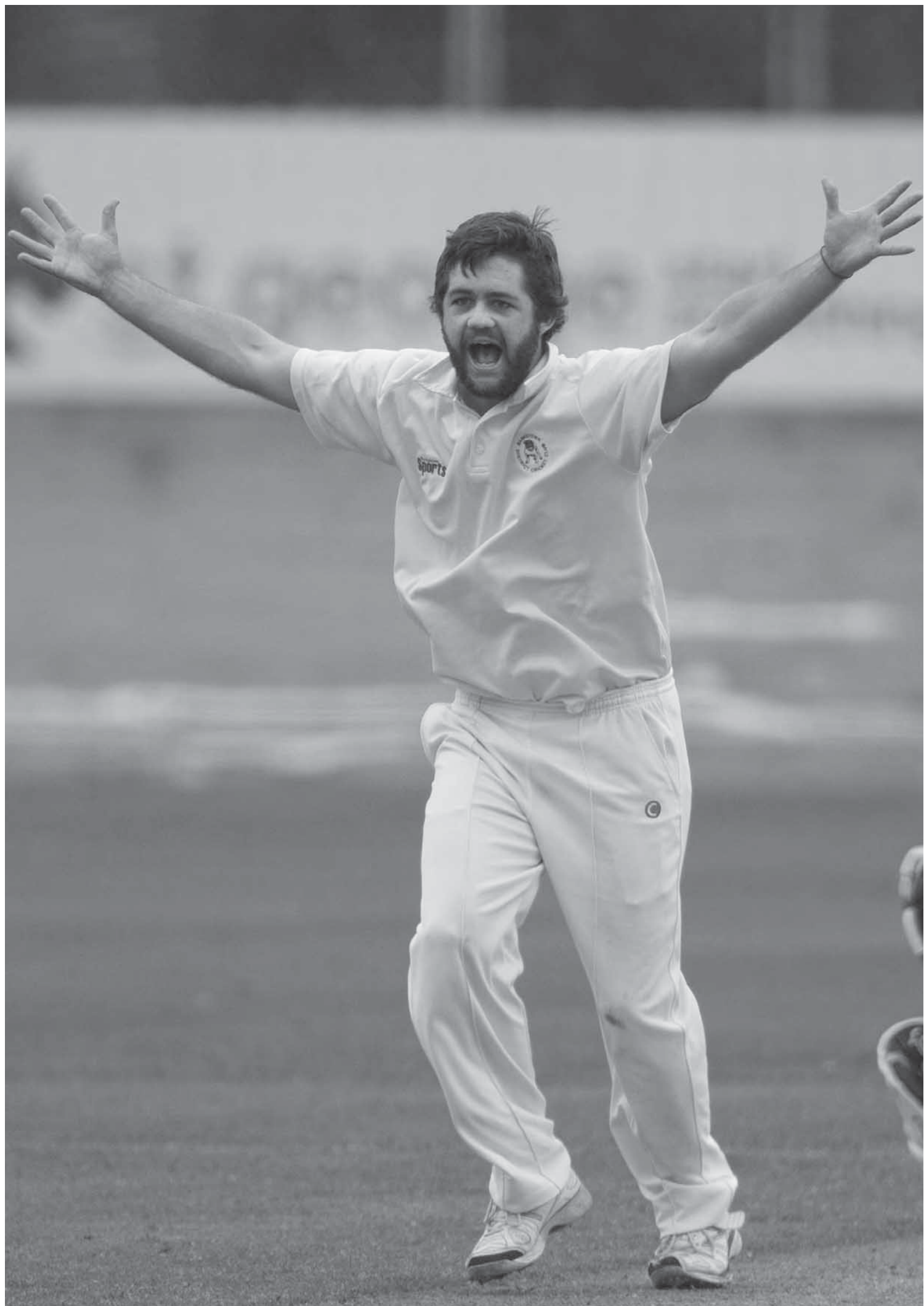

sixty-third annual report



I have pleasure in presenting the Club's Sixty-Third Annual Report and Financial Statement.

Season 2013/14 saw the Club repay our sponsors and the community for supporting our re-development program that started in 2010. This season saw the Club win both the Poidevin-Gray Shield and AW Green Shield Premierships and our First Grade fought gallantly in the Belvidere Cup final, only to lose to a champion Sydney University side.

Off the field the Club signed operating leases with Bankstown City Council for the John Mackay Sports Centre and the Bankstown Sporting Hall of Fame. The day to day running of these facilities is very time consuming for our loyal volunteers but there is no doubt managing these facilities brings significant practical benefits for our members. This role also fits neatly with our core value of being a community focused and value adding organisation.

I believe our improved results last season were heavily influenced by the enthusiasm, dedication and expertise of our coaching team led by Gary Crowfoot and capably supported by Dean Burke, Ray Hall and Aaron Bird. Gary's distinguished playing career was characterised by his dedicated approach to training and the steely, competitive attitude he took onto the field. He has instilled these attributes into our younger players and the results speak for themselves. A legend of Sydney Grade Cricket, Ken Hall is a man of few words and those he does speak are chosen carefully. But one subject Ken is always happy to talk about is how much he admires Gary's toughness and desire to win – and that's about as good a recommendation as you can get.

Successful clubs are built on the principle of having good team captains and we were lucky to have a cohesive and dedicated group last season. Jarrad Burke led First Grade with his usual passion and he was ably assisted by James Allsopp who proved in the crunch games at the end of the season that he has developed into a high calibre leader. Andrew Jamieson had Second Grade firing early but the side couldn't sustain its momentum as the season progressed. Mat Kelly is young man who is dedicated to his growing family and his vocation in the NSW Police Force, so we are very lucky that he makes the

added commitment to not only continue his playing career but also the added responsibility of captaining Third Grade. David Allsopp is another clubman with very time-consuming career obligations but when he was asked to take on the Fourth Grade captaincy last season he had no hesitation in stepping forward to help his club at a time of need. Mat Doab handled the most difficult captaincy role, Fifth Grade, with its ever-changing line-up of players as a result of changes higher up the grades, with his usual enthusiasm and dedication. Mat even planned his wedding date so as not to interfere with cricket season – the ultimate test of any grade player! After leading our Poidevin Gray side in 2012/13 Jake Cormack showed that he matured as both a cricketer and a leader and he should be justly proud of his efforts before, during and after the PG campaign, as he represented the Club with distinction in every facet of his responsibilities. Brendan Smith (ably supported by Daniel Hayes as Vice Captain) showed maturity beyond his years leading our Bulldog Pups to victory in the AW Green Shield and the State Challenge. Many good judges believe Brendan has a bright future in the game and I'm sure everyone in the Bulldog Kennel will watch his development with immense interest.

Our Cricket Operations Sub-Committee is an important part of our Club set-up, acting as a bridge between players, coaches, selectors and the Management Committee. Mark Grant continues to do a great job behind the scenes making sure our plans for retaining, attracting and developing players are well thought out and executed. In his Cricket Operations role, Mark works very closely with Chairman of Selectors Phil Kelly who, despite a period of poor health, never wavered for one second in his commitment to the Club. Phil's wealth of

playing experience means he knows the importance of having an even-handed and consistent approach to selections. His ability to develop good relationships with team captains was an important ingredient of the club's improved on-field performance last season. Phil received excellent support at the selection table from roving selectors John Bull and Mark Condron.

Head Curator Warwick Starr was handed a significant challenge at the start of last season when he was asked at short notice to conduct seven Ryobi Cup Limited Overs matches in thirteen days at Memorial Oval. As usual Warwick approached the task professionally and despite the difficulties of working with an underprepared turf square, the overall feedback from State sides was positive. Warwick receives great support from team members Darryl Thatcher and Nic Manolis and we thank them for their efforts. Warwick is aware of feedback that Memorial Oval's reputation will be enhanced by getting more pace and bounce from the wicket square and he is already working on measures to achieve this.

We are lucky to have good people like Rob Smith, Gary Penman and Justin Newman leading the Bankstown Sports Women's Cricket Club. Although the Club's run of six consecutive premierships came to an end, the Club continues to develop new talent and the future looks bright. I would also like to recognise the wonderful efforts of retiring representative player Sharon Millanta who has made such a significant contribution to the game at Club, State and National levels. Sharon has also been an enthusiastic off field contributor at 'The Sporties' and everyone hopes that after a short break, she will resume her involvement in a coaching or other capacity.

The Club's ability to attract dedicated volunteers is perhaps our greatest asset. Whether it is helping out with those seemingly menial and repetitive tasks such as laying and removing covers on match day, team scoring, preparing and setting out afternoon teas or joining the club's Management Committee or one of our sub committees, each is an invaluable contribution to the overall health and culture of the Club. Because volunteers handle the myriad of off-field requirements our players are able to focus on their match-day preparation and that undoubtedly helps them perform better.

Every volunteer's contribution is important but on behalf of all players and supporters I believe it's appropriate to make special mention of the following people:

Scott Grant provided astute leadership of our Management Committee and Cricket Operations activities and helped the Club build closer links with our key sponsors, Bankstown City Council and Bankstown District Sports Club. Scott has also been working on a sub-committee of the SCA Committee of Management developing new strategic directions

for the SCA.

Eris and Margaret Dignam have just completed 25 years of service to the players and members of this Club. With an involvement that spans collecting fees and running our accounting software, coordinating practice activities, ordering and stocking the canteen, serving in the canteen and standing on Committees and Sub Committees, Margaret and Eris are true heroes of our Club and the wider Bankstown Community.

Brian Freedman has worked tirelessly for this Club for over 30 years. Despite having served at the highest levels of cricket administration as a Director of Cricket NSW and Cricket Australia, Brian's trademark quality of 'getting his hands dirty' remains in full force. I was reminded recently that he has now completed over 20 years as a member of the SCA Committee of Management, which in my view qualifies him for something akin to sainthood. For the uninitiated, working on the SCA Committee of Management, is one of the toughest volunteer roles in cricket administration. Not only is it very time consuming, it necessitates operating in the best interests of the SCA as a whole – Club allegiances have to be left at the Committee room door. Anyone who knows Brian's unimpeachable personal integrity will understand why the SCA members have voted him onto their Committee for over two decades. Brian's passion for and commitment to the Uganda Equipment Project is just more evidence of his outstanding contribution to cricket at Club, Association, State and International levels.

David Clifton is another tireless contributor in the Club's volunteer ranks. David developed our new website and his hard work, ensuring that it always provides topical and interesting content, has seen the site achieve huge visitation 'hits'. David attends matches taking photographs for the website and local papers, he produced two special booklets that will be presented to the PG and AW Green Shield players as mementos, he acts as the go-between with the company that supplied the Dion Bourne Digital Scoreboard, rectifying technical problems and installing software upgrades and generally makes himself available to help out on Committees and Sub Committees. And of course, the quality of this Annual Report would not be anything like it is without the countless hours that David contributes to designing the document and completing the graphic design. Almost everything you see in this document, text, photos, graphics – is all David's work. Thanks David, your efforts make a huge difference to the way the world sees our Club.

Gold medal performances by a top-class trio

The Bankstown Sports Club-sponsored Bulldogs did the district proud this season by winning the 2013/14 AW Green Shield and Poidevin-Gray competitions. While our First grade side narrowly lost the Belvidere Cup to Sydney University in the most intriguing final in the history of the competition, all the Bulldog sides showed wonderful spirit and camaraderie and this aspect of the club's 2013/14 season was a delight to behold.

Given the high quality of performances during the season it almost seems to be an injustice to single out individual performances but in all the 2013/14 SCA finals, the player of the match award went to a Bulldogs player – giving the Club a historic trifecta. It is therefore appropriate that we pay tribute to these Award winners. Alex Schipp won the Cunningham Medal for Green Shield, Ethan Leten the Shane Lee Medal for Poidevin-Gray and Mitchell Phelps for his heroic effort in first grade, for which he thoroughly deserved the Benaud Medal. In the under-16 final Schipp ripped through Sutherland taking 7-10 with a superb display of swing bowling. Ethan Leten gave the Doggies just the start they needed in the PG final, whilst Mitchell Phelps kept the Bulldogs in contention with the startling figures of 6-9 and 3-27 to secure the Benaud Medal in first grade. Those awards rarely go to a player in the losing side but it was a spectacular bowling effort by Phelps in a see-sawing match.

Alex Schipp

The Bankstown Sports Bulldogs clinched the Green Shield premiership with a resounding win in the final against the Sutherland Sharks. Bankstown had gone through the competition undefeated with very decisive

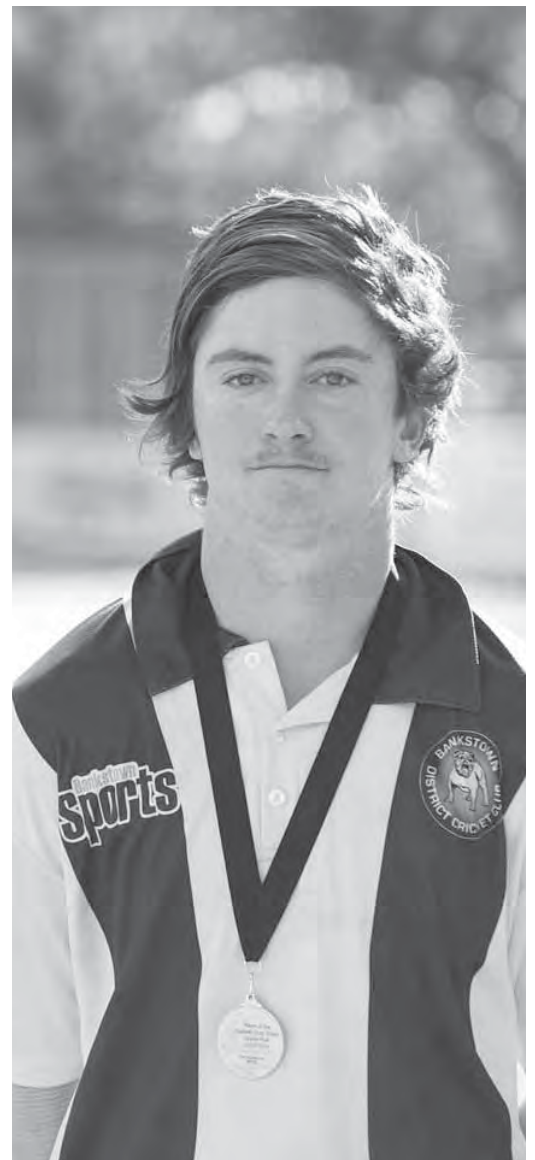
wins. The same happened in the final at Memorial Oval with the Sharks bundled out for a paltry 110. In reply Bankstown had a momentary hiccup but eventually came out convincing winners to take the prestigious Shield. Alex Schipp stunned the Sharks with a magnificent spell of swing bowling. The lively speedster claimed a remarkable 7-10 from 12 match-winning overs and at times was unplayable. Schipp moved the ball around all over the place as batsmen struggled to get the ball off the square. It was a case of Schipp sinking the Sharks. Alex was in his debut season for the Bulldogs and his ability to swing the ball late is a natural one and to see him uproot middle stump as a batsman shouldered arms was a testimony to his extraordinary talent. Schipp decisively won the Kevin Cunningham Medal for Player of the Final.

Ethan Leten

Ethan Leten has always been an exceptional talent and debuted in 2009 playing in the triumphant Green Shield side. He impressed as an opener with a solid 46 then destroyed Sutherland with an superb 112 not out. He moved up quickly from 6th grade to play a game in 5ths. Ethan was vice captain of the undefeated Green Shield side in 2010/2011 and he seemed destined to move up the grades quickly. His versatility as a very handy medium pacer and occasional wicketkeeper plus his batting and enthusiastic fielding were all performed at the highest standard. It showed just what a talent he was. The next season was a sensational one for Ethan when he became the youngest Bulldog to win the Bankstown Sports Club 'Player of the Year' Award. His classy 106 in Green Shield was just one of the many punishing knocks he rattled off during the season. Leten plundered 102 in 6th grade and two 50s. With an average of 62.5 he was quickly promoted to 5ths. A spectacular 135 and an average of 47.78 including 3 half centuries saw him promoted to 4ths. He went up to 3rds but then returned to 4ths for their finals campaign. He scored a quick-fire 69 from just 40 balls versus the Panthers and was delighted to capture 3-19 against Sydney Uni. In 2012-13 Ethan scored 402 runs in third grade and earned a game in seconds. In the P-G competition the Bankstown Sports Club Bulldogs scraped into eighth position. The Bulldogs gained the upper hand over minor premiers Campbelltown in a thriller at Raby then defeated last season's premiers Parramatta at Old King's to go into the title decider. From the outset the Bulldogs dominated the final with a great opening stand. Then the top class bowlers ripped through the Warriors to enable Bankstown to clinch the premiership. Ethan Leten and Aaron Yabsley made batting look easy as they piled on the runs in a sparkling opening stand. The duo added 107 in just 93 minutes before Leten fell for a masterly 59 that included 9 forceful boundaries. It was an innings that won the coveted Shane Lee Medal for the stylish Leten who by this time had become a regular first grader.



Mitchell Phelps

Mitchell Phelps started his Bulldog career in 2012-13 and made an immediate impact. In just his second game he captured 6-41 with his ability to swing the ball both ways. However, as with a lot of quick bowlers, he was annoyed with the fact that his batting prowess was vastly under-rated. To help prove his point, he hit the Lions champion allrounder Grant Lambert back over his head for six in the final over to give Bankstown an unlikely victory. Last season Phelps backed up his proud batting claims when he was in a record breaking last wicket stand with Phil Wells. The Bulldogs were struggling at 9-145 when the pair combined for a 155 run stand that frustrated the Bears no end. Phelps finished with 80 not out which doubled his previous highest score, The allrounder claimed 42 wickets during the season at 18 average but it was his magnificent 9 wickets in the final which will long be remembered. On a most responsive pitch Bankstown capitulated for just 82 but then the Bulldogs fought back with Phelps claiming 6-9 and Uni were bundled out for a record low 37. Mitchell embarrassed the highly acclaimed batting lineup and the Students did not have a clue which way he was going ? - a truly magnificent effort. Bankstown totalled just 98 in the second innings but the sun came out and conditions improved to enable Sydney Uni to take the title. Phelps claimed 3 wickets in the second innings but alas it was to no avail. It is not too often that a player on the losing side wins a Medal but this was the case as Mitchell was awarded the Benaud Medal as Player of the Final, an honour he richly deserved.

Our largest ever shipment to Uganda



In November our seventh shipment to the Uganda Cricket Association was a 40 foot container with the largest collection of cricket gear and clothing dispatched since the scheme was inaugurated in 2005.

We continue to receive donations from individuals, clubs, associations, schools and businesses and we remain grateful to all of them. Some supporters have donated for the second and third time, while CNSW has been an outstanding contributor from the beginning.

Two donations were extraordinary...



Triforce Sports

a relative newcomer into the NSW wholesale and retail sporting goods market, donated a literal truckload of brand new gear. Over 200 pairs of pads and a similar quantity of batting gloves together with 300 new Kookaburra harrow bats, made this the largest quantity of new gear that we have ever shipped. It is difficult to imagine both the difference and excitement this is causing to the ultimate recipients; junior clubs and schools who not so long ago were using "hand crafted bats without pads".

ABC Schoolwear

at Bangor is the family business of Gary Burling who played A.W.Green Shield for the club in the late 1950s and who is also an inductee into the Bankstown Sporting Hall of Fame as a champion Tenpin bowler. After becoming aware of the Uganda project, while taking his grandson to academy training at the indoor centre, Gary and his family donated a huge quantity of high quality school uniforms that were excess to their requirements and which were conservatively valued at more than \$A70,000.

We also applaud the Uganda Cricket Association who undertook to meet the cost of the duty for the uniforms and then distribute them to underprivileged schools and orphanages. Overall the shipment contained over 650 bats, 600 pairs pads together with large quantities of other cricket gear and clothing.

In January we were delighted to welcome Justine Ligyalingi, Chief Executive Officer of the Uganda Cricket Association who diverted to Sydney on his way to New Zealand with his national team, with the purpose of thanking the supporters of this scheme. High on his list was the Bankstown Sports Club which has met the substantial cost of shipping every container since the inception of the scheme, currently \$12,000 for a 40 foot container. Justine has since advised that the last shipment took care of 65% of the Association's national equipment needs for the year. The UCA's registrations have risen from less than 15,000 when we started, to more than 50,000 at the end of 2013 and according to them "all because of the equipment they now have at their disposal". All contributors to the Uganda project should be both proud and confident they are making a difference to peoples' lives and cricket generally in Uganda. We also donated 10 kits to assist in setting up an academy in Nepal and as always collections are continuing with the plan to ship the next container during 2014.

a champion hangs up his gloves

After a career of sixteen years with the Bulldogs, our champion wicket-keeper – James Allsopp – announced his retirement at the conclusion of the season



James played in the premiership winning A.W.Green Shield team as a fourteen year old in 1998/99 and then captained the team to another premiership the following year. He then moved very quickly through the lower grades to first grade where he been the constant for the last thirteen seasons.

Although obviously talented, it has been his commitment and work ethic that has stood James

apart from the crowd. At every training session it was taken for granted that you would see James using every minute to either hone his own skills or work with the other keepers to improve their game.

He was identified as a leader very early in his career and has captained with distinction our A.W.Green Shield, Poidevin Gray Shield and First Grade as well as NSW U/17 and NSW U/19 teams.



Respected judges believe James' wicket-keeping skills are at least on a par with those currently playing at the highest level and in the modern game, it is only his batting that has held him back from achieving first class selection.

His career highlights include A.W.Green Shield premierships in 1998/99 and 1999/2000, First Grade and First Grade Limited Over premierships in 2006/07, selection for NSW U/17, U/19 and Colts. In first grade he has played 232 matches and effected 433 dismissals, easily a club record.

The club has also enjoyed terrific support from his parents, Rick and Jill and we were delighted recently when Rick announced that although James is retiring, he was not.

It was very fitting that in his final season he was selected in the SCA Team of the Season and at the Premier's Dinner, the reception he received on the announcement of the team was an indication of the regard in which he is held by the wider Sydney cricket community.

James is building a successful career in coaching and in this endeavour we look forward to his ongoing involvement with the club for many years to come.

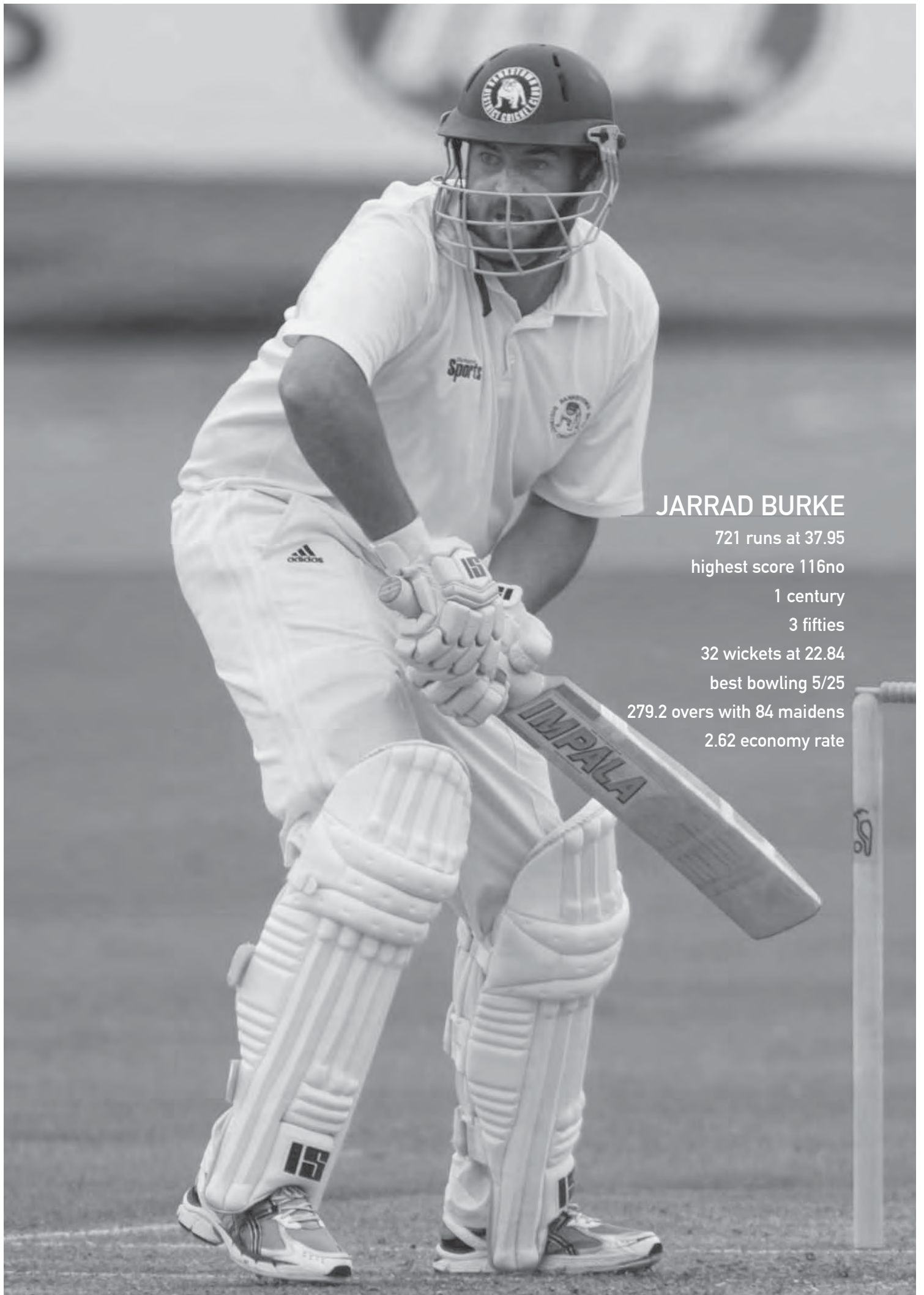

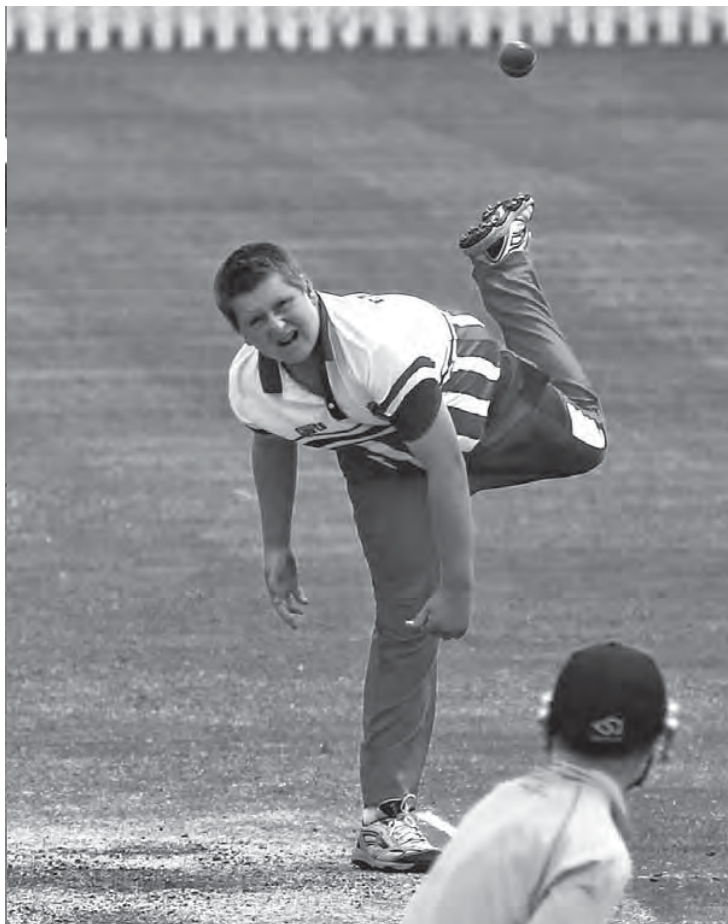


