OBITUARY

KEVIN McCORMICK OAM

The passing of Kevin McCormick on 17th May 2012 saw Bankstown lose one of its favourite sons and a most respected citizen – while our club lost a friend, mentor and patron.

Kevin was a Founding Member of the Bankstown Sports Club and held his Membership No. 2 for almost sixty years. The club has decreed that this number will never be re-issued. He served on the Board for 39 years and was President for 20 years until his retirement in 2006.

His period of leadership coincided with the remarkable growth of the club, but at the same time, ensuring the Board never lost their focus of supporting sport and the general Bankstown and wider communities in very substantial ways. Bankstown Hospital and Bankstown City Aged Care are but two organisations that have benefited from Kevin's interest and the club's support.

Although he followed numerous sports, cricket was clearly his favourite and he spent many happy hours at Bankstown Oval barracking for 'his' Bulldog cricketers. Many have happy memories of him being very involved in premiership winning celebrations.

With the upgrading of facilities at Bankstown Oval in 2000, the club was delighted when Bankstown City Council accepted its suggestion that the new grandstand be named in his honour, something of which Kevin was immensely proud.

Upon his retirement in 2006, our club was privileged to host the Kevin McCormick Tribute Luncheon in the Steve and Mark Waugh Pavilion. The attendance of such a varied group of friends and acquaintances and the sentiments expressed at this sellout function was a clear indication of the esteem in which he was held

Kevin was awarded the Order of Australia Medal (OAM) for his service to the community and the Registered Clubs movement and remained a Patron of our club at the time of his death.

Outstanding eulogies were delivered at Kevin's funeral on 25th May, 2012 by his brother Keith, Dr. George Kourtesis and the President of Bankstown Sports Club, John Murray.

A great friend whose gentle nature and enthusiasm for everything Bankstown will be sadly missed.

president's report



Community – congratulations to all those involved in the numerous activities that set us apart from others: the Uganda cricket appeal; the women's cancer fundraising effort; the support & development of women's cricket; and, the successful hosting of the NSW v SA first class match at Memorial Oval where facilities and general match presentation received high praise.

The 2011/12 season was one of the most challenging on record for the Bankstown District Cricket Club (BDCC). It was a season where our results were lower than expected, a season where our high expectations based on recent success in Green Shield & PG didn't translate into higher grade results and our spirit of cricket outcomes remained in the lower end of the table.

With a significant amount of change across the sport sector (NSWCA & SCA) and within the club itself, we have much to be proud of. I believe the club is well positioned for the coming years, when considering our approach to coaching and development of young players and the substantial indoor facility now under construction.

It was the 5th year of implementation of the club's strategic plan which brought with it unprecedented levels of complexity. Congratulations also to Daniel Sams, Ben Smith and Daniel Solway for selection in NSW aged teams – it is a rare and inimitable feat – something you should be very proud of.

Coaching - congratulations to Crowy and his able assistants for engaging participative sessions each week.

Ground presentation – congratulations to Warwick and his team for the superb condition week in week out across the three grounds.

Future priorities

Our emphasis now is on implementing our new plans, delivering key programs, supporting our coaching and development personnel to deliver participation and high performance outcomes (as well as building their capacity) and, building collaboration, alignment and effectiveness across our community. I am energized by the frenzy of activities already in place to position us for next season.

Sponsors and supporters are invaluable to any club and we are indeed fortunate to be surrounded by so many committed 'friends' – we couldn't exist without you and your contribution and support is acknowledged. I have pleasure in presenting the club's Sixty-First Annual Report and Financial Statement.

I'd like to start by congratulating James Allsopp on his achievement of leading first grade for the past four seasons. James took over the captaincy in challenging circumstances as we embarked on a period of significant re-building following the retirement of several experienced players. As a skipper James has always displayed the same enthusiasm, commitment and tenacity that has been a hallmark of his performances as a player. James maintained an air of dignity, even if the side wasn't performing to expectations and he always rated highly in umpires' captain's assessments. James is a committed Bulldog and it's great news that he will continue playing in the top grade. James has a passion for coaching and junior talent development and there's no doubt he has big contribution to make in this field in the years ahead.

James Bourne's enthusiasm and genuine interest in people has cemented him as one of the most popular players at the club over the past decade. Second Grade had a disappointing season but was in no way a reflection on James' ability or commitment. James' affable nature belies his fiercely competitive drive and will to succeed. He is a loyal and dedicated Bulldog who loves nothing more than helping develop young cricketers to value loyalty, mateship and teamwork. As part of his wider commitment to the club, James again acted as Manager of our Poidevin-Gray squad last season.

It's a great fillip for our culture and tradition when sons of former players rise to leadership roles at the club. Just as James Bourne has followed club great Dion into a leadership role, Mat Kelly created another special piece of club history last season by following in the footsteps of his famous dad Phil – skipper of our 1989-90 premiership-winning Mitchell Cup side. Mat is a positive role model for our young players both on and off the field.

lain Ridley transitioned from skippering Fifths in 2010-11 and kept Fourth Grade in the hunt for a finals berth until late in the season. Iain is very committed to contributing to a winning culture at the club. He thinks deeply about his cricket and has a real desire to help young players gain the skills and knowledge they need to move up the grades.

Mat Doab took up the reins of Fifth Grade after skippering our Metropolitan Cup side for a couple of years. Akin to 'jumping from the fat into the frying pan' as the saying goes! Any Fifth Grade skipper in the SCA will attest to the difficulties of being 'at the end of the club food chain'. Player changes as the result of last minute injuries in higher grades meant Mat was always organising and re-organising, planning tactics and re-planning tactics. Chairman of Selectors Dion Bourne is full of praise for the professional way Mat discharged his responsibilities on and off the field.

Ray Hall clearly has a special talent for coaching and developing young cricketers and this was evident in his efforts with this season's AW Green Shield side. I popped into Memorial Oval early on Christmas Eve last year only to see the AWG squad sweating it out from training in very hot conditions. I must say my initial reaction was "gee Hally you're a tough task-master"! But, after watching and talking to some of the boys, I realised they absolutely loved every minute of the session. Everyone had a job to do and they did it with total enthusiasm. The boys were running the session – they were challenging and encouraging each other and setting a standard that frankly would rival the intensity of many first grade warm-ups. We

may not have won our third straight AWG premiership, but Ray and the boys built a great base from which to win another one soon. Mark Condron did a great job supporting Ray and the team in his role as AWG Manager/Scorer.

The club was very fortunate to have the services of Life Member Gary Crowfoot in the head coaching role. In recent seasons, Gary has shown his coaching credentials are of the highest level with successful stints at St George and with CNSW elite age squads. Gary brings to his coaching the same dogged attitude that marked the countless hours he spent at the crease batting for his beloved Bulldogs. Above all, Crowie is a winner and with time and the right support, I have absolute confidence he will lead us to premierships in both first and lower grades.

Dean Burke provided Gary with valuable support in the coaching ranks and his ability to develop a positive rapport with players of all ages will be great asset in the coming seasons.

Memorial Oval and Jensen Oval came second in the SCA First Grade and Lower Grade Ground of the Year Awards respectively and our thanks and congratulations go to Warwick Starr and Nic Mamolis for their dedication to providing high quality wickets and outfields – especially in a season that was so badly rain-affected. Memorial Oval again hosted a range of elite cricket matches including a successful NSW v South Australia Sheffield Shield match.

Bankstown Sports Women's Cricket Club, under the leadership of Rob Smith, Gary Penman and Justin Newman, had another successful season with First Grade winning a fifth straight premiership. The fact the Club managed this result despite losing a nucleus of experienced players to Women's National League duties throughout the season is further testimony to quality of the achievement. Kerrie Dick is to be congratulated for the outstanding press coverage she has achieved, raising the profile of women's cricket in the district to an unprecedented level.

Following several years of dedicated effort by our Patron Daryl Melham, the Club was finally successful in achieving \$2.71m in funding under the Australian Government's Regional Infrastructure Development Program. This grant has been allocated to support the development of a community indoor sports centre and amenities building at the southern end of Memorial Oval. We expect the new facilities will be operational by November and a special section

in this report provides a full update on the project's progress. There's no doubt the new facilities will present the Club with an opportunity to broaden our operations and we have started a formal planning process to ensure we can manage these facilities in a manner that benefits all community stakeholders.

Our volunteers remain a prized asset and I thank everyone who has helped in any way, whether it was by holding a formal committee position or just lifting covers, scoring or bringing afternoon tea to games. These seemingly little things are what sets us apart and we should always strive to excel at them.

On behalf of all players and supporters I'd like to extend special thanks and admiration to the following people:

Scott Grant continued to provide exceptional leadership across all facets of our operations. Scott's ability to direct our operational issues while keeping a strong focus on key strategic goals is one of our greatest assets. Because a lot of Scott's work for the club is behind the scenes, few people see or understand just how much time he contributes to ensuring the club is successful. We are very lucky to have someone with Scott's cricket and business experience leading the club.

Margaret and Eris Dignam are the heart and soul of the club. They stock and run the canteen, collect fees, keep our accounts intact, co-ordinate practice sessions and represent us at civic and sporting functions. I don't have enough words or the right words to do justice to their contribution – they are truly living legends of our club.

Brian Freedman has just completed 30 years of continuous, high quality, service on the club's Executive (as President and Assistant Honorary Secretary). Brian's current title of Assistant Honorary Secretary is a complete misnomer as he really provides a huge amount of practical support to both Scott and me in our roles. Brian also serves on the Committee of Management of the SCA, a role that takes a huge time commitment for very little thanks. After a decade of planning, wishing and hoping, I know Brian is thrilled that the building program at Memorial Oval has finally started. Most days he finds an excuse to visit the oval and report back on progress, and his enthusiasm about the new facilities is certainly infectious.

Mark Grant, Darryn Bull and Byron Hackshall made up our Cricket Operations Committee working with



the Management Committee to ensure all player and on-field related issues were dealt with effectively and efficiently. This trio puts in a significant amount of time and effort both in the off-season and during the season proper. They bring current player perspectives to the table and that helps to ensure the Management Committee remains 'in touch'.

Season 2012-13 will see the opening of the new facilities at Memorial Oval and that of itself will be the culmination of a decade of planning and itself a cause for considerable celebration. However the real measure of our success will be how well we perform on the field.

We have the right coaching structure and personnel.

We have a solid player roster.

We have a level of off-field personnel and facilities support that most clubs only dream about.

We'll need to be very creative with our excuse making if we fail to deliver to expectations!

MEMORIAL OVAL COMMUNITY SPORTS FACILITIES PROJECT UPDATE

We are pleased to report that construction of the much-anticipated Community Indoor Sports Centre and Sports Education Centre based at Bankstown Memorial Oval commenced in March 2012.

BDCC will manage the new facilities on behalf of the wider community under a Management Rights Agreement with our principal partner in the project, Bankstown City Council.

The new Indoor Sports Centre will provide four indoor cricket lanes, similar in style to those at the Cricket NSW Centre of Excellence at the SCG. We anticipate the indoor centre will be used on a regular basis by adjoining schools, Bankstown Girls High and Bankstown Primary, as well as supporting other compatible sports and recreation related community activities.

The Sports Education Centre will provide extra Clubroom facilities for BDCC and will also act as a media centre for representative matches. This building will also be the home for a re-vitalised Bankstown City Sports Hall of Fame, featuring interactive kiosks similar to those used at the Bradman Museum.

The new facilities will be a central element of a new integrated sports and recreation precinct that includes Grahame Thomas Oval, Bankstown Memorial Oval and Bankstown City Gardens. In time, new walking tracks and bridges will integrate these wonderful community assets to provide a multi-functional resource for all community members.

Ten years in the making, this project is the culmination of a huge amount of work from a dedicated BDCC Management Committee but it would not have come to fruition without the vision and practical commitment of some very special people and organisations:

He wanted me to pass on his personal and team appreciation for the equipment that has been sent over. It has really helped the development of cricket in Uganda. He




mentioned that several of his national players use some of the equipment received to date and how it has made a difference to them.

This season is best described as a rebuilding year, after losing a number of players from the previous year. With the youngest Third grade side, some very talented young cricketers were given opportunities at higher level. Coming up against experienced players seemed to prove the difference, although some outstanding performances were recorded. However, consistency was missing – reflecting where we ended on the ladder.

Round One saw us lose our first four wickets for 30 runs – unfortunately, this summed up our year, being either hit or miss – completely dominating opposition (Campbelltown 5-393dec and Sydney Uni 1-155 off 20 overs). However our batting proved far too brittle against consistent line and length bowlers and our top six were caught behind far too often. An improvement in shot selection is necessary to become more consistent – learn to let the ball go. Only one of the top six averaged over thirty: Mitch BAKER with 431 at nearly 36, including a memorable 181 against Campbelltown – sharing a 241-run second wicket stand with Mark MORLEY (92). This was definitely the highlight of our season - rolling the Ghosts for 99 with Joel SMITH taking 5 wickets.

Some good batting performances by Daniel SOLWAY saw him progress up the grades, finishing in Firsts. Daniel's approach to his batting is outstanding and the maturity and shot selection he displays is something other players should look to emulate in the coming seasons.

The bowling this season was fair - only three sides scored over 250 runs against us. Unfortunately the bowlers usually didn't have enough runs to defend. Joel SMITH toiled away, with 18 wickets @24 and Englishman Sam POWELL impressed early, taking 17 wickets @15. Spin twins Darryn BULL and Harry DEAN bowled in tandem throughout the season. Bully is a club legend and a pleasure to play with and all players look up to him. We were lucky to have him

for 10 matches where he took 21 wickets @15.67 including two five wicket hauls. Bully was a class above most 3rd grade batsman. Harry DEAN had figures that didn't reflect how he bowled – he often built up pressure for the bloke at the other end to cash in. Harry is a very talented cricketer learning its hardest art – leg spin bowling.

Our aim in lower grade cricket is progression of our younger players. Although winning matches is always the aim, giving young players the opportunity to progress is just as important. This season was an investment year, giving players exposure and the lessons learnt will hopefully go a long way to improving their cricket in future. It's been said that with the right attitude more can be learnt from losing than winning. It's a matter of our players now having that 'right' attitude.

I would like to thank all parents who helped out throughout the year, making sure we were looked after on and off the field. Tony SMITH and Mark CONDRON for scoring each week and Terry PADDISON for helping out at every opportunity whether it be organizing covers or line-marking. Noelene REECE and Mrs MORLEY for preparing the afternoon tea ready every week. I would like to thank Chairman of Selectors Dion BOURNE and roving selectors John BULL and Phil KELLY for all their assistance, guidance and direction. To the other captains, I think we worked well as a team and would like to thank everyone. Special mention to James

ALLSOPP for his input throughout the year – Prince's ideas on the direction of the club and his passion for the mighty 'Dogs is an inspiration.

To the cricket committee for giving me an opportunity to fulfill a childhood dream of captaining a Bulldogs cricket team, Thank you! It was an honour to lead such a fine group of people and represent such a proud club. To Eris DIGNAM thanks for all your help throughout the year with everything, you and Margaret do so much for the club and we would be lost without the two of you. Mick STEPHENSON 'Stench' thanks for our weekly chats after each match, you really do epitomise what it means to be a Bulldog and are a club treasure. To the training staff Crowie, Deano and Hally thanks for your efforts throughout the year at training. I look forward to exciting times ahead with the new indoor facility.

Following that remarkable innings 'BAKES' got a number of starts getting to 20 or 30 making it look easy before departing without capitalising, except in round 13 when he went on to 89 against Fairfield, earning him a promotion to 2nd Grade. 'BAKES' scores at a run a ball in most innings and is a very instinctive batsman, if it's there he hits it and it stay's hit. 'BAKES' was our highest run scorer with the best average – his dedication to training and commitment to the club are outstanding qualities and he was a great help. I look forward to Mitch cementing a spot in 2nd grade.

Mark MORLEY – Mark came to 3rds in round 3 on the back of a couple of good scores in 4ths and then scored 92 against Campbelltown sharing in the 241run 2nd wicket partnership with Mitch. Mark is a hard-hitting batsman with amazing ability. Mark scored 346 runs @26.6 and his innings of 64n.o off about 30 balls against Sydney Uni had to be seen to be believed. A great team player with a terrific attitude, Mark trains harder than anyone and shows promise with his swing bowling. Mark also puts a lot back into the club with his commitment to the Green Shield team. With an off-season in England, I look forward to seeing Mark succeed further in coming seasons.

Michael CHALLITA – Mick is a hard-hitting batsman with raw potential. Round 1 saw Mick score 52 against Randwick in what was a very mature display of batting whilst wickets were falling all around him. With 50s in round 8 and 10, Mick showed what he is capable of doing to opposition bowling. Mick's approach to his batting at the start of the season was very organised, his approach towards his batting at the end was not. Mick needs to go back to basics, show more patience at the crease and work hard when out of form. The best way of doing this is to spend time at the crease. Mick has the talent to play higher grades if he can show a better mental approach to the game. Make next season is a big one, Mick!

Daniel SOLWAY – Sols played 7 matches in 3rds. A player who possesses all the right qualities for a cricketer – a very organised player with fantastic shot selection, discipline and just a willingness to spend time at the crease. Sols is always 'hungry' for runs and strives to be the best he can be. He matured as a cricketer this year and was very rewarded by finishing in 1sts. His successful campaign for NSW under 17s in Tasmania saw him do himself and his club proud. Well done, mate, keep aiming higher and higher, all the best.

Sam REECE - Reecey started the season as a batsman, after giving up the gloves to concentrate on batting, although he struggled for runs early on. He returned to 4ths - averaging over forty - earning his return to 3rds in round 10 as our keeper/batsman. Reecey made a few starts and looked good at times



only to bow out just as his innings looked like getting started. Reecey has the ability to dominate attacks but, like so many of our batsmen, lacks patience at the crease and tends to chase after the wide ones - often ending in his demise. If Reecey can learn to let the ball go and not try and put bat on ball at every opportunity, he could progress rapidly as he is a very talented cricketer.

Harry DEAN - I can say that Harry is without doubt one of the most talented leg-spinners in his age group around Sydney. Harry can also hold a bat and could continue to develop into a genuine allrounder. A hard trainer who never misses a session he is a whole-hearted cricketer. This season saw Harry take 13 wickets at an average just under forty. Statistics however don't always paint an accurate picture. Throughout the year Harry bowled several spells where batsman couldn't hit him, often building pressure for the bowler up the other end to reap the rewards. His spell against Northern Districts summed this up - he bowled 23 overs at 1-46 including 11 maidens, assisting Bully up the other end to take 6 wickets. Harry's 44n.o. against NDs in round 2 was a most impressive innings and gave us a chance of victory. Keep working on your batting as you have the talent to succeed as a genuine all-rounder.

Sam POWELL - A great addition, Sam was the backbone of our bowling attack in the first half of the season taking two 4-wicket hauls against Randwick and Campbelltown. Sam also showed his class with the bat against Penrith with a fighting 71. These performances earned Sam a promotion to 2nd Grade. Sam saw out the latter part of the year in 4ths, dominating with bat and ball in an attempt to assist 4ths towards the finals. An excellent team man and spirited cricketer, Sam will play higher grade cricket if he trains more consistently.

Ashley PADDISON – Paddo has been in 3rds for a couple of seasons, and dropped himself down to bat in the middle. A talented cricket with bat and ball and exceptional in the field, this season was very disappointing for Paddo – averaging 11 from 11 innings. Labib MAHMUD – A gentleman, Bibby always had a smile on his face and was great to have around the team. He started strongly scoring 69 against Randy-Petes. He followed this up with a string of failures often playing loose shots at times where we really needed time spent at the crease. Be true to yourself mate and let the bat do the talking. His keeping was at times brilliant during the first half of the season. To progress Labib needs to score runs more consistently and show better application at the crease. Hope to see you back this coming season, raring to go!

Joel SMITH - Joel has a heart as big as Phar Lap! Joel shows outstanding qualities not only as a cricketer but as a person. No one gave more than Joel throughout the year – no matter what the situation. Joel bowled some fiery spells at times throughout the season with none better than his 5-27 against Campbelltown in round 3. Joel often took an early wicket getting the break through with his outswingers. When Joel can get the right shape on the ball he can really be a class above third grade. Joel's development with the bat was a highlight of the season holding the highest batting average up until round 13. Joel's innings of 24n.o. against Hawkesbury out of a total of 110 was outstanding and embarrassed our top order bats. A player who possesses true Bulldog qualities and a pleasure to play with.

Ethan LETEN – A young opening batsman with a ton of ability with the bat, ball or in the field. After starting the season with such promise, Ethan returned to 3rds in rounds 10, 11 and 12 where he showed promise making some starts. Peter YANNOPOULOUS - Young Peter is a batsman to look out for, showing everyone some very impressive stroke play in the final two rounds - scoring 38 and 40 respectively. During both these knocks he had wickets falling all around him yet he maintained his composure and executed his shots perfectly - including square drives and cover drives for six. A player to watch out for no doubt. Big year in 2012-13 mate. P.S. You have to talk more this coming year!


Luke Condron





Spotty, as he is affectionally known throughout the entire cricket community, commenced his love affair with grade cricket with Western Suburbs in 1972/73 and transferred to his beloved Bulldogs in 1977/78 where he has played ever since bar a couple of seasons in the 90s when he undertook some coaching responsibilities at Hawkesbury.

His many achievements on the field for the Bulldogs include:

- 9431 runs in all grades, the second highest in the club's history;
- 426 wickets in all grades from a mammoth 4256 overs.
- Has captained teams in all grades except 1st grade in over 65% of the matches in which he has played.
- Won the Bankstown Sports Player of the Year on two occasions.

Geoff has not just been a contributor on the field, always doing some heavy lifting to ensure the club is successful and an enjoyable place to be part of.

In 1979/80 and 1980/81 he managed the A.W.Green Shield team that included Stephen and Mark Waugh and David Freedman and who were probably the first of hundreds of club youngsters who have benefited from his mentoring and learnt to understand the difference between participation and performance based cricket.





Geoff has been the innovator of many activities within the club, undertaken many coaching roles, both official and unofficial, served on the committee and as chairman of selectors and was afforded the honour of being elected a life member in 2007 for his service to the club.

Spotty is also only one of three people who have played both first grade rugby league for Canterbury-Bankstown as well as first grade cricket for Bankstown. Our barnstorming front-rower shares this achievement with Dick McDermott and the famous Kangaroo fullback Les Johns.

Marty Klumpp's words in a previous annual report are fitting: "Geoff demands maximum effort and commitment from his players and they invariably respond to his style. Spotty also makes a big contribution both through his work on the committee and what he does for schools cricket in NSW. Well done Geoff, don't ever stop speaking your mind and keeping us all honest."

In an era when cricket at all levels suffers from the lack of mentors, we salute Geoff for his contribution to our club and game and hope he has many more seasons left in him.


