of colour with fans delighted by the willingness of the Sri Lankan side to mingle with the locals, pose for photos. and meet the future generation of Bankstown cricket players: Bankstown Captain Daniel Waugh hit the nail on the head when he told the crowd 'this is our name ground and we love it, but I've never seen it look better than today." Captained by Mahela Jayawardene, the Sri Lankan side won the toss and elected to bat first, taking to the wicket prepared by curator Warwick Starr.

Aside from the first rate cricket, fans were treated to lunchtime entertainment in the form of Sri Lankan superstar Alston Koch. The ARIA and A.M.A award winner had the crowd on their feet for the performance of the chart topping single - Mural (the official song for Muralidaran). The song is a tribute to living legend Muttiah Muralidaran who has been ranked No 1. in both test and one-day internationals for an unprecedented period. of time.

Whilst the Sri Lankans took the honours with 9-274 against Bankstown's 207, the charities were the real winners on the day with \$20,000 raised for the 'Foundation of Goodness' and the Hope Cancer Hospital."

Supported by Muttiah Muralitheran, Chaminda Vass and other leading cricketers, the 'Foundation of Goodness' works to empower the less privileged rural community in Seenigama who suffered great damage

to their homes and livelihoods in the 2004 tsunami. The 'Hope Cancer Hospital' is a nonprofit organisation set up in Sri Lanka to help cancer sufferers. Their aim is to provide free treatment for the underprivileged at a 750 bed. cancer unit with modern treatment and surgical. facilities near Colombo. The project is supported by Mahela Jayawardene and the Sri Lankan Cricketers Association.

The cheque presentations were made on the 8th of February before the national media and crowd at Sydney Cricket Ground. The cheques were presented prior to the one-day match by Secretary of Bankstown Cricket Martin Klumpp and Marketing Manager of Bankstown Sports Club Chris Passanah to Mahela Jayawardene and Muttiah Muralitheran.

The Bankstown vs. Sri Lanka cricket match was a great show of community spirit and world class. cricket, it would not have been possible without all the hard work of the Bankstown Cricket Club and volunteers. Waugh praised the club's efforts on the day saying they 'proved they are just the best in the business!"

The club management also paid tribute to Bankstown Sports Club for providing staff and catering, Bankstown City Council for preparing the facilities to world class standard and Harry Solomons and Stephanie Coory from Kingsgrove Sports who did an enormous amount of work behind the scenes.


