This feedback underpins the planning and scheduling for off-season group and individual development programs, pre-season training and trial matches; it's a significant workload that Gary doesn't shirk for one moment. Gary's great mate Ken 'Emu' Hall continued his role as First Grade Team Manager and we are very lucky indeed to have a person of Ken's calibre involved at the Club.

Last season Dean Magee took over as Chairman of Selectors from fellow Life Member Phil Kelly. This role has become more challenging in recent years as the average age of Premier Grade players' gets younger and younger. This means the Chairman of Selectors role is becoming more time consuming and invovles complex and sometimes sensitive communications with players, parents and guardians. Dean brought his usual passion to the role and despite being promoted to a new job involving interstate travel, he never once took his eye off his responsibilities to the Club. Dean received great administrative support in this role from Iain Ridley. Michael Stretton capably led our young first grade squad to a commendable placing. Michael's calm and thoughtful approach to the role, combined with Gary and Emu's enthusiasm, proved a successful blend for developing the confidence of his young charges and allowing the side to qualify for the semis of the LO competition and only just miss the finals of the Bevidere Cup on quotient. A real gentleman who respects the traditions of the game, this history of this club and appreciates the efforts of our volunteers.

Joel Brockley took over the reins as skipper in Second Grade and will have gleaned a lot from the experience. Brocks is a very talented player and he gives his all every time he walks onto the paddock. The Seconds improved steadily as the season progressed and Joel settled into his role as leader. A committed clubman, Joel had no hesitation answering the call to step into the top grade when required.

Iain Ridley led Third Grade Third Grade with great style and enthusiasm. His experience shone through in every aspect of the role, be it on-field leadership or off-field administration. Iain was chosen by his peers to win the 'Player's Player Award' for 2017-18, reflecting the high esteem in which he is held by everyone at the Club. Without peer when it comes to off-field administration including My Cricket scores, Umpires Reports, posting Team Selection lists on Facebook etc. Mat Kelly answered the call to lead our Fourth Grade side despite the real strain it placed on him balancing a busy role with NSW Police and

raising a young family. While Mat's batting numbers weren't up with his stellar performances of the past two seasons, his bowling was top class snaring 22 scalps @15 average. But his biggest contribution is always the mentoring he provides for our young players, most of whom as experiencing grade cricket for the first time. It's hoped that Mat can find the time to continue his tremendous sevice to the club in coming seasons. Alex Kouventaris swapped grades with Mat Kelly to lead our Fifth Grade. A very young man to be holding the captaincy reins of a Premier Grade side, Alex learnt lots about leadership in 2016-17 and brought that experience to bear last season as he led Fifth Grade with great enthusiasm and composure. Alex's own form was outstanding, winning the coveted 'Bankstown Sports Player of the Year Award'. A popular clubman who is respected by players and volunteers. Mark Grant, Linsey Roworth and Phil Kelly acted as our Cricket Operations Sub-Committee with oversight of all on-field related matters (retention, recruitment,

coaching structures, facilities etc). Mark, Linsey and Phil worked closely with Gary Crowfoot and Chairman of Selectors Dean Magee to ensure our playing group had every opportunity to develop and compete at their best. Rob Smith, Gary Penman and Justin Newman again provided effective leadership for Bankstown Sports Women's Cricket Club. The club fielded teams in 13 separate competitions with 10 of these teams making their respective Finals. From these matches Bankstown Sports won a total of 7 Premierships - in the 1st / 2nd Grade T20, the 3rd Grade Limited Overs competition and five titles across the Under 13, 15 and 17 age group in the Thunder Girls Cricket League Spring & Summer competitions. The increasing professionalism of Women's Cricket will continue to challenge administrators and with this in mind we have initiated discussions between the Men's and Women's Clubs to develop strategies and plans to ensure we can effectively support our playing group through this transition. All amateur sport hinges on the

efforts of volunteers. Whether it's parents and guardians driving young players, helping with scoring, removing and packing up wicket covers or providing afternoon teas, we value every contribution made by our volunteers no matter how small.

Scott and Meegan take every opportunity to volunteer time and effort to maintain and improve this Club. Meegan and Scott are equally at home working on complex strategic, financial and administrative issues as they are at running the canteen or mopping the floors. High on the list of all time contributors to the Club, we were very lucky to have Margaret and Eris continue their 30 plus years of support. Whether it's ordering canteen supplies, serving in the canteen, book-keeping and banking, co-ordinating practice sessions or cleaning dressing rooms, Eris and Margaret remain key contributors to our day to day operations..

uganda



The genesis of our Uganda project in 2004 came from a chat Brian Freedman who was managing the Australian team in the ICC U/19 Cricket World Cup in Bangladesh, had with the management of the Ugandan team.

He had been surprised at how poorly equipped they were, swapping bats and helmets at the gate as they were going out to bat for their country and also surprising was that in the development areas they only had "hand crafted bats" shaped from a plank of wood.

On reporting this to the committee they decided to conduct an appeal mainly to the Grade and Shires clubs to see if we could fill a one only container with used and unwanted gear to ship to the Uganda Cricket Association. The container took over twelve months to fill and when shipped in late 2005 it was thought it was a successful project completed. The eventual arrival of the container in Kampala in 2006 was the cause of great excitement. The Uganda Cricket Association put out a press release that found its way to the Australian newspaper and the ABC news creating an interest with the wider cricket community which led to numerous inquiries as to whether we were still collecting gear for Uganda.

With this response the committee decided to attempt to fill another container and focused some advertising around the New Year Test at the SCG with support from Channel Nine and ABC radio, in particular Jim Maxwell and the late Peter Roebuck.

The initial idea was to ask donors to bring gear to the Test but when people told us they had gear to donate but could not get it to the SCG, we quickly realised we needed to have a collection strategy, a move that crucial to the ongoing success of the project. With the continued support of the cricket community it was decided to continue with the project. For the next couple of years young club members wore sandwich boards and handed out flyers at the Sydney Test however we now only have to rely on "word of mouth" and repeat donors.

The effect this program is having on cricket and the people in Uganda is best evidenced by the numbers, when we started their participation numbers were just over 10,000 and today because of the equipment they now have it has grown to just on 60,000.

As we work on filling the 13th container we should reflect on the contribution that the Bankstown Sports Club plays in the success of the program. They have covered the freight cost of every container shipped and without their contribution of over \$120,000 clearly this program could not have happened.

where are they now? **SCOTT THOMPSON**





Scott played A.W.Green Shield in 1987/88 and after being selected in 4thgrade the following season moved quickly through the grades until 1990/91 when he made 1st grade at the age of eighteen. His selection was largely based on the potential his lower grade captains saw in him and he went on to have a fabulous career which proved them to be 100% correct.

Undoubtedly Scott remains the leading all-rounder in the club's history with 6811 runs and 496 wickets in 1st grade. He played in six 1st grade premiership teams and captained the team that won both the Belvedere Cup and Limited Overs Cup in 2006/07.

He represented NSW in 17 Sheffield Shield and 22 Limited Over matches between 1994 and 2001 and was selected for Australia A versus West Indies in a match captained by Steve Waugh.

Scott was elected a life member of the club in 2007.

Scott's entry into the business world was when he joined Dunlop Footwear as a Marketing Assistant at a time they were well known for the Australian icon "Volley International" shoe and were situated at the famous Dunlop's corner (Canterbury and Chapel Rds), just a straight drive from Bankstown Memorial Oval.

As all would know, Scott's patience is not his strong suit and was soon looking for a new opportunity and joined Kingsgrove Sports Store as their first marketing manager and for his long term mentor and friend Harry Solomons, the great friend of cricket.

With this experience it was not long before former Australian cricketer Ian Davis identified some talent and lured him to Dunlop Slazengers where he held a number of positions before being appointed Divisional Manager Cricket and Golf Balls.

After spending ten years at Dunlop Slazengers, Scott was ready for a new challenge in 2003 and found an opportunity in the automotive industry at Toyota, initially working under Scott Grant. Toyota have an excellent reputation for their staff development and training strategies and this environment had Scott occupying a number of marketing and sales roles before being promoted to GM Marketing and then GM Sales. In 2016, Scott's next move took him to a role with Toyota North America for two years. Packing up the family and taking off on an adventure of a lifetime, his role as GM Marketing Toyota North America had him working on the development of Toyota's initial global marketing campaign with a focus on their Olympic sponsorship.

Returning home in early 2018 and relocating to Melbourne where Toyota is now based, Scott's current position is CEO Lexus Australia. Scott believes many of the leadership skills that have served him so well in his business career were learnt on the field and in the dressing rooms from the likes of club legends Steve Small, Steve and Mark Waugh, Ken Hall and his big brother David.

Outside of work, Scott has developed into a fitness fanatic regularly competing in triathlon events. It is believed his latest bike cost about as much as one of his Lexus branded cars.

He remains a fiercely proud Bulldog.





In September 2017 the Bulldog clan joins all cricket followers in mourning the passing of former Australian, NSW and Bankstown player Bob 'Dutchy' Holland. Bob Holland played for the Bulldogs in the 1970-71 season when he joined Bankstown Council as an Engineer. He teamed up with Len Pascoe, Jeff Thomson and Barry Thebridge to form the most lethal attack in Sydney Grade Cricket. Bob debuted for Australia at the 'tender' age of 38 and in his first class career claimed 316 wickets in 94 games. He claimed 34 wickets in Test Matches and was the West Indies nemesis. Our sympathies are extended to son Craig and the entire Holland Family.

John Clift

The Club was saddened in September 2017 to hear of the passing of John Clift, 1st Grade Cap number 27, who played with the Club in the 1950's and early 1960's. The Bankstown Club was formed in 1951 and we won our first 1st Grade premiership in 1958-59 and John was a member of that side. John was also a member of the 1953-54 Poidevin Gray Shield Premiership winning team. John was incredibly proud to of his time playing with Bankstown and all the friends he made. Along with his son Tony, John attended several reunion events with and enjoyed the company of many of his former team mates including Australian representative Grahame Thomas. Jack expressed his wish that several of his beloved items of Club memorabilia, included his 1st Grade Premiership Blazer, are donated to the Club and we are honoured to accept this thoughtful bequest. where are they now?

The most successful businessman in the history of the Bankstown Cricket Club is Frank Cicutto - the Italian-born man who grew up in Punchbowl. From being one of the youngest-ever branch managers at Bankstown and Milsons Point the shrewd businessman rose to become il Supremo of the whole National Bank. Frank was a hard-hitting opening batsman in first grade and was involved in two century stands in 1977-8. He was at his aggressive best and such was his the brilliance of his batting he even outscored the dashing Steve Small. The very popular Cicutto compiled a devastating 79 versus Northern Districts in his century stand with Bob Vidler at the SCG. Frank brought the crowd to its feet when he launched himself into a spectacular six which soared high into the Ladies Stand. In 1979 he provided a delightful cameo when he plundered a quickfire 42 which included three towering sixes. He valued all-rounder status with his deceptive mediums. Whenever the subject came up he was quick to point out he had claimed the scalp of Aussie opener Rick McCosker. Frank was Secretary of the Club for two seasons before being transferred to Melbourne as a boost to his banking career. Before he left he revealed a devilish sense of humour. When asked about the financial position of the Club, he replied the liquid asset situation was extremely sound.

This was in the form of fifty cases of beer stored in the Cicutto hacienda bought to beat a proposed tax hike!! Frank suffered the most diablolical injury in the Bulldogs' cricket history. Fielding at silly mid-on a savage pull shot crashed into Frank's head. In the days before helmets, the ball rebounded over point and Frank was rushed to hospital. It proved to be a fractured skull and he could not talk coherently for 12 months. For him to fight back and reach the top of the competitive banking industry was amazing. The Cicutto's son Andrew was born in November 1987 - just before Frank was posted to New York to run the American operations. Frank, Christine plus Andrew returned to Melbourne for two years then Frank was sent to Sydney to take control of NAB N.S.W. In 1994, the family headed to Scotland where Frank managed the Scottish, English and Irish Banks. In 1996 they returned to Melbourne and in 1999 Frank became CEO of the NAB - which was a wonderful achievement.

In retirement he still found time to run a car lease company and his business acumen was quicky snapped up. He was a director with St. Vincent's, Run Real Estate and Melbourne Business School. Andrew is getting married in December 2018 and has his Dad's business flair.



Canterbury Bankstown City Council's Strategic Plan had led to the installation of a new turf wicket square at Kelso Park North, East Hills. Completed in March 2018 this project will add another dimension to Kelso Park sports precinct, which currently supports softball, baseball and AFL. Depending on how the wicket table settles, it is possible we may play some lower grade matches at Kelso North in the latter part of 2018-19 season. CB City has also installed new water tanks and will be upgrading storage facilities at Kelso North to support our move. The turf wicket square at Jensen Oval won't be removed until Council is 100% satisfied that Kelso is fully operational. Curator Mamolis has been appointed to take over the new Kelso North venue and we all feel terribly for Nick who will have to travel about three minutes every day to work!

Grahame Thomas Oval is a not an enclosed ground and its location within a high density housing area means it gets a huge amount of recreational use. Despite this constraint, Warwick and his team always ensure that grade training

facilities and match wickets at GT Oval are of the highest order. Canterbury Bankstown City Council has issued another tender for the redevelopment of the GT Oval turf practice area to include raised fencing, lockable gates, upgraded internal lane and overhead nets. This project has been plagued with disruptions with Council unable to find contractors that can meet the tender requirements but Council's goal is for the new facilities to be operational for the start of next seson.

The Club places on record its genuine thanks to Head Curator Warwick Starr who is ably supported by Nick Mamolis, Shaun Thornton, Darryl Thatcher and Neville Rae. We appreciate the efforts of this group very much and enjoy the friendly working relationship we've established over many years. The Club also manages under license from CB City Council the John Mackay Centre, The Sporting Hall of Fame and Stephen and Mark Waugh Pavilion. These facilities support Men's and Women's Premier Grade Clubs as well as a range of other community hirers including Bankstown Public School, Bankstown Girls High School, Berala Public School, RSAC Disabled Cricket and NSW Blind Cricket Association. The Club also collaborated with CB City Council to host a very successful Youth Week 'Movie Under the Stars' Night at Memorial Oval in April and we hope this type of activity can be expanded in future.

Thanks to David Clifton's sterling effort we were able to live stream the full Belvidere Cup final and the quality of the broadcast received high praise locally and from several overseas viewers. We hope to have this equipment installed permanently over the off-season with a view to live streaming all Premier Grade matches at Memorial as well as special matches and events.

The Club was pleased to provide access to the John Mackay Centre during last season for a group of new junior cricketers from Lakemba Sports Club. These boys were new to cricket but with support from their enthusiastic parents and weekly access to the Indoor Centre, both the U11 and U13 teams reached the Grad Final, with the U13s being successful. This is a great case study in helping support the growth of the game across non-traditional cricket cultures and we congratulate Tanvir Ahmed and Mohammed Harris for their initiative in growing the game in the Lakemba area.

Our bowling philosophy this year was to try and build pressure by bowling tight lines and lengths, and we would generate wickets from frustrating the batsmen. This is displayed by all our front-line bowlers conceding less than 4 runs per over, while picking up wickets at regular intervals.

Our pace attack was led by Alex Schipp and Dayne Heward. Both these boys bowled well in partnerships and often made the early breakthroughs we needed. Their ability to bowl long, consistent spells

Their ongoing passion for the club and ensuring that training was up-and-running smoothly, as well as on gameday is something that will never be matched – as a club we are all extremely fortunate to have them around.

I'd also like to thank the coaching staff for their efforts. Crowie's efforts from well before the pre-season started, right the way through every session were fantastic, and are as much of the reason for the club's success this year. To James Bourne, thanks for all your efforts in your first season in that role, in particular getting us all running around in our fielding drills and making sure we were all getting something out of each session.

In closing, as a club we are building each year, and with the progress we made this year, I don't think a Premiership is too far away. Its an exciting time to be around the club, and competition for spots is as tough as ever. Enjoy your off season and hopefully we'll be seeing you all next season.



PLAYER PROFILES Cameron Cotter

Cameron in his second year of Green Shield as a player came into the competition in good grade form, demonstrating leadership skills that saw him elected as the side's captain. Cam led by example either in the field, with the ball or bat – his 'follow me' approach saw him come on to bowl when the going was tough or to take some good catches at slip and play the quarter final with six stitches in a laceration on his leg. Cam started the season on fire with both bat and ball with scores of 35 runs, 3 for 17 in round 1, 57 runs 1 for 23 and two catches in round 2, 108 runs and 1 for 13 in round 4. His partnerships with Zeeshaan were first rate. The remainder of matches tapered off but he still amassed 254 runs for the season with an average of 36. With the ball he took 5 wickets for 126 runs for an average of 25.20 and an economy rate of 4.91. Cam has finished his time in Green Shield and is looking at a promising future in Grade Cricket.

Zeeshaan Ahmed

Zeeshaan - in his second year with the team - was our top batsman; a NSW U15 player with Niv and Brad; and, was selected to play for the Northern Territory at the U17 Championships last year. So, Zeesh bought the big game experience we needed. Opening the batting regularly in second grade Zeesh - like Cameron - brought class to the top order. With scores over the eight rounds of 46, 32, 4, 154no, 13, 3, 24 and 69 for a total of 345 runs at an average of 57.50, Zeesh was placed second in the competition and was selected in the Merit Team. Blake Pearson

Another new face to the club, a tenacious young guy who can play again next season, the paceman regularly opened the bowling. With his fluid style, Blake picked up 6 wickets for the season, with a best bowling of 3 for 27 an average of 25.20 and an economy rate of 4.08. Blake continues to impress in fifth grade, and as his experience increases and develops in size and strength and increases his consistency, he will be a top-line bowler. Blake is also a very handy batsman at the tail – having saved the side a couple of times with elegant cover drives - showing maturity and the single-mindedness on knowing when not to play a shot on a difficult pitch – a good lesson to some of our more accomplished batters. Blake hit the winning runs



with a four off the third last ball of the innings to secure a 'must win' match against Sydney to make the Quarter finals. Look forward to watching him develop.

Dean Bennett

Dean was the club's first country player selected in our Green Shield sides, hailing from the Griffith area. Dean has had tremendous success in the country as a batsman and spin bowler, and he looked to develop his skills in the Green Shield competition. An easy to get along with player who fitted in quickly with the group despite not being able to train with them. Dean was well supported by his family who religiously made the trip to Sydney for the matches. Dean batted in the top order and found the going tougher than perhaps he was expecting. Got a couple of starts including one innings of 44 against Mosman for a total of 77 runs and average of 12.83. He was super sharp in the field and took some top level catches. With the ball he tied up a couple of sides with his dart style spin, taking 6 wickets with best bowling of 3 for 18 and an average of 13.75 and an economy rate of 2.89. Unfortunately, Dean was too ill for the Quarter final - his on-field presence was sorely missed.

Liam Sutton

Liam was with the side as a development player last year and Coach Ray Hall saw his potential and called him into the playing



squad early on with his elegant batting style and classic shot making. Bigger and stronger this year, Liam returned as one of the top order batsman, but who was probably disappointed with his form. Batting anywhere from opener to five, he had his first hit out against Gordon coming in at 5 and scoring a classy 27 till run out with a very poor decision. Able to play another season in Green Shield the talented player is able to bowl spin with both hands and is a top-order batsman. Scoring 148 runs and opening the batting with an average of 21.14, Niv would be disappointed with that total. He showed glimpses of his potential with a rapid-fire 67 against North Sydney. Had a couple of starts with the bat but couldn't convert those. With Niv you feel a big score is on the cards each time he bats. With the ball he took 9 wickets with best bowling of 2/21, an average of 19.17 and economy rate of 2.86. Niv also showed leadership skills and took control of the bowling attack in the quarter final while Captain Cotter was off the field with his injury. Look forward to watching Niv who is destined for higher level cricket.

Jakob Eljed

Jakob's second year in the side and one of the senior players. Jakob is a cool customer who was either our opening or first change fast bowler. The left armer can swing the ball a mile and ended the rounds as our leading wicket taker with 12, an average of 21.17 and economy rate of 3.92. Jakob had a best bowling of 5 for 24 against St George in the opening round – getting the side off to a tremendous start. Hard work over a number of years showed with his batting. As he sured up the end of the batting, he batted in four innings





with two not outs for a total of 22 and a highest score of 12 no and an average of 11. The family have moved to Qld and Jakob and his father flew back for the quarter final showing their level of commitment to the side. Wish Jakob his parents and sister all the best with their new life in sunny Queensland.

Nathan Sadananadan

The quiet achiever, Nathan was with the side as a development player last season and has developed his skills well as a top order batsman and medium-pace bowler. Nathan is also ruthless in the field. Has another season to go in Green Shield and played a secondary role to many of the senior players. Nathan played 4 innings with the bat, had 3 not outs and a total of 7 runs. A top score of 3, never complained even though his opportunities were scarce. He bowled 9 overs for 2 wickets and 34 runs with an average of 17 and an economy rate of 3.78. With the bat, patience is the key for Ethan as he has all the shots and is fast between wickets. There were glimpses of his skills with the bat scoring 72 runs with a highest score of 24 and an average of 12. This was Brad's last year in Green Shield and we wish him well playing in Melbourne for the Australian U16 side against Pakistan in April.

From these matches Bankstown Sports won a total of 7 Premierships - in the 1st / 2nd Grade T20, the 3rd Grade Limited Overs competition and five titles across the Under 13, 15 and 17 age group in the Thunder Girls Cricket League Spring & Summer competitions. Special mention to 1st grader Emma Newman who once again this season has been a great coach and mentor for many of these young players. Special mention as well to 2nd Grade Captain Ellie Newsom who also coached one of the Thunder League teams. It says something about our club when players are so willing to give back in this manner.

Although they didn't contest any finals this season our 2nd Grade and Brewer Shield teams once again played some very good cricket and most importantly continued to develop their skills both at training and on game day, as well as most importantly enjoying themselves. A number of the 2nd grade, 3rd grade and Brewer Shield players also played in other grades which assisted their skill development and enabled us to field full teams.

1st Grade made the finals in the 50 over competition unfortunately losing the semi-final to St George Sutherland. 3rd Grade also made the grand final of the T20 competition which they also lost to St George Sutherland.

Once again a number of players within our club achieved elite level selections this season including playing in the WNCL and WBBL03 competitions – details are later in this report. We are extremely proud of all players









who have played at representative level either in Open or Under Age competitions.

Our club also congratulates the Bankstown Men's Cricket Club on another successful season. We are very appreciative of the support we receive from the Men's Club – our club is extremely privileged to be associated with such a supportive Men's Club.

Recently our club nominated 29 players for the Cricket NSW Underage Academy Squads for 2018/19 – these squads cover U/13 through to U/18. Last year there were 19 players from our club in these squads – by far the most of any Grade club. We wish all players nominated for the coming squads every success.

Our club was again fortunate to have very strong Management & Operations Committees supported by a willing group of volunteers (including from the Bankstown Men's Cricket Club) who enabled the club to operate very smoothly from a club administration perspective. Our appreciation is again extended to these people who very willingly gave up their valuable time to support our players, enabling them to focus on playing their cricket to the best of their ability. Also during the season there was a significant change in our club structure within the Bankstown Sports Cricket Club which resulted in the formation of the Women's Club as a separate entity.

Once again this season we were very pleased to have Dot Brewer OAM supporting our club.
